PROPERTY AND INCOME TAX.

WHEREAS, in pursuance of the powers vested in us by an Act, passed in the present session of Parliament, fifth and sixth Victoria, cap. 35, for granting to Her Majesty duties on profits arising from property, professions, trades, and offices;

We, two of the Commissioners of Stamps and Taxes, did by a notice, published in the London Gazette of the 24th of June last, convene and ap-

point a general meeting to be held at the Town-hall, Windsor, on the 7th ultimo, of the persons appointed Commissioners for putting in execution an Act, passed in the thirty-eighth year of the reign of King George the Third, intituled "An Act for granting an aid to His Majesty by a land tax, to be raised in Great Britain, for the service of the year one thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight," for the purpose of choosing fit and proper persons to act, as Commissioners for the general purposes of the said Act of fifth and sixth Victoria, cap. 35, for the borough of New Windsor;

And whereas the several Commissioners, except one, chosen at the meeting called by the said notice, have declined to act for the purpose of putting in execution the said last-mentioned Act for the borough aforesaid, and it is expedient, therefore, that another meeting should be held for the purpose of appointing other Commissioners;

Now we do hereby convene a meeting of the persons appointed to act as Commissioners in the execution of the said Act, passed in the thirty-eighth year of the reign of King George the Third, to be holden at the Town-hall, Windsor, on the 5th of the present month, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, for the purpose of choosing fit and proper persons to act as Commissioners for the general purposes of the said Act of the present session for the said borough of New Windsor.
