WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the sixteenth day of August one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, in the words and figures following:

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act " to carry into effect, with certain modifications, " the fourth report of the Commissioners of " Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for vesting in us certain property of the archdeaconry of London, upon the endowment of the said archdeaconry.

" Whereas by an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of January one thousand eight hundred and forty-one, issued under the provisions of the said recited Act, it is provided, that the said archdeaconry of London shall, on the next vacancy thereof, be endowed in manner therein mentioned :

" And whereas by the said Act it is enacted, that, upon the endowment of any archdeaconry by either of the modes of endowment therein provided, and with the consent of the bishop of the diocese and of any archdeacon in possession at the time of passing of the said Act, all lands, tithes, and other hereditaments, except any right of patronage belonging to such archdeaconry at the time of such endowment, may be vested in us for the purposes of the said Act :

" And whereas the rectory and parsonage of Saint Leonard's, Shoreditch, in the county of Middlesex, is annexed and belongs to the said archdeaconry of London :

" We, therefore, recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Charles James Bishop of London, and of the Venerable Joseph Holden Pott, now, and at the time of passing the said Act, Archdeacon of London, and in possession of the said rectory and parsonage, testified by their having signed and sealed this scheme, that, upon the next vacancy of the said archdeaconry of London, the said rectory and parsonage of Saint Leonard's, Shoreditch, with all its rights, privileges, and appurtenances, except any right of patronage, shall be disannexed from the said archdeaconry, and be vested in us for the purposes of the said Act."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said recited Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of London.

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act " to carry into effect, with certain modifications, " the fourth report of the Commissioners of " Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues." and of an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to explain and amend two " several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical

“ Commissioners for England,” have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for making additional provision for the cure of souls, in certain parishes where such assistance is most required.

“ Whereas under the authority of the said recited Acts, we prepared and laid before your Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the nineteenth day of April last, in which we recommended and proposed, that certain grants should be made, in augmentation of the incomes of certain benefices and churches, in certain classes, and subject to certain limitations, therein mentioned, and the said scheme was ratified by an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the twenty-seventh day of the same month of April, which Order has been duly gazetted :

“ And whereas we have satisfied ourselves, after due inquiry, that the benefices and churches described in the schedule hereunto annexed marked A. fall within the first of such classes, as limited by the said Order, and are fit and proper to be forthwith augmented, by the respective annual amounts stated in the last column of the said schedule ; and previously to our laying before your Majesty in Council the said scheme, application had been made to us, on behalf of the thirteen of the said churches hereinafter particularly named, then coming within the same class, in all respects, except that the proceedings for legally assigning districts thereto were not fully completed, and such proceedings are now completed :

“ And whereas from the source set opposite to the name of each of the benefices and churches described in the schedule hereunto annexed marked B., in the sixth column of such schedule, there has either been paid to us on account of such benefice or church, or permanently secured to the incumbent thereof, the benefaction stated in the seventh column of the same schedule ; and we have satisfied ourselves that the said benefices and churches fall within the second of such classes, as limited by the said Order, and are fit and proper to be forthwith augmented, by the respective annual amounts stated in the last column of the same schedule :

“ And whereas the benefices and churches described in the schedule hereunto annexed marked C., are situate within the places set opposite to the names thereof respectively in the fifth column of the same schedule ; and certain tithes, now vested in us, or tithes, in lieu of which certain lands so vested were heretofore allotted, arise or have arisen in such places respectively ; and after due inquiry and consideration, we have satisfied ourselves, that the same benefices and churches fall within the third of such classes, and are fit and proper to be forthwith augmented, by the respective annual amounts stated in the last column of the same schedule :

