**T**HIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act for funding Exchequer Bills, and for making provision for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-one.

An Act for raising the sum of ten millions six hundred and twenty-six thousand three hundred and fifty pounds, by Exchequer Bills, for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-one, and for appropriating the supplies granted in this session of Parliament.

An Act to continue the Poor Law Commission until the thirty-first day of July one thousand eight hundred and forty-two.

An Act to provide for payment of the persons employed in taking account of the population in England.
