

PURSUANT to a Decree of the High Court of Chancery, made in two causes Liddell versus Carden, and Liddell versus Simpson, the creditors of Robert Holway Perks, late of Monkton Combe, in the county of Somerset, Bacon-Merchant (who died in or about the month of February 1831), are forthwith, by their Solicitors, to come in and prove their debts before George Boone Roupell, Esq. one of the Masters of the said Court, at his chambers, in Southampton-buildings, Chancery-lane, London, or in default thereof they will be excluded the benefit of the said Decree.
