ORDERS for the Court's going into mourning, To-morrow, Thursday, the 31st instant, for Her late Royal Highness the Pfincess Mary of Orleans, Consort of the Duke Alexander of Wurtemberg, viz.

The Ladies to wear black silk, fringed or plain linen, white gloves, necklaces and car-rings, black or white shoes, fans and tippets.

The Gentlèmen to wear black, full trimmed, fringed or plain lineu, black swords and buckles. The Court to change the mourning on Thursday the 7th of February next, viz.

The Ladies to wear black silk or velvet, coloured ribbons, fans and tippets, or plain white, or white and gold, or white and silver stuffs, with black ribbons.

The Gentlemen to wear black coats, and black or plain white, or white and gold, or white and silver stuff waistcoats, full trimmed, coloured swords and buckles.

And on Thursday the 14th of Bebruary next, the Court to go out of mourning.

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
