A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

HEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday the tenth day of this instant December; We, with the advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall be further prorogued, on the said tenth day of this instant December, to Tuesday the twenty-sixth day of January next; and We have given order to Our Chancellor of that part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly; and We do hereby further, with the advice aforesaid, declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, that the said Parliament shall, on the said Tuesday the twenty-sixth day of January next, assemble and be holden for the dispatch of divers urgent and important affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said Tuesday the twenty-sixth day of January next.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham-Palace, this eighth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty, and in the fourth year of Our reign.
