

Austrian ports, it being understood, that these privileges are to extend to the vessels of Austria and their cargoes only so long as British vessels and their cargoes shall, upon their arrival at, and departure from, the port of Odessa, continue to be placed upon the same footing as the vessels of Austria and their cargoes, and so long as the cargoes, which may be legally imported into the Austrian dominions through the port of Odessa in British vessels, shall continue to be placed in the Austrian dominions upon the same footing as the like cargoes so imported in Austrian vessels :

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
