A LETTER has been received at this Office, addressed by Captain Sandom, commanding Her Majesty's Naval Force on the lakes of Canada, to Vice-Admiral the Honourable Sir Charles Paget, and dated at Kingston, the 18th of November last, in which the Captain reports the proceedings of the vessels employed in concert with the Land Forces under Colonels Dundas and Young, in repelling the attack made upon the town of Prescott, and on the British territory in its vicinity; as detailed in the letters from the two Military Officers above-named, which appeared in the Gazette of the 8th instant.

Captain Sandom commends, in high terms, the gallantry, zeal, and activity of Lieutenant Fowell and Mr. David Elliot, Mate of Her Majesty's steam vessel Experiment, and of Lieutenant C. A. Parker, of the Royal Marines, commanding the detachment landed to co-operate with the Queen's troops; as well as the good conduct of the seamen and marines employed on the occasion.
