

12th Instant, for very great Preparations are making here on this occasion.

*Cologne, October 20.* The Troops of the Elector of Cologne which are in Garrison here, have orders to march to *Keyserwert, Rhinberg, and Liege.* And the *Sieur de Ratkirchen*, who commanded these Troops, is made Governor of *Bonne.* From *Vienna* they write, that the Envoy from the Dukes of *Lunenbourg* had had several Conferences with some of the Ministers of that Court upon the Proposals he had made in the name of those Princes of assisting the Emperor with 12000 Men against the Turks. We are with great impatience expecting the arrival of the Letters from *Vienna*. The last told us, that according to their freshest advices from the Camp before *Buda*, the Bavarian Troops were lodged upon the breach in the Wall of the Castle, and that a great Assault was to be made on the 12th Instant: That the Besieged were in great distress, and without any hopes of relief, the *Seraskier Bassa* having repassed the Bridge of *Esecke.*

*Hamburg, October 16.* There is a discourse of a new Conference to be held between the Ministers of *Denmarke, Brandenburg, and Lunenburg;* but neither the time or place is said to be agreed on. The Duke of *Zell* is sending the Baron *de Schurz*, Adjutant-General of his Forces, to *Vienna*, to treat with the Ministers of that Court about the Body of Men which he Offers to assist the Emperor with against the Turks. The Nobility of *Lunenbourg* are making very rich Equipages to attend the Princess of *Hanover*, who is married to the Electoral Prince of *Brandenburg, to Berlin.*

*Portsmouth, October 19.* Yesterday sailed out of this Harbour His Majesty's Ship the *Phoenix*, and is now at Anchor at *Spithead.*

*Bury St Edmunds, October 20.* His Majesty having been pleased among other His Royal Favours to this Corporation, to appoint, by His Gracious New Charter, his Grace the Duke of *Grafton* to be our Recorder; And his Grace coming hither this day to be Sworn accordingly, the Principal Inhabitants, with a great number of the Gentry of this County, met his Grace several miles from hence, and the Mayor, Aldermen, and Officers of the Corporation in their Formalities received his Grace at the Gate of the Town, and conducted him, amidst the repeated Acclamations of the People who filled the Streets, to the *Guild-hall*, where his Grace having taken the usual Oath, was entertained at a very Splendid Dinner, and was afterwards invited by the Mayor to a Noble Banquet at his own House; The whole Corporation on this occasion striving to express the Honour and Respect they have for his Grace; who was pleased to declare the great satisfaction he had in his reception and Noble Entertainment.
