THE following is a copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, assigning chapelry districts to Trinity Church and Trefonen Chapel, in the parish of Oswestry, in the county of Salop, under the 16th section of the 59th Geo. 3., cap. 134:

At the Court at Windsor, the 27th of August 1842, present, the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for building; and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "that in every case in which the Commissioners appointed for carrying into execution the purposes of the said Act shall be of opinion that it will be expedient to divide any parish into two or more distinct and separate parishes, for all ecclesiastical purposes whatever, it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese in which such parish is locally situated, signified under his hand and seal, to apply to the patron or patrons of the church of such parish for his consent to make such division, and for such patron or patrons to signify his or their consent thereto under his hand and seal; and the said Commissioners shall, upon the consent of the said patron or patrons so signified, represent the whole matter to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which it is proposed, with such consent as aforesaid, to divide such parish, together with the relative and respective proportions of glebe land, tithes, moduses, or other endowments which will by such division arise and accrue, and remain and be, within each of such respective divisions, and also the relative proportions of the estimated amount of the value or produce of fees, oblations, offerings, or other ecclesiastical dues or profits which may arise and accrue within each of such respective divisions; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be

valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division; provided always, that no such division of any parish into distinct parishes shall completely take effect until after the death, resignation, or other avoidance of the existing incumbent of the parish to be divided;" and it is by the 21st section of the said Act further enacted, "that in any case in which the said Commissioners shall be of opinion that it is not expedient to divide any populous parish, or extra parochial place, into such complete, separate, and distinct parishes as aforesaid, but that it is expedient to divide the same into such ecclesiastical districts as they, with the consent of the bishop, signified under his hand and seal, may deem necessary for the purpose of affording accommodation for the attending divine service, according to the rites of the United Church of England and Ireland, to persons residing therein, in the churches and parochial chapels already built, or in additional churches or chapels to be built therein, and as may appear to such Commissioners to be convenient for the enabling the spiritual person or persons who may serve such churches or chapels to perform all ecclesiastical duties within the districts attached to such respective churches and chapels, and for the due ecclesiastical superintendence of such district, and the preservation and improvement of the religious and moral habits of the persons residing therein, the said Commissioners shall represent such opinion to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which such districts are proposed to be described; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division:"

And whereas by an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, in the same manner and with the like consents as are required in case of division into ecclesiastical districts under the said recited Act, or this Act, to assign a particular district to any chapel of ease or parochial chapel already existing, or to any chapel built, or which may hereafter be built or acquired under the powers of the said Act, or this Act; and such district shall be under the immediate care of the curate appointed to serve such chapel, but subject, nevertheless, to the superintendence and controul of the incumbent of the parish church; and all such curates shall be nominated by the incumbent of the parish to the bishop for his licence, except where the right of nomination shall already be legally vested in any other person or persons, and in every such case by the person or persons possessing such right of nomination, subject to all the laws in force relating to stipendiary curates, except as to the assigning of salaries to such curates; provided always, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop

of the diocese, to determine whether any and what part or proportion of the fees or dues for marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials shall be assigned to any such curate; and whether banns of marriage shall be published, and marriages or baptisms, churchings or burials, shall be solemnized or performed in any such chapel or not; and in any case in which marriages shall be allowed in any such chapel, the Commissioners shall cause the boundaries of the district assigned to such chapel to be enrolled in the High Court of Chancery, and in the office of the Registry of the diocese, any thing in the said recited Act to the contrary notwithstanding; and no such chapel shall become a benefice by reason of any augmentation of the maintenance of the curate, by any grant or bounty under the provision of any Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws for augmenting small livings, any thing in such Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, to the contrary notwithstanding:

And whereas by another Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and by another Act, made and passed in the first and second years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled 'An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes,'" and also by another Act, made and passed in the second and third years of His said late Majesty, intituled "An Act to render more effectual an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled 'An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes,'" further provisions are made for carrying such divisions into effect:

And whereas the said Commissioners have made a representation to Her Majesty in Council, bearing date the seventeenth day of August one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, in the words following, viz.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches, appointed by virtue of an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" continued by an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and further continued by an Act, passed in the first year of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to prolong, for ten years, Her Majesty's Commission for building new churches;" beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, when the last

census was taken, the parish of Oswestry, in the county of Salop and diocese of St. Asaph, contained a population of eight thousand eight hundred and forty-six persons; that, besides the parish church, which affords accommodation to nine hundred and fifty-six persons, there are two chapels in the said parish, called respectively Trinity Church and Trefonen Chapel, the latter built partly by a grant in aid from your Majesty's said Commissioners; that Trinity Church affords accommodation to six hundred and seventy persons, including four hundred free seats appropriated to the use of the poor; and that Trefonen Chapel affords accommodation to four hundred and twenty persons, and that all the seats are free; and that divine service is regularly performed in the said respective chapels:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending this parish, it appears to them to be expedient, that particular districts should be assigned to the said chapels under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and that such districts should be respectively named, "Trinity District," and "Trefonen District," with boundaries as follow:

"The district to be attached to Trinity Church commences at the bottom of Lower Brook-street, at the angle between the road leading to Salop and that leading to Trinity Church; from this point it follows the latter road as far as the Turnstile leading up to the English Walls, the houses on the right hand side only of this road being in the district; from the Turnstile it proceeds along the path leading up to the English Walls; then east under these walls to the Black-gate; then turning to the left it proceeds along Leg-street, embracing the houses on each side of this street from the termination of this street, where it joins the corner of Beatrice-street; it again turns to the left up to the Bailey Head, containing within it the houses only on the north side of that square; it proceeds along this side of the Bailey Head to the Stile at the north-east corner leading into the Castle field, from which point it follows the foot path leading to Old Oswestry, where it meets the boundary of the parish of Sebattyn; it then turns south-east along the boundary of this parish till it meets that of the parish of Wittington; it follows the boundary of this latter parish till it meets the Ellesmere Canal at the bridge leading to Redual, marked C on the map, where it is met by the boundary of the parish of West Felton; it then turns to the south along the boundary of West Felton till it meets the north-east corner of the township of Morton, at the point marked D; here it turns west, and skirting the north boundary of the township of Morton, meets that of the township of Sweeney, at the point marked E; it then runs north along the eastern boundary of this township till it meets the boundary

of the township of Weston Cotton, when it skirts the east side of this township till it meets the boundaries of the liberties of the town, at the point marked A in the map; it then turns to the north west along the boundary of the township of Weston Cotton till it comes to the Mile Oak turnpike gate, marked B in the map; from this point the boundary of the district is the hedge on the left hand of the turnpike road from the Mile Oak to Oswestry, till it again meets the angle between this road, at the bottom of Brook-street, and that leading from the same angle to Trinity Church, as the same is more particularly delineated in the plan hereunto annexed and thereon coloured pink:

"The district to be attached to Trefonen Chapel commences at the north east angle where the townships of Llanforda, Sweeney, and Trefarclawdd meet, at the point marked F; runs south westerly along the boundary line of the townships Trefarclawdd and Sweeney, till it meets the boundary of the townships of Traflach, at the point G; it then runs to the south east along the line bounding the townships of Traflach and Sweeney, till it meets the boundary of the parish of Llanyblodwell, at the point H; then leaving the boundary of the township of Sweeney it runs first south and then west along the boundary of the parish of Llanyblodwell, skirting the south boundaries of the townships of Traflach and Trefonen; it then turns north, and proceeds along the boundary that divides the townships of Trefonen and Trefarclawdd from the parish of Llansilin, until it meets the southern boundary of the township of Llanforda, at the point K; along which boundary it runs to the east till it again meets the angle where the townships of Llanforda, Sweeney, and Trefarclawdd meet, at the point F, as the same is more particularly delineated in the plan hereunto annexed and thereon coloured yellow:

"That baptisms, churchings, and burials should be performed in the said chapels; and that the fees arising therefrom should belong to the Ministers of the said chapels respectively:

"That the consent of the Lord Bishop of St. Asaph has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third; in testimony whereof the said Lord Bishop has signed and sealed this present instrument:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave to lay before your Majesty the before-mentioned circumstances, and humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof,

and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made and effected, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.