“ We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the incumbent for the time being of each of the benefices and churches so described in the said three several schedules, the fixed annual sum set opposite to the name thereof in the last column of the said schedules respectively ; by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November, in each year ; and that the first such half-yearly payment shall be made on the first day of November next ; except in the cases of the churches of Adlington, St. Saviour Bamber Bridge, St. John Blackburn, Trinity over Darwen, St. James Lower Darwen, St. John Dewsbury Moor, St. Peter Earls Heaton, St. Paul Hanging Heaton, St. Paul Foleshill, Trinity Habergham Eaves, St. Mary Mellor, Holy Trinity Portsea, and Tonge, and that the incumbents of churches last-named shall on such last-mentioned day receive two such half-yearly payments ; and that whenever a vacancy, in any of the benefices or churches contained in the said schedules, shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the next half-yearly payment shall in every such case be duly apportioned, between the incumbent making the vacancy or his representatives, and the incumbent succeeding to the benefice or church so becoming vacant.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure for making better provision for the cure of souls, in conformity with the provisions of said recited Acts, or either of them.”

THE following is a copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, assigning a consolidated district to St. Mary's Chapel, at Birch, in the parish of Middleton, taken from contiguous parts of the parishes of Middleton and Bury, in the county of Lancaster, under the 6th section of the 59th Geo. 3., cap. 134 :

At the Court at Buckingham-Palace, the 11th of August 1842, present, the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His late Majesty King

George the Third, intituled "An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "that in every case in which the Commissioners appointed for carrying into execution the purposes of the said Act shall be of opinion that it will be expedient to divide any parish into two or more distinct and separate parishes, for all ecclesiastical purposes whatever, it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese in which such parish is locally situated, signified under his hand and seal, to apply to the patron or patrons of the church of such parish for his consent to make such division, and for such patron or patrons to signify his or their consent thereto under his hand and seal; and the said Commissioners shall, upon the consent of the said patron or patrons so signified, represent the whole matter to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which it is proposed, with such consent as aforesaid, to divide such parish, together with the relative and respective proportions of glebe land, tithes, moduses, or other endowments which will by such division arise and accrue, and remain and be, within each of such respective divisions, and also the relative proportions of the estimated amount of the value or produce of fees, oblations, offerings, or other ecclesiastical dues or profits which may arise and accrue within each of such respective divisions; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division; provided always, that no such division of any parish into distinct parishes shall completely take effect until after the death, resignation, or other avoidance of the existing incumbent of the parish to be divided;" and it is by the 21st section of the said Act further enacted "that in any case in which the said Commissioners shall be of opinion that it is not expedient to divide any populous parish, or extra parochial place, into such complete, separate, and distinct parishes as aforesaid, but that it is expedient to divide the same into such ecclesiastical districts as they, with the consent of the bishop, signified under his hand and seal, may deem necessary for the purpose of affording accommodation for the attending divine service, according to the rites of the United Church of England and Ireland, to persons residing therein, in the churches and parochial chapels already built, or in additional churches or chapels to be built therein, and as may appear to such Commissioners to be convenient for the enabling the spiritual person or persons who may serve such churches or chapels to perform all ecclesiastical duties within the districts attached to such respective churches and chapels, and for the due ecclesiastical superintendence of such district, and the preservation and improvement of the religious and moral habits of the persons residing therein, the said Commissioners shall represent such opinion to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which such districts are proposed to be described; and if, thereupon, His

Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division:"

