AT the Court at *Windsor*, the 10th day of *December* 1842,

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of November one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for carrying into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for the augmentation of the several archdeaconsries of Richmond, in the diocese of Ripon; of Nottingham, in the diocese of Lincoln; of

Sudbury, in the diocese of Ely; of Sarum, in the diocese of Salisbury; and of Salop, in the diocese of Lichfield.

"Whereas by an Order of His late Majesty in Council, bearing date the fifth day of October one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, and duly made under the authority of an Act, passed in the seventh year of the reign of His said Majesty, intituled "An Act for carrying into effect the reports of the Commissioners appointed to consider the state of the Established Church in England and Wales, with reference to ecclesiastical duties and revenues, so far as they relate to episcopal dioceses, revenues, and patronage," the said archdeaconsry of Richmond was founded in the diocese of Ripon, and the Venerable John Headlam, Master of Arts, the then Archdeacon of the archdeaconsry of Richmond, in the diocese of Chester, thereupon became and now is Archdeacon of the said archdeaconsry of Richmond, in the said diocese of Ripon, and the said archdeaconsry is insufficiently endowed:

"And whereas by two several Orders of your Majesty in Council, duly made under the authority of the last-recited Act, and bearing date, respectively, the twenty-first day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven, and the fourth day of June in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-one, the said archdeaconsry of Nottingham was transferred from

the diocese of York to the said diocese of Lincoln, and the duties of the Archdeacon thereof were considerably increased, and the Venerable George Wilkins, Doctor in Divinity, then was, and still is, the Archdeacon of the same archdeaconry :

“ And whereas by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled “ An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to “ the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England,” the said archdeaconry of Nottingham, the income whereof is now very small, is endowed by the annexation thereto of the rectory of Southwell, but such endowment is not to take effect until the next vacancy of the said rectory :

“ And whereas by an Order of His late Majesty in Council, duly made under the authority of the secondly-recited Act, and bearing date the nineteenth day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven, the said archdeaconry of Sudbury was transferred from the diocese of Norwich to the said diocese of Ely, and the boundaries of the same archdeaconry were so altered as to diminish the annual income of the Archdeacon thereof, and the Venerable George Glover, Master of Arts, then was, and still is, the Archdeacon of the same archdeaconry :

“ And whereas the average annual incomes of the said archdeaconries of Sarum and Salop are very small, and the present archdeacons thereof are not otherwise competently provided for, and the Venerable Francis Lear, Master of Arts, was, at the time of passing the said first recited Act, and still is, Archdeacon of the said archdeaconry of Sarum, and the Venerable Edward Bather, Master of Arts, then was, and still is, Archdeacon of the said archdeaconry of Salop :

“ And whereas it is by the said first recited Act enacted, that any archdeaconry may, subject to the consent of the bishop, be endowed, amongst other modes, out of the common fund in the same Act mentioned, but so as not to raise the average annual income of such archdeaconry to an amount exceeding two hundred pounds, provided that no archdeacon shall be entitled to hold any endowment or augmentation or other emolument, as such archdeacon, under the provisions of the same Act, unless he shall be resident for the space of eight

months in every year within the diocese in which his archdeaconry is situate, or as to any archdeacon then existing, within the diocese in which his archdeaconry was then situate :

“ We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Bishop of Lincoln, Joseph Bishop of Ely, Charles Thomas Bishop of Ripon, Edward Bishop of Salisbury, and James Bishop of Lichfield, respectively testified by their having signed and sealed this scheme, that the said archdeaconries of Richmond, Nottingham, Sudbury, Sarum, and Salop shall be severally endowed by augmentation out of the said common fund, and that, accordingly, there shall be paid by us, out of the same fund, to the said John Headlam, Archdeacon of Richmond; George Wilkins, Archdeacon of Nottingham; George Glover, Archdeacon of Sudbury; Francis Lear, Archdeacon of Sarum, and Edward Bather, Archdeacon of Salop, so long as they shall respectively continue to be such archdeacons, and shall duly reside within the dioceses in which their archdeaconries are respectively situate, or were respectively situate, before the passing of the same Act, and to their respective successors in the said archdeaconries, so long as they shall hold the same, and shall duly reside in the diocese in which their archdeaconries are respectively situate, but in the case of the said archdeaconry of Nottingham, not after the time when the said rectory of Southwell shall become annexed thereto, the several annual sums following, that is to say, to the Archdeacon of Richmond for the time being, the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; to the Archdeacon of Nottingham for the time being the sum of one hundred and sixty pounds; to the Archdeacons of Sudbury and Sarum for the time being, respectively, the sum of one hundred and forty pounds; and to the Archdeacon of Salop for the time being the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds, on the first day of January in every year; and every such whole yearly payment to each of such archdeacons shall be made only on production to us of a certificate, under the hand of the bishop, for the time being, of the diocese in which his archdeaconry is situate, that such archdeacon has duly resided as aforesaid during the preceding year; and the first of such payments shall be made on the first day of

January next ensuing, and whenever a vacancy in any of the said archdeaconries shall happen on any other day than the first day of January, the then next yearly payment shall be duly apportioned between, and paid to, the archdeacon making the vacancy, or his representatives, and the archdeacon succeeding to the same archdeaconry, and on the day of such annexation of the rectory of Southwell to the said archdeaconry of Nottingham, if happening on any other day than the first day of January, there shall be paid by us to the then archdeacon of Nottingham a due proportion only of the said annual payment of one hundred and sixty pounds.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure touching any of the matters to which this scheme relates, in conformity with the provisions of the said Acts, or either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the several dioceses of Lincoln, Ely, Ripon, Salisbury, and Lichfield.

