A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

WHEREAS We have thought fit to order, that certain pieces of copper money should be coined, which should be called "half farthings," every such piece having for the obverse impression Our effigy, with the inscription, "Victoria D.G. Britanniar. Regina F.D.," and for the reverse the words "half farthing," with the date of the year, surmounted by the royal crown, and below the united emblem of the rose, thistle, and shamrock: and whereas pieces of the copper money of the description aforesaid have been coined at Our Mint, and will be coined there: We have therefore, with the advice of Our Privy Council, thought fit to issue this Proclamation; and We do hereby declare, ordain, and command, that all pieces of copper money, so coined and to be coined as aforesaid, shall be current and lawful money of the kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and shall pass and be received as current and lawful money of the said kingdom, every such half farthing piece as of the value of half a farthing; of like lawful money: provided that no person shall be obliged to take more of such pieces in any one payment than shall be of the value of six pence.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham-Palace, this thirteenth day of June, in the year of Our

Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, and in the fifth year of Our reign.

[The following Order in Council has been substituted for the Order published in the Gazette of the 7th instant.]

AT the Court at *Buckingham-Palace*, the 3d day of *June* 1842,

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS Her Majesty doth deem it expedient to appoint the ports of Toronto, in the province of Canada, and also the port of Hamilton, in the said province, situate at or near the western extremity of Lake Ontario, to be free warehousing ports for the purposes of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act to regulate the trade of the British possessions abroad:"

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities in Her Majesty by the said Act in that behalf vested, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that the ports of Toronto and Hamilton shall, from and after the first day of

August one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, be free warehousing ports for the purposes of the said Act:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Honourable Lord Stanley, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

An Act for granting to Her Majesty duties on profits arising from property, professions, trades, and offices, until the sixth day of April one thousand eight hundred and forty-five.

An Act for regulating the sales of waste land belonging to the Crown in the Australian colonies.

An Act for regulating legal proceedings by or against the Metropolitan Patent Wood Paving Company, and for granting certain powers thereto.

An Act for repairing, improving, and maintaining the road leading from Ferrybridge, through Wetherby, to Boroughbridge, in the county of York.

And three private Acts.

PROPERTY AND INCOME TAX.

*Stamps and Taxes, Somerset-house,
London, June 24, 1842.*

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the present session of Parliament, for granting duties on profits arising from property, professions, &c. it is enacted, "That every person (other than the Governor and Company of the Bank of England, the Directors of the East India Company, and the Commissioners for the Reduction of the National Debt) intrusted with the payment of annuities, or any dividends or shares of annuities, payable, out of the public revenue of any colony or settlement belonging to the Crown of the United Kingdom, to any persons, corporations, or companies in Great Britain, or acting therein as agent, or in any other character therein described, shall, without further notice or demand thereof, deliver, or cause to be delivered, into the Head Office for Stamps and Taxes, in England, an account, in writing, containing their names and residences, and a description of the annuities, dividends, and shares intrusted to them for payment, within one calendar month after the same shall have been required by public notice in the London Gazette," in order that an assessment may be made thereon at the rate prescribed by the said Act, Her Majesty's Commissioners of Stamps and Taxes do hereby give notice to all persons intrusted with the payment of any annuities, dividends or shares of annuities, as above stated, that the amounts of the said annuities, &c. required by the said Act are to be delivered, in writing, into the Office for Stamps and Taxes, at Somerset-house, in the county of Middlesex, addressed to the Secretary to the Commissioners of Stamps and Taxes, within the space of one calendar month from the date hereof; and that any person who shall neglect or refuse to deliver such amount is, by the said Act, made subject to the forfeiture of one hundred pounds, over and above the duty chargeable on such annuities, shares, or dividends.
