A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

**W**HEREAS it has been represented unto Us that great quantities of the gold coin of this realm deficient in weight are now in circulation, contrary to the tenor of two Proclamations issued, one by His late Royal Highness George Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His late Majesty King George the Third, bearing date the first of July one thousand eight hundred and seventeen, and the other issued by His late Majesty King George the Fourth, bearing date the sixth of February one thousand eight hundred and twenty-one; and there being reason to believe that due attention is not paid to the weighing of the said gold coin, and the directions given in the Acts of Parliament now in force with respect to the cutting, breaking, or defacing such pieces thereof as are found to be of less weight than those declared by the last of the aforesaid Proclamations to be current, and to pass

and be received in payment; We do by this Our Royal Proclamation declare and command that from and after the date hereof every gold sovereign of less weight than five penny-weights two grains and a half, and every gold half sovereign of less weight than two penny-weights thirteen grains and one eighth, be not allowed to be current or pass in any payment whatsoever: and We do hereby strictly require and command all Our loving subjects, and particularly all the officers, collectors, and receivers of Our revenues, strictly to conform to the orders hereby given, and to the directions and regulations enacted and established in the several Acts of Parliament now in force with respect to the cutting, breaking, and defacing such pieces of the said gold coin as shall be found deficient in weight: and We do hereby further ordain, declare, and command, that the said gold sovereigns and half sovereigns of the weights last above described shall pass and be received as current and lawful money of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, every such sovereign as of the value of twenty shillings, and every such half sovereign as of the value of ten shillings, in all payments whatsoever.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham-Palace, this third day of June, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, and in the fifth year of Our reign.

WHEREAS Her Majesty doth deem it expedient to appoint the ports of Toronto, in the province of Canada, and also the port of Hamilton, in the said province, situate at or near the western extremity of Lake Ontario, to be free warehousing ports, for the purposes of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act to regulate the trade of the British possessions abroad:"

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities in Her Majesty by the said Act in that behalf vested, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that the ports of Toronto and Hamilton shall, from and after the first day of August 1842, be free warehousing ports for the purposes of the said Act:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS an Ordinance, passed by the Governor and Council of Ceylon, on the first day of September 1841, intituled "An Ordinance enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, for prohibiting the importation of rum and rum shrub, the produce of certain places," has this day been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, hath been pleased, to declare, and doth hereby declare, that the same is satisfactory proof, that rum and rum shrub, the produce of any foreign country, or of any British possession into which

foreign sugar or rum can be legally imported, has been prohibited to be imported into the island of Ceylon:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of Her Privy Council, and in pursuance of the power and authority in this behalf vested in Her by an Act of Parliament, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to reduce the duty on rum and rum shrub, the produce of, and imported from, certain British possessions in the East Indies into the United Kingdom," doth hereby order, and it is hereby ordered accordingly, that, from and after the date of this Order, so long as the prohibition established by the hereinbefore recited Ordinance shall continue in force, rum and rum shrub, the produce of the island of Ceylon shall, on importation into the United Kingdom, be admitted to entry at the duties by the said Act of Parliament imposed and set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed, instead of the duties to which rum and rum shrub, the produce of the said island of Ceylon, would now be liable on the importation thereof into the United Kingdom, subject nevertheless, to the provisions in the said Act contained with regard to the certificates and declaration thereby required:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Honourable Lord Stanley, one of Her Majesty's principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

#### SCHEDULE.

For every gallon of rum, of any strength, not exceeding the strength of proof by Sike's hydrometer, and so in proportion for any greater or less strength than the strength of proof, and for every greater or less quantity than a gallon, being the produce of the said island of Ceylon, not being sweetened or mixed with any article so that the degree of strength thereof cannot be exactly ascertained by such hydrometer, nine shillings and four pence.

For every gallon of rum shrub, however sweetened, the produce of, and imported from, the said island of Ceylon, and so in proportion for any greater or less quantity than a gallon, nine shillings and four pence.

WHEREAS under or by virtue of an Act of Parliament, passed in the sixth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to regulate the trade of the British possessions abroad," containing the like recitals and conferring the like powers as are hereinafter mentioned to be contained and conferred by the Act hereinafter recited, and under or by virtue of an Order in Council, bearing date the sixteenth day of December one thousand eight hundred and twenty-six, issued in pursuance of the first herebefore mentioned Act, His said late Majesty King George the Fourth, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, did declare and grant that it should be lawful for French ships to import into the island of the Mauritius from the dominions of His Most Christian Majesty, such goods being the produce of those dominions, as in the Order now in recital are referred to :

And whereas by a certain Act of Parliament, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act to regulate the trade of the British possessions abroad," after reciting, that "by the law of navigation, foreign ships are permitted to import into any of the British possessions abroad from the countries to which they belong, goods, the produce of those countries, and to export goods from such possessions to be carried to any foreign country whatever; and that it is expedient that such permission should be subject to certain conditions;" it is enacted, that the privileges thereby granted to foreign ships shall be limited to the ships of those countries which, having colonial possessions, shall grant the like privileges of trading with those possessions to British ships; unless His Majesty by His Order in Council shall in any case deem it expedient to grant the whole or any of such privileges to the ships of any foreign country, although the conditions aforesaid shall not, in all respects, be fulfilled by such foreign country :

"And whereas Her Majesty has deemed it expedient that ice, the produce or manufacture of the

island of Bourbon, should be added to the list of goods which may be lawfully imported into the Mauritius in French ships :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities in Her vested by the said lastly hereinbefore recited Act, doth hereby declare and grant, that it shall be lawful for French ships to import into the said island of Mauritius, from the said island of Bourbon, ice, being the produce or manufacture of the said island of Bourbon :

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Honourable Lord Stanley, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the seventh year of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for rendering more easy the taking the poll at county elections," it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time, on petition from the justices of any county, riding, parts, or division in England or Wales, in quarter sessions assembled, representing, that the number of polling places for such county, riding, parts, or division is insufficient, and praying, that the place or places mentioned in the said petition may be a polling place or polling places for the county, riding, parts, or division of the county within which such place or places is or are situate, to declare that any place or places mentioned in the said petition shall be a polling place or polling places for that county, riding, parts, or division; and that the justices of the peace for such county, riding, parts, or division, in quarter sessions or some special sessions assembled, as mentioned in the Act, passed in the third year

of the reign of His said late Majesty, intituled "An Act to settle and determine the divisions of counties, and the limits of cities and boroughs, in England and Wales, in so far as respects the election of Members to serve in Parliament," shall, conformably to the said last-mentioned Act, divide such county, riding, parts, or division into convenient polling districts, and assign one of such districts to each polling place :

And whereas the justices of the peace for the county of Cornwall, at a general quarter session of the peace holden at Bodmin, in and for the said county, on the fifth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, have presented their petition to Her Majesty, representing that the number of polling places for the eastern division of the said county is insufficient, and therefore praying that the borough of Lostwithiel, within the said division, may be appointed a polling place for the said division :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, having taken the said petition into consideration, doth, pursuant to the said Act of the seventh year of His late Majesty's reign, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, declare, order, and direct, that the said place mentioned in the said petition, namely, the borough of Lostwithiel, shall be a polling place for the eastern division of the said county of Cornwall; and further, that the justices of the peace for the said county of Cornwall, assembled at the general quarter sessions or some special sessions, as mentioned in the said Act of the third year of His late Majesty's reign, shall, conformably to the said last-mentioned Act, divide the said eastern division of the said county of Cornwall into convenient polling districts, and assign one of such districts to each polling place.