And whereas by an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," reciting that a considerable population is frequently collected together at the extremities of, and locally situate in, parishes or extra-parochial places contiguous to each other, at a distance from the respective churches or chapels of such respective parishes or extra-parochial places, it is, amongst other things, enacted, that it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, with such consent as is required by the said recited Act in the case of district parishes, to unite and consolidate any such contiguous parts of such parishes and extra-parochial places into a separate and distinct district for all ecclesiastical purposes, and to cause such district to be named, ascertained, and marked out by described bounds, and such name, and the description of such bounds, when approved by His Majesty in Council, to be enrolled in the High Court of Chancery, and in the office of the Registry of the diocese to which such district shall belong, under the provisions of this Act; and to make grants or loans for or towards the building of, or to build any chapel or chapels, with or without cemeteries, in and for the use of the inhabitants of any such district, in such manner, and under such regulations as may, in the judgment of the Commissioners, appear from the circumstances to be most expedient, and to constitute any such district a consolidated chapelry; and every such chapelry shall be under the superintendance of such spiritual person as shall be appointed under the provisions of this Act to serve any such chapel, and such spiritual person shall have cure of souls in such district; and the right of presentation and appointment of such spiritual person shall thenceforth belong to such person or persons, and be exercised in such manner as may be agreed by the several patrons of the churches or chapels of such parishes and extra-parochial places respectively, with the approbation of the Commissioners; and banns of marriage may be published, and marriages, christenings, churchings, and burials may be solemnized and performed in any such chapel, immediately and at all times after the consecration thereof, and the pew rents in such chapel shall be fixed, and salaries to the minister and clerk assigned therefrom, in such manner as is directed in the said recited Act or in this Act, concerning pew rents and salaries in separate or distinct parishes; and all fees and offerings which may arise and accrue within such chapelry, according to such table of fees as the Commissioners shall make, with the approbation of the bishop, may be demanded, received, sued for, prosecuted, and recovered, by the spiritual person having cure of souls therein, and by the clerk and sexton of such chapelries, in like manner as if every such chapelry was a distinct parish; and it shall be lawful for the

the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;” and by another Act, made and passed in the first and second years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled “An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled ‘An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;’” and also by another Act, made and passed in the second and third years of His said late Majesty, intituled “An Act to render more effectual an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled ‘An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;’” further provisions are made for carrying such divisions into effect:

“Your Majesty’s Commissioners for building new churches, appointed by virtue of an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled “An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;” continued by an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled “An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;” and further continued by an Act, passed in the first year of your Majesty’s reign, intituled “An Act to prolong, for ten years, Her Majesty’s Commission for building new churches;” beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, when the last census was taken, the parish of Middleton, in the county of Lancaster and diocese of Chester, contained a population of fifteen thousand three hundred and eighty-five persons; and the adjoining parish of Bury, in the same county and diocese, contained a population of sixty thousand persons; that the parish church of Middleton affords accommodation to one thousand five hundred persons, and that of Bury to one thousand seven hundred and fifty persons; that your Majesty’s said Commissioners have caused a new chapel, called St. Mary’s, to be erected at Birch, in the extremity of, and situate in, the said parish of Middleton, where it adjoins to the said parish of Bury, and which affords accommodation for eight hundred and fifty-seven persons, including three hundred and forty-four free seats appropriated to the use of the poor; that the said chapel is distant about two miles from the parish church of Middleton, and about two miles from the two churches or chapels in Heywood, in the said parish of Bury, which are the places nearest to the said chapel appropriated to the celebration of divine service according to the rites of the Church of England; that the extremities of the

said parishes of Middleton and Bury, which lie contiguous to each other, at Birch, and are delineated in the accompanying plan, contain an estimated population of two thousand eight hundred and seventy persons :

“ Your Majesty’s said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances above mentioned, it appears to them to be expedient, that to unite and consolidate the said contiguous parts of the said parishes of Middleton and Bury into a separate and distinct district, to be assigned to the said chapel for all ecclesiastical purposes, and to constitute such district a consolidated chapelry, under the sixth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled “ An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes,” for the purpose of affording accommodation for attending divine service to the persons residing in the said district, and for enabling the spiritual person serving such chapel to perform all ecclesiastical duties within the said district attached to such chapel, and for the due ecclesiastical superintendence of such district, and the preservation and improvement of the moral habits of the persons residing therein ; and that such district should be named “ The Consolidated Chapelry District of St. Mary, Birch ;” and that the boundaries thereof should be as follow :

“ Your Majesty’s said Commissioners beg leave, therefore, to lay before your Majesty the above-stated circumstances, and humbly to pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereof as to your Majesty’s royal wisdom shall seem meet.”

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed consolidation and assignment be accordingly made and effected, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.
