

forth in the schedule hereunder written, so that the said body corporate of the said borough shall thenceforth be trustees for executing by the council of such borough the several powers and provisions of the said Acts of Parliament; and that the members of such council shall have the same powers, and be subject to the same duties as if their names had been originally inserted in such Acts, or as if they had been elected under the provisions of such Acts, or any of them, as such Commissioners.—Dated this 9th day of December 1842.
