**T**HIS day His Royal Highness Francis Albert Augustus Charles Emanuel Duke of Saxe, Prince of Saxe Cobourg and Gotha, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, was, by command of Her Majesty, introduced into the Privy Council by the Right Honourable Lord John Russell, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State (in the absence of the Lord President of the Council); and His Royal Highness took His place at the Board, on Her Majesty's right hand.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS by an Act of Parliament, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to reunite the provinces of Upper and Lower Canada, and for the Government of Canada," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, to declare, or to

authorize the Governor-General of the said two provinces of Upper and Lower Canada to declare by Proclamation, that the said provinces, upon, from, and after a certain day in such Proclamation to be appointed, which day shall be within fifteen calendar months next after the passing of the said Act, shall form and be one province, under the name of the Province of Canada; and thenceforth the said provinces shall constitute and be one province, under the name aforesaid, upon, from, and after the day so appointed as aforesaid:

And whereas, with the advice of Her Privy Council, Her Majesty is pleased to grant to the said Governor-General the authority in the said Act mentioned; Her Majesty doth hereby, with the advice of Her Privy Council, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers in Her Majesty vested by the said recited Act, authorize the Governor-General of the said two provinces of Upper and Lower Canada to declare by Proclamation, that the said provinces upon, from, and after a certain day in such Proclamation to be appointed, which day shall be within fifteen calendar months next after the passing of the said Act, shall form and be one province, under the name of the Province of Canada:

And the Right Honourable Lord John Russell, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**W**HEREAS by a certain Act of Parliament, made in the session of Parliament holden in the third and fourth years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act to regulate the trade of the British possessions abroad," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, by any Order or Orders in Council, to be issued from time to time, to give such directions and make such regulations touching the trade and commerce of, to, and from any British possession on or near the Continent of Europe, or within the Mediterranean Sea, or in Africa, or within the limits of the East India Company's charter, excepting the possessions of the said Company, as to Her Majesty in Council shall appear most expedient and salutary :

And whereas by an Order in Council of the twenty-second day of February one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two, made in pursuance of an Act, passed in the sixth year of the reign of King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to regulate the trade of the British possessions abroad," certain duties of Customs are imposed upon goods imported into the colony of the Cape of Good Hope, and it is expedient to repeal the said duties, and to impose other duties of Customs in lieu thereof, Her Majesty doth, therefore, with the advice of Her Privy Council, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers so vested in Her as aforesaid by the said recited Act of Parliament, order, and it is hereby ordered, that, upon goods, wares, and merchandize imported into the Cape of Good Hope, the duties imposed by the said Order in Council shall cease and be no longer payable ; and that, in lieu of the same, there shall be levied the several duties set forth in the table hereinafter contained, that is to say,
