*Hague, September 1.* The 25th past the Deputies of the States General had a long Conference with the Count d'Avaux the French Ambassador, concerning the Contributions in the Spanish Netherlands; and the next day the said Deputies were likewise in Conference from 3 till 6 in the Evening with the Sieur Camprich the Imperial Minister. Our Letters from *Hamburg* tell us, The Treaty of Marriage between the Electoral Prince of *Brandenburg* and the Princess of *Hanover* was concluded. And that the King of *Denmark* returned the 24th of the last Month to *Copenhagen*.

*Brussels, August 28.* The City of *Liege* is now reduced under the Obedience of the Elector of *Cologne* their Prince; the whole Army is lodged upon the Burghers, the three Burghermasters, the Sieurs *Plenevaux*, *Renardy*, and *Maers*, are Prisoners, and their Process is making; a Council of eight Persons is appointed to Govern the Affairs of that City; and the Elector of *Cologne* is expected there in few days. We have an account from *Louvain*, that the Deputies of the Council of *Brabant* and the *Fiscael* having finished the Process against the Authors of the late Tumults there, they proceeded yesterday to give Sentence against them; Eleven who fled, are Condemned to be Hanged wh never they are taken and of three that are Prisoners, one is Sentenced to be Beheaded, another to be Banished, and the third Whipt. Monsieur de *Chanay* came hither last night to adjust the payment of the Contributions that are due, or the giving Security for the doing it; and in the mean time the French Troops continue in the Spanish Territories. Our last Letters from *Hungary* told us, the Duke of *Lorraine* would not make an Assault upon *Buda* till the Army is reinforced. He being in much want of Foot; and on the other hand the Besieged having no prospect of Relief.

*Haverford-West, August 14.* On the 11th Instant his Grace the Duke of Beaufort came to this place, having been met at the Confiners of this County by the High Sheriff, our Militia Troop, and the most considerable Gentry of this County, and being by them Conducted hither was received by the Mayor and Corporation in their Formalities, and was Treated that night, and during his stay here by the Deputy-Lieutenants and Gentlemen of our County, the Militia Regiment was drawn up in a Body, which at his Grace's arrival gave him a Volley; the 12th his Grace went in a Yacht prepared for him with several Tenders, to view the Haven, and was Treated at Sea; The 13th his Grace was Nobly Entertained by Sir Erasmus Phillips at Dinner, and afterwards at a Collation by Mr. Wogan at Golliton, and returned hither at night.

*Cardmarthen, August 15.* Last night his Grace the Duke of Beaufort returned hither from *Pembrokeshire*, accompanied with a numerous Train of Gentry, and received by the Mayor and Aldermen in their Formalities, the Militia being drawn up on both sides the Street, being arrived, he was invited to the Publick Conduit which ran with Wine, where with great Acclamations his Grace with all the Company drank His Majesty's and his Royal Highness's Healths, and returned to the Lodgings prepared for him, where he was Nobly Entertained by the Town, as he had been by the Deputy Lieutenants and Gentlemen of the County at his being there before, as he went into *Pembrokeshire*; in his passage hence to *Swanwy*, he was very handsomely Entertained at Dinner by Sir Edward Marlell at *Mudde's Comb*.

*Swanwy, August 16.* Yesterday his Grace the Duke of Beaufort came hither, having been met by all the Gentry of our County, and the Militia Horse, who Conducted him hither, where he lodged last night, and Dined this day, and was very handsomely Entertained.

*Cowbridge in Glamorganshire, August 18.* On Saturday last the Duke of Beaufort came to Sir Edward Mabeilla at *Margam*, where he was very splendidly Entertained during his stay, and coming thence, this morning as he passed through our Town, was pleased to accept of a Collation prepared for him in our Town-Hall; from hence he went to *Cardiff*, and was there Treated in like manner, and the Mayor, Bayliffs, and Capital Burgesses did voluntarily deliver his Grace an Instrument under their Common Seal, whereby they did make a Surrender into His Majesty's hands

of their Charter, and did humbly pray his Grace to present the said Surrender to His Majesty; from thence he went to *Ruperra* to Sir Charles Kemeys, where great Preparations were made for his Reception.

*Monmouth, August 19.* This Evening his Grace the Duke of Beaufort came to this place, being met at the Confiners of our County, by the County Troop and a very numerous company of Gentry of this and several of the adjacent Counties; at his coming to *Troy*, near the Town, the whole Regiment of Foot was drawn into Lines as a Guard even to the Walls of the House, where all that accompanied his Grace were very Nobly Entertained by the Earl of Worcester; On the 20th after a very Magnificent Dinner at the same place, his Grace went to view the Militia and see them Exercise, which done, he was invited to accept of the Freedom of the place, and was with several others made Free; after that he was with all that accompanied him, Treated in the Town-Hall, and from thence conducted back through the Militia drawn up in Lines on both sides the Street to *Troy*, from whence his Grace intends the 21. for *Badminton*.

*Windsor, August 25.* His Majesty was pleased on Sunday last to declare in Council, that having given the Earl of Radnor, Lord President of the Council, (with whole Services He was very well satisfied) leave to retire, in consideration of his great Age, He had resolved to make the Earl of Rochester, Lord President; Mr. Secretary Godolphin, first Commissioner of the Treasury; and the Earl of Middletona Secretary of State; And accordingly the Earl of Rochester took his Place at the Board; and the Earl of Middleton was Sworn One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

*Windsor, August 26.* This day their Majesties and the whole Court removed from hence to *Winchester*.
