We regard this eventful circumstance as tending powerfully to endear your Majesty's life to your devoted subjects, and to inspire them with still more earnest desires for your Majesty's safety, and with more ardent prayers for the protection of that life which is of so much importance to the

extended empire over which the Divine Providence has called your Majesty to preside.
