**MEMORANDUM.**

The commissions of Second Captain Townsend and Lieutenant Hawkins, Royal Artillery, are dated the 10th of August 1842, instead of 22d August, as stated in the Gazette of 23d ultimo.

*Minute of Agreement between the British and Portuguese Governments, for the Issue and Payment of the Titulos of the "Mixed British and Portuguese Commission."*

**PREAMBLE.**

THE labours of the Mixed British and Portuguese Commission having advanced sufficiently to enable the Commissioners to form an estimate of the probable amount which will be required for the payment of the whole of the "Titulos" to be issued in conformity with the awards of the Commission; and a large number of the awards having been prepared; the Undersigned, Her Britannick

Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and Her Most Faithful Majesty's Minister at this Court, have agreed to direct the Commissioners to issue "Titulos" to the claimants, in accordance with Article VI of the Minute of Instructions signed on the 13th of November 1840, and they have agreed upon the following Articles, containing regulations for the issue and payment of the above-mentioned "Titulos."

**ARTICLE I.**

The Undersigned having been informed, that according to an estimate made by the Commissioners, the sum of £162,500 is the probable amount which Her Most Faithful Majesty's Government will be called upon to provide for the payment of the "Titulos" to be issued by the "Mixed British and Portuguese Commission," and for the payment of the interest which will accrue thereon, until the amount specified in each "Titulo" shall be paid; it is hereby agreed, that Her Most Faithful Majesty's Minister at this Court shall deliver to Her Britannick Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, thirteen bills drawn by the Portuguese Minister of Finance upon the Portuguese Treasury, in favour of Her Britannick Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, for the sum of £12,500 sterling, each; and when those bills are delivered, the Commissioners will take the necessary steps for the delivery of the "Titulos" in the manner hereinafter stated.

**ARTICLE II.**

The first of the above-mentioned thirteen bills shall be made payable on the 1st day of October next, the second on the 1st of April, 1843, and the remaining eleven bills shall be made payable in succession, each bill being payable six months after the preceding one. The payment of an in-

stalment of the claims shall commence so soon as each of the said bills shall be paid, and a day will be fixed, after which the payment of each instalment will cease.

#### ARTICLE III.

The Commissioners shall deliver to each claimant in whose favour a final award shall have been issued, or to his representative or heir, a "Titulo," or "Titulos," for the amount so awarded, and the Commissioners shall take a receipt for the same in duplicate. And, notwithstanding the arrangement contemplated in the XXXIst Article of the "General Rules," signed on the 22d of June, 1841, the Commissioners are directed to make the said "Titulos" payable to the claimant or to "bearer," in order to obviate the necessity of investigating and demanding proofs of the validity of signatures, at each time when the documents are presented for payment.

#### ARTICLE IV.

The time at which each "Titulo" is to be paid shall be stated therein. And in conformity with the VIth Article of the "Minute of Instructions," and with the XXXIst Article of the "General Rules," each "Titulo" shall contain a statement of the interest which the total amount therein specified is to bear, until such amount shall be paid; and such interest shall be paid half-yearly, at each period fixed for the payment of instalments.

#### ARTICLE V.

All awards upon claims for "Prize Money," shall be provided for in distinct and separate "Titulos," the amount of which shall be paid in full, at the time fixed for the payment of the last instalment.

#### ARTICLE VI.

If any holder of a "Titulo" should neglect to present the same during the period announced for the payment of each instalment, the amount due thereon will not be paid until the period next ensuing; and the holder will not be entitled to receive interest upon such "Titulo" for the time thus intervening.

#### ARTICLE VII.

If, before the closing of the Commission, it should turn out that the sums awarded to the claimants should exceed the sum of £162,500, the Portuguese Government will, on receiving information to that effect, give another bill for the amount required, payable at the same date as the thirteenth of the bills mentioned in Article II. And if, on the other hand, the total sum awarded should prove to be less than the sum estimated, the British Government will cancel such thirteenth or final bill, on receiving from the Portuguese Government, in exchange for the bill so cancelled, another bill for the exact amount required, and made payable at the same time.

