Buckingham-Palace, November 19, 1840.

THIS day had audience of Her Majesty, Prince Esterhazy, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary from the Emperor of Austria, upon his return from leave of absence, and to deliver letters from his Sovereign :
