The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An "Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of "Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to explain and amend two "several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England;" duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the thirteenth day of July one thousand eight liundred and forty-one, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for carrying into effect, with certain "modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Rewenues;" and of another Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the

"Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England;" have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for appropriating part of the revenues of the canonry in the collegiate church of Saint Peter, Westminster, to which the rectory of the parish of Saint Margaret, Westminster, is annexed, towards making better provision for the cure of souls in the said parish:

"Whereas, by the first recited Act, it was enacted, that the rectory of the parish of Saint Margaret, in the city of Westminster, should immediately become and be permanently annexed and united to the canonry in the said collegiate church of Saint Peter, Westminster, then held by Henry Hart Milman, Clerk, Master of Arts; and that when and so often, as according to the statutes or usages of the Chapter of the said collegiate church, any dividend or division should be made of any profits or emoluments, from whatsoever source accruing, or any stipend or other sum of money should become payable to the members of the said Chapter as such members, the share of such profits and emoluments which, according to such statutes or usages, should be found to belong to the said cannonry, or the incumbent thereof, and every such stipend or other sum of money so payable to such incumbent, instead of being paid to such incumbent, should, by the Treasurer, for the time being, of the said Chapter, be divided into twelve equal parts, and eight only of such parts should be paid to or for the use of the incumbent for the time being of the