#### ARTICLE VIII.

At the conclusion of the payments, the "Titulos" shall be cancelled; and the "Titulos" so can-

celled shall be delivered to the Portuguese Government in acquittance of the claims of British subjects who served in the Portuguese army and navy during the late war for the liberation of Portugal; but the said acquittance shall not extend to claims on account of pensions, for the regular payment of which, suitable permanent provision shall be made by the Portuguese Government, so soon as the Commissioners shall make known to the Portuguese Government, the total amount of such pensions.

#### ARTICLE IX.

The Commissioners are hereby authorised to make, from time to time, such further rules and regulations as they may deem requisite, for the protection of the Portuguese Government from fraud, and for the guidance of the claimants; and they will take care to exact from the agents of absent parties, good and sufficient security for the due performance of the trusts undertaken by those agents.

THE Commissioners of the Mixed British and Portuguese Commission, in virtue of the authority vested in them by Article IX of the "Minute of Agreement for the issue and payment of Titulos," signed, on the 26th day of August 1842, by Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and Her Most Faithful Majesty's Minister Plenipotentiary at this Court, empowering the said Commissioners to form such further Rules and Regulations as they may deem requisite for the protection of the Portuguese Government from fraud, and for the guidance of the claimants: and further to exact from the agents of absent parties good and sufficient security for the due performance of the trusts undertaken by those agents,—hereby give notice, that the following Rules and Regulations, in reference to agents and claimants, will henceforth be acted upon:

1. No person shall be recognized, or permitted to act as an agent before the Commission, unless he shall have previously applied for and obtained a license from the Commissioners for that purpose.

Before this license is granted, each agent shall enter into a bond, with two sufficient securities, to be severally and jointly bound to Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, in the penalty of five hundred pounds, with the condition that such agent shall duly account to all persons for whom, or for whose use any Titulos or monies, on account of awards, shall come into his hands; which bond shall be in the form annexed.

2. If at any time after the grant of a license to an agent, any claimant shall satisfactorily prove

that any such licensed agent has abused the trust reposed in him by not duly accounting for Titulos or monies received by him on behalf of such claimant; and if it shall appear that any licensed agent has practised any fraud or imposition on any claimant or claimants, or upon the Commission, the Commissioners will, by writing under their hand to be delivered to such agent, or to be left at his last or most usual place of abode, or where his agency may be carried on, revoke the license granted.

3. If any claimant shall revoke the appointment of a licensed agent, who shall have given security to the Commission for the proper discharge of his trust, such claimant shall not be permitted to appoint another agent, but will be required to act for himself, unless, when the period arrives for issuing the Titulo or Titulos upon the award, it can be satisfactorily proved to the Commission that the claimant is wholly unable to attend in person, in consequence of great distance, or other adequate cause, on the validity and force of which the Commissioners reserve to themselves the power of deciding.

In the event of the Commissioners deeming it necessary to permit the appointment of a second agent, such appointment must be made by a formal and stamped power of attorney.

4. Any person not desiring to act as an agent to the claimants generally, but applying to act on behalf of a single claimant under a power of attorney, filled up according to Form No. 3, annexed to the General Rules, signed on the 22d of June 1841, shall not be permitted to act, unless it can be satisfactorily proved to the Commission that the claimant is wholly unable to attend in person.

If it shall be proved that the claimant is unable to attend in person, the Commissioners will require his agent to provide such securities as the Commissioners in each case may deem necessary, binding him duly to account without fraud or delay to the claimant, for whom or for whose use any Titulos or money paid thereon shall come into his hands.

Now the condition of this obligation is such that if the above bounden, do and shall duly account to all persons for whom or for whose use any Titulos or money in payment of Titulos for wages, pay, prize money, or other allowances of money shall have come to his hands for or on account or in respect of the services of British subjects in the Liberating Army or Navy, and pay over the said Titulos or money, or so much thereof as shall appear to be justly due and owing on every such account, without fraud or delay, then the above written obligation to be void, or else to be and remain in full force and virtue.
