

provisions of the 16th section of an Act, passed in the 59th year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," and that such district should be named "The Trinity District," with boundaries as follows:

"To commence at the bridge over the River Parrott, and proceed, in a westwardly direction, along the centre of Fore-street as far as St. Mary-street; then, south and west, along the centre of that street, including the east and south sides thereof, and passing through the Pig-cross as far as the West-street; then along the centre of West-street and the road to Spaxton, including the south sides thereof, as far as the road leading to Goathurst; then, south, along the centre of that road to the point where the parish of Bridgewater joins the parish of Durleigh; then, in a south eastwardly direction, along the boundary line which divides the parish of Bridgewater from the parish of Durleigh, to where those parishes join the parish of North Petherton; then, in a north eastwardly direction, along the boundary line which divides the said parishes of Bridgewater and North Petherton as far as the River Parrott; then, north, along the centre of that river to the bridge, where the boundary commenced, as the same is more particularly delineated on the plan hereunto annexed, and therein coloured pink:

"That marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said chapel, and that the fees arising therefrom should, from and after the first avoidance of the said parish church of Bridgewater, belong to, and be received by, the Minister of the said chapel:

"That the consent of the Lord Bishop of Bath and Wells has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act passed in the 59th year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third; and in testimony of which the said Lord Bishop has signed and sealed this present instrument:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, beg leave to lay before your Majesty the before-mentioned circumstances, and humbly to pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto, as to your Majesty's royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made and effected, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.