THE following is a copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, assigning chapelry districts to Trinity Chapel, at Habbergham Eaves; Christ Church, at Chatburn; St. John's Chapel, at Holme, in Cliviger; St. James's Chapel, at Briercliffe; and St. John's Chapel, at Worsthorne, all in the parish of Whalley, in the county of Lancaster, under the 16th section of the 59th Geo. 3., cap. 134; and also assigning a consolidated district to St. John's Chapel, at Bacup, in the said parish,

taken from contiguous parts of that and the adjoining parish of Rochdale, in the said county, under the 6th sec. 59 Geo. 3., cap. 134 :

At the Court at Windsor, the 2d of November 1842, present, the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "that in every case in which the Commissioners appointed for carrying into execution the purposes of the said Act shall be of opinion that it will be expedient to divide any parish into two or more distinct and separate parishes, for all ecclesiastical purposes whatever, it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese in which such parish is locally situated, signified under his hand and seal, to apply to the patron or patrons of the church of such parish for his consent to make such division, and for such patron or patrons to signify his or their consent thereto under his hand and seal ; and the said Commissioners shall, upon the consent of the said patron or patrons so signified, represent the whole matter to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which it is proposed, with such consent as aforesaid, to divide such parish, together with the relative and respective proportions of glebe land, tithes, moduses, or other endowments which will by such division arise and accrue, and remain and be, within each of such respective divisions, and also the relative proportions of the estimated amount of the value or produce of fees, oblations, offerings, or other ecclesiastical dues or profits which may arise and accrue within each of such respective divisions ; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division ; provided always, that no such division of any parish into distinct parishes shall completely take effect until after the death, resignation, or other avoidance of the existing incumbent of the parish to be divided ;" and it is by the 21st section of the said Act further enacted, "that in any case in which the said Commissioners shall be of opinion that it is not expedient to divide any populous parish, or extra parochial place, into such complete, separate, and distinct parishes as aforesaid, but that it is expedient to divide the same into such ecclesiastical districts as they, with the consent of the bishop, signified under his hand and seal, may deem necessary for the purpose of affording accommodation for the attending divine service, according to the rites of the United Church of England and Ireland, to persons residing therein, in the churches and parochial chapels already built, or in additional churches or chapels to be built therein, and as may appear to such Commissioners to be convenient for the enabling the spiritual person or persons who may serve such churches or chapels to perform all ecclesiastical duties within

the districts attached to such respective churches and chapels, and for the due ecclesiastical superintendence of such district, and the preservation and improvement of the religious and moral habits of the persons residing therein, the said Commissioners shall represent such opinion to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which such districts are proposed to be described ; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division :"

And whereas by an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," after reciting that a considerable population is frequently collected together at the extremities of, and locally situate in, parishes or extra-parochial places contiguous to each other, at a distance from the respective churches or chapels of such respective parishes or extra-parochial places, it is, amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, with such consent as is required by the said recited Act in the case of district parishes, to unite and consolidate any such contiguous parts of such parishes and extra-parochial places into a separate and distinct district for all ecclesiastical purposes, and to cause such district to be named, ascertained, and marked out by described bounds, and such name, and the description of such bounds, when approved by His Majesty in Council, to be enrolled in the High Court of Chancery, and in the office of the Registry of the diocese to which such district shall belong, under the provisions of this Act ; and to make grants or loans for or towards the building of, or to build any chapel or chapels, with or without cemeteries, in and for the use of the inhabitants of any such district, in such manner, and under such regulations as may, in the judgment of the Commissioners, appear from the circumstances to be most expedient, and to constitute any such district a consolidated chapelry ; and every such chapelry shall be under the superintendance of such spiritual person as shall be appointed under the provisions of this Act to serve any such chapel, and such spiritual person shall have cure of souls in such district ; and the right of presentation and appointment of such spiritual person shall thenceforth belong to such person or persons, and be exercised in such manner as may be agreed by the several patrons of the churches or chapels of such parishes and extra-parochial places respectively, with the approbation of the Commissioners ; and banns of marriage may be published, and marriages, christenings, churchings, and burials may be solemnized and performed in any such chapel, immediately and at all times after the consecration thereof, and the pew rents in such chapel shall be fixed, and salaries to the minister and clerk assigned therefrom, in such manner as is directed in the said recited Act or in this Act, concerning pew rents and salaries in separate or dis-

