THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorised by vixtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to repeal the present, and impose and allow new, countervailing duties and drawbacks of Excise on mixtures and preparations made with spirits when removed from or into England, Scotland, or Ireland, respectively; and to suspend, for a limited time, so much of an Act of the present session as repeals the allowance on spirits made from malt only in Ireland.

An Act to alter and amend the law relating to ecclesiastical houses of residence.

An Act for consolidating the Queen's Bench, Fleet, and Marshalsea Prisons, and for regulating the Queen's Prison.

An Act for improving the Dublin police.
