

Exchequer Bill-Office, No. 2, Whitehall-Yard, May 20, 1839.

THE Exchequer Bills dated in the months of April, May, and June 1838, viz.

2 and 3 Wm. 4, cap. 125, for relief of West India Islands;

1 Victoria, cap. 51, for carrying on public works;

1 Victoria, cap. 26, £13,000,000, 1838;

with the interest due thereon, will be paid off on the 17th day of June 1839, when the interest will cease. Such bills will be received daily, from half past ten of the clock till two, until and including the 11th day of June, at this Office, where lists are to be obtained, containing instructions for arranging the bills. The bills to be classed in separate lists, according to the Acts under which they have been issued.

The bills issued for carrying on public works and fisheries, and for relief of West India Islands, will be paid off in money.
