That the Quarterly General Court appointed to be held at this House, on Wednesday the 22d instant, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon, is further made special, at the desire of nine Proprietors of East India Stock, agreeably to the following letter, viz.

“ To the Honourable Court of Directors of the East India Company, East India-House.

“ Honourable Sirs,

“ We, the undersigned, Proprietors of East India Stock, request that you will be pleased to call a Special Court of Proprietors, to consider the following motion, viz.

“ That, upon consideration of all the circumstances connected with British intervention in the affairs of Afghanistan, as they appear from the papers already laid before Parliament, it is the opinion of this Court, that the expence of that war ought not to be thrown on the people of India, but that it should be borne by the Exchequer of the United Kingdom.

THE Court of Directors of the East India Company do hereby give notice,

That a Proprietor of East India Stock has intimated his intention to submit, at the Quarterly General Court of the said Company, appointed to be held at their House, in Leadenhall-street, on Wednesday the 22d instant, the following motion, viz.

“ That there be laid before the Court of Proprietors an estimate of the expence incurred by the war in Afghanistan to the 31st of December 1841.

“ That there be laid before the Court of Proprietors a statement of the amount of any loan or loans raised in India; with the rates of interest at which such loan or loans may have been raised since the commencement of the Affghan war.

“ That the protest of Mr. Tucker, or of any other individual Director or Directors, against the Affghan war, be laid before the Court of Proprietors.

The said Court of Directors do also give notice that another Proprietor has intimated his intention to submit, at the said Quarterly General Court, a motion for the production of the following papers, viz.

“ Copy of the dispatch from the Court of Directors to the Supreme Government in India, ordering the issue of extra batta to the Madras troops, when beyond the frontier of that presidency, to be discontinued from a stated date, and of the orders issued in India thereon; also a copy of the representations made by the commanding officers of Sepoy corps at Hyderabad and Nagpore, and other places, to Sir P. Maitland, the Commander in Chief at Madras, of the injustice to the Sepoys if the extra batta were discontinued.

“ Also a copy of the dispatch from the Madras Government to the Supreme Government, forwarding these representations.

“ A copy of any dispatches from India reporting the proceedings which took place at Asseerghur and Maligaum, when the extra batta was withdrawn from the 52d Regiment of Madras Native Infantry.”
