 allembted, whete it wast thelvedthat the faid Treaty fhould be Ratified, which was atcordingly dome, and the Exprefs rene back with the Racifications The Çourit de Eogoiutuo. Son of the Duke de Medine Cell, is made General of the Gallies of Naples, and will part from Rence in few days for Barcelona, (where the Spanifh Gallies are expected from Gemoua) to take poffeflion of that Command. The Duke d'ofung is fetired to his houfe at Pesafieh, where he will fay till he'has leave to come to Codirt.
Turin, September Io The 26th paft Cbatles Berkeley Efq; Envoy Extraordinary from His Majefty of Great Britain, to Complement the Duke and Dutchers of Savoy upon their Marriage, was Conducted to his Audience with the ufal Ceremonies. On Monday laft the Duke of savoy went to fee fome of his Trioaps Exercife at Cbe*tifues. The Count de Seifonf is arrived here from France.
Francfort, September 151 On the third Inflant the Elector of Bavaria parted from Vienna, and the next day arrived at Presburg with his Infantry and frain of Artilfery, the sth, He parted again from thence, purpofing to $b \in$ the 7 th at $G r a n$, where he would difembark his Mer and Artillery, and bis Hotfe, who marched by Land and paffed by Vienna the 6th Inflant, fraving fopyted him; He woold march themina Body to Buda; fo that we reckon his Eleftoral Highnes joyitd the - Thperial Aroy the geth or roth Inftant. Qur taff Letters from the Camp told usj the dDuke of Lorrain continued indifpofed with a Peverk but thate they hoped the wotif wâs paft, dud thidt the Duke de Crob; and ethe Commiffary General Breizer, have both been forted By ficknes to leave the Army; That the Dutite of Larrain had reccived advice, thał the Seralfuier Baffa intended torepars the Bridge of Effecke with the Army he has with him, confifting of 30000 men, and to attempt the reliof of Buda; but that

General Leflie had aflared tis Hishnefs hed would very clofely obretve the Enemy, dnd if they youded towards Buda he u ould not fall to boin photritear. We have an account from Vientia thixy ie malf. Cannon and a great quancity of cimmanfion hare been lately fent from thence to ther Almpya and that they were io hourly expectatforit to fear from the Camp of foftre great action., which wavd be underaken upoit the coming' dp of the Bavarian Forces. Ratisbonne, September 14. Yeferday were axt changed here the Ratifications of the Truteqtori tween the Emperor and the Empire and the Moit Chriftian King. Laft Monday in the Evening paffed by here to Companies of Foot of the Troops of suabia, and the reft are expetted ferery hour, they are going for Hungary to joyn the Imperial Army, and will make together about 4000 Men'; We are told that the States of Frenconizare likewife fending thither two Regiments. Our Letters from Hungary tell us, that the Eleftor of Bavariu was expected at $G_{r a n}$ the $j$ th Inftant, -neag which place his whole Army was to Rendezvous, and from thence he twould march at the head of them to Buda, where, it's believed, he arrived the gth Infant. Our laft Letters from the Camp. laid, the Army fuffered very much by Sicknefs; and that the Eneliny had on the 23 . palt ruined the Works which the Befiegers had made for the cutting off the communication between the Town and the River, tise Chrifitians not being abte to maias tain them for want of foot; but withal they alfure us, that the Turks have loft a great many Men int their Sallies, and that in one they made the fecond Inftant 600 of them were killed and wounded, and that thingsare in that condition in the Town, that if cannot hold out inuch longer.
Cologne, Septerber 15. A Letter from the Imperial Army before Budz of the third Ins flant gives the forllowing Accouft. Gambarghe September 1 . The Princes of Liskenburg haves if's laid, appaipfed a general reviow of cheinTroops ed be bita the 18 ch Lytanf, and shere is a difcoerce that flue Repubick of Venice is treatiag with chuth for's oggo Mche aftom Drefi den they writs thise the Elector of saxopy has offered to allitt the Emperor with file Regiments, upon condition his Imperal Majefty maintainthem while they are in his Service, and when he has no farcher occafion fir them, that he redeliver them complear to his Electoral Highaels. Our Letters from Cracbow give an account, that, the Turks upon the advanceof the Pohblh Army, have abandoued the Forters of faflowic in Podolia; Thaf, the Froapis of tithuanjas which are alone 20000 Noft have toyned the forces of the Krown; And that the King of Polgnd hath ordered ceveral Bridges to be laid overtho Ayfifer.- The Marciage between the electorats Prinç ,f Brandengurg and the Prinwefof Henouer is concluded.

Bruffels, September 19. On Saturday Lalt a Party of French Horfe came inte the Neighborhood of th is Citye-ang carried away fhe Corn and all the Forage they goud find $x$. The States of this Province being thecr faffembled, immediately agreed to pay the Qopuributionsd. manded by the French, and fuar four, ofrtheir Members, two to Monlicur de Foyeufis Gamp at Boneffe, ard two to Monfieur de latrauffe at Pejafe, to plifer Security for the pay-ment-ot the fame. The States of Flanders have fikenife agreed to raice their Quota of the faid Contributions; and thofe of Eaynault, Namur, Gelderland and fimburg , are now alfembled for the fame purpofe, We are sold the French Troops are retifed out of the Country calleJ the Tree of Bruges, upon their haying fetled the payment of thest Contributions; And ue hope that in a day of two they will quit all the Spanilh Tecritories. The Letters from Vienna that fhould have come in this day are not yet arrived, fo that we bave no frelh News concerning the Siege of budz which we have reafon to believe will not laft much longer, our lafk advices from the Ymperial Camps telling us they doubted not to be Mafters of the place within few days after the Elector of Bavaria had joyned them with his Forces.

Hague, September 1g. The States of Holland and Weft Frizeland have refolved to Disband, the Recruitsthat were raifed in the Year 1682 , being 1446 Horfe and 9042 Foot, and that they thalid be paid to the 2oth of the next Month. On Eridaydaff the Treaty of Commerce between the Crown of Penmarke and this State, was Concluded and Signed by the Baron fuels, that King's. Ambaffador, and
the Depeties of the States General Authorized for that puretere. We have an account that the fix Dutch inerchant Ships that were lately iakeht and carried inco Cadiz by the Admiral Papacbin, being laden with Naval Syores for Thoulon, have been unladen, ard the Goods Confifcated, but the Ships relealed. 1 hey write from Liegg of the 15 th lasItant, that ont the list two Perions were Beheaded there, who had been the principal Promoters of the late Tumules and Difordersinthat City; That the two Butrghemmalters, Renardi aña Macors were kept clofe Prifoners, and have been feveral times examined; and that chey began to work for the rebuilding the Cittadel, which wils be made much larger than it was before. . Hoth States of Utreche have agreed to the Disbanding the Recruits abovementioneg.
