HE Queen has been pleased to order letters patent to be passed under the Great Seal, for creating His Royal Highness the Prince of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland (Duke of Saxony, Duke of Cornwall and Rothsay, Earl of Carrick, Baron of Renfrew, Lord of the Isles, and Great Steward of Scotland), Prince of Wales and Earl of Chester.

The Queen, taking into Her royal consideration that, upon the demise of George late Earl of Winchilsea and Nottingham, which took place in or about the month of August 1826, the dignities of Earl of Winchilsea and Nottingham devolved upon George-William now Earl of Winchilsea and Nottingham, as cousin and next heir male of the said George late Earl of Winchilsea and Nottingham, and that, according to the ordinary rules of honour, the younger brother and sisters of the said George-William now Earl of Winchilsea and Nottingham cannot enjoy that place and precedence which would have been due to them in case their late father, George Finch-Hatton, of Eastwell-park, in the county of Kent, Esq. deceased, had survived the said George late Earl of Winchilsea and Nottingham, and had thereby succeeded to the titles and dignities of Earl of Winchilsea and Nottingham, Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare, that the Reverend Daniel-Heneage Finch-Hatton, Clerk, Master of Arts, Rector of Great Weldon, in the county of Northampton; Louisa-Anne, widow and relict of the late Honourable Charles Hope, a General in the Army, deceased; and Emily-Mary, wise of the Reverend Alfred-Charles Lawrence, Leonard Lawrie Campbell, of Middleton lodge, in

Clerk, Rector of Sandhurst, in the said county of Kent, the younger brother and only surviving sisters of the said George-William now Earl of Wirchilsea and Nottingham, shall henceforth have, hold, use, and enjoy the same titles, place, pre-eminence, and precedence as if their late father, the said George Finch-Hatton, had survived the said George late Earl of Winchilsea and Nottingham, and had succeeded to the titles and dignities of Earl of Winchilsea and Nottingham:

And Her Majesty has been further pleased to command, that the said royal order and declaration be registered in Her College of Arms.

The Queen has been pleased to grant unto Sir Robert-Henry Sale, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath, Colonel in the Army, Lieutenant-Colonel of the 13th (the 1st Somersetshire) Regiment of Foot, and serving with the rank of Major-General in Affghanistan, Her royal licence and permission, that he may accept and wear the insignia, of the first class, of the Order of the Doorance empire, which His Majesty Shah Shooja-ool Moolk, King of Affghanistan, hath been pleased to confer upon him, in testimony of His Majesty's approbation of the services, from time to time, rendered by him during the campaign in Affghanistan; and that he may enjoy all the rights and privileges thereunto annexed:

If any Creditor intends to oppose a Prisoner's discharge, notice of such intention must be given, by entry thereof in the proper page and column of the book kept for that purpose at the Office of the Court, between the hours of Ten in the Forenoon and Four in the Afternoon, three clear days before the day of hearing above mentioned, exclusive of Sunday, and exclusive both of the day of entering such notice and of the said day of hearing; but in the case of a Prisoner, for the removal of whom for hearing in the country an order has been obtained, but not carried into effect by the Creditors, notice of opposition will be sufficient if given one clear day before the day of hearing.

- 2. The petition and schedule, and all books, papers, and writings filed therewith, will be produced by the proper Officer for inspection and examination, until the last day for entering opposition inclusive; and copies of the petition and schedule, or such part thereof as shall be required, will be provided by the proper Officer, according to the Act, 7 Geo. 4, c. 57, sec. 76, or 1 and 2 Vict. c. 110, sec. 105, as the case may be.
- 3. Notice to produce at the hearing any books or papers filed with the schedule, must be given to the Officer having the custody thereof, within the hours above mentioned, on any day previous to the day of hearing.
- 4. Opposition at the hearing can only be made by the Creditor in person, or by Counsel appearing for him.
