relate to the free ports respectively thetein mentioned, shall be, and the same are hereby, extended to the port of George Town, in Prince Edward's Island; and that, from and after the said eighth day of January one thousand eight hundred and thirtynine, all the privileges and advantages of the said Act conferred upon the free ports therein-mentioned, and all the provisions, penalties, and forfeitures in the said Act contained, subject to the limitations and restrictions therein provided, shall extend to the said port of George Town, as fully and effectually as if such port had been inserted and enumerated in the said table at the time of passing the said Act :
