but were repulled with great loft; however, the hanc day in the Evening they made another, which was as unfuccessful to them as the former; for the Batallions of Seuches, Beck, and Neubourg coming to the timely affiftance, of those that guarded the Trenches, they beat back the Enemy with a great flaughter; in this occafion the Licutenant Colonel of Souches was killed with a Cannon Bullet, and we loll feveral o her Officers, and about forty Soldiers; That they earnefly expected the Bavarian Troops; that in the mean time for want of Foot, the Town was to far open on the fide of the Dasube, that the Belieged fupplyed themfelves with Water from thence; but that when the fuccors weic arrived, the Befiegers would likewife thut them up on that fide, and after that, according to the report of the Deferters, they would not be able to hold out above three or four days. The Letters add, that the Imperial Troops fuffer very much by certain malignant diffempers, which begin to raign in the Army. We have just now advice, that Colonel Heusler being fent out with 5000 Imperial Horfe towards Alba Regalis, other-Wife called Stoel Weiffenberg, had met, and defeated a body of Turks, which the Governor of that place feut to joyn the Seralquier Baffa.

Francfort, Septemb, 9. Our last Letters from Hungary informed us, that the Duke of Lorrain being taken ill with a Feaver, had been obliged to retire to a place near the Camp, called the Old Town, leaving the chief Command of the Army in his abfence to General Rabata; That they expected in few days the conjunction of the Bavarian Troops, and hoped after that, to be quickly mafters of That in the mean time the Belieged con-Buda: tinue to make very desperate Sallies, but that they had had no great fuccels in two they made on the 18th paft, having been repulsed both times with confiderable lofs. We have likewife advice, that the Seralquier Baffa hath endeavoured to force Count Lefty from his Bridge, which he had laid over the Drave near Tyrannovitz, but that he had been repulsed with the loss of 5 or 6 no Men. We are told from Ratubanne, that the Count de Creey hath received his most Christian Majestics Ratificar tion of the Truce with Spain.

Hamburg, September 9. A great Conference is going to be held between the Miniflers of the King of Denmark, the Elector of Brandenburg and the Princes of Lunenburg at Izebee; and the general Discourse is that they are to Treat of a defensive Alliance for the prefervation of the Circle of the Lower Sax-any. Our Letters from Poland tell us the Troops of Lithuania had joyned those of the Grown, making together an Army of 10000 men ; and that the King was marching at the head of them to-wards the Nieller, which he intended to pais, and to advance towards the Panube, which will doubt-lefs put the Turks juto a great confidentation, and make the Grand Signion hardly think himfelf fafe at Adrianople. And that the Gollacks were appointed to observe the Tartars and to hinder their