tinct parishes; and all fees and offerings which may arise and accrue within such chapelry, according to such table of fees as the Commissioners shall make, with the approbation of the bishop, may be demanded, received, sued for, prosecuted, and recovered, by the spiritual person having cure of souls therein, and by the clerk and sexton of such chapelries, in like manner as if every such chapelry was a distinct parish; and it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, and they are hereby required in every such case, to ascertain and make compensation, in manner directed in like cases under the said recited Act, for any loss which may be sustained by the incumbent of any contiguous parish or extra-parochial place, which shall form part of any such district, by reason of any fees, oblations, and offerings, being transferred to the spiritual person serving any such chapel; and all such chapelries shall be deemed to be benefices, and be subject to the jurisdiction of the bishop and archdeacon within whose diocese and archdeaconry the altar of such chapel shall be locally situate, and to all the laws in force concerning presentation and appointment to benefices and churches, and lapse, and all other laws relating to the holding of benefices and churches; and it is thereby further enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, in the same manner and with the like consents as are required in case of division into ecclesiastical districts under the said recited Act, or this Act, to assign a particular district to any chapel of ease or parochial chapel already existing, or to any chapel built, or which may hereafter be built or acquired under the powers of the said Act, or this Act; and such district shall be under the immediate care of the curate appointed to serve such chapel, but subject, nevertheless, to the superintendence and controul of the incumbent of the parish church; and all such curates shall be nominated by the incumbent of the parish to the bishop for his licence, except where the right of nomination shall already be legally vested in any other person or persons, and in every such case by the person or persons possessing such right of nomination, subject to all the laws in force relating to stipendiary curates, except as to the assigning of salaries to such curates; provided always, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, to determine whether any and what part or proportion of the fees or dues for marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials shall be assigned to any such curate; and whether banns of marriage shall be published, and marriages or baptisms, churchings or burials, shall be solemnized or performed in any such chapel or not; and in any case in which marriages shall be allowed in any such chapel, the Commissioners shall cause the boundaries of the district assigned to such chapel to be enrolled in the High Court of Chancery, and in the office of the Registry of the diocese, any thing in the said recited Act to the contrary notwithstanding; and no such chapelry shall become a benefice by reason of any augmentation of the maintenance of the curate, by any grant or bounty under the provision of any Act or Acts of Par-

liament, or law or laws for augmenting small livings, any thing in such Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, to the contrary notwithstanding:—

And whereas by another Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled “An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;” and by another Act, made and passed in the first and second years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled “An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled ‘An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;’” and also by another Act, made and passed in the second and third years of His said late Majesty, intituled “An Act to render more effectual an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled ‘An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;’” further provisions are made for carrying such divisions into effect:

And whereas the said Commissioners have made a representation to Her Majesty in Council, bearing date the fourth day of August one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, in the words following, viz.

“Your Majesty’s Commissioners for building new churches, appointed by virtue of an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled “An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;” continued by an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled “An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;” and further continued by an Act, passed in the first year of your Majesty’s reign, intituled “An Act to prolong, for ten years, Her Majesty’s Commission for building new churches;” beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, when the last census was taken, the parish of Whalley, in the county of Lancaster and diocese of Chester, contained a population of one hundred and twelve thousand eight hundred and three persons:

“That besides the parish church, which affords accommodation to nine hundred and four persons, there are twenty-eight chapels in the said parish, six of which afford accommodation as follows, namely; the chapel, at Habergham Eaves (built by your Majesty’s said Commissioners), to one thousand and ninety persons, including six hundred and four free seats appropriated to the use of the poor; the chapel, at Chatburn, to three hundred and sixty-four persons, including one hundred and eighty-nine free seats appropriated to the use of the poor; the chapel, at Holme, in Cliviger, to four hundred persons, the seats in

which are all free; the chapel, at Briercliffe, to five hundred and thirty-six persons, including three hundred free seats appropriated to the use of the poor; the chapel, at Worsthorne, to six hundred persons, including three hundred and fifty free seats appropriated to the use of the poor; and the chapel, at Bacup, to nine hundred and fifty-six persons, in which last-mentioned chapel there are no free seats appropriated to the use of the poor :

“ Your Majesty’s said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending this parish, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to each of the said five first-mentioned chapels, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled “An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;” and that such districts should be named respectively, “The Chapelry District of the Holy Trinity, in Habergham Eaves;” “The Chapelry District of St. John, Holme;” “The Chapelry District of St. James, Briercliffe;” “The Chapelry District of Christ Church, Chatburn;” and “The Chapelry District of St. John, Worsthorne,” with boundaries as follow :

“The chapelry district of the Holy Trinity, Habergham Eaves, is bounded on the north by the extra-parochial township of Ightonhill-park ; on the north east by the township of Burnley ; on the east by the township of Cliviger ; on the south by the township of New Church ; on the south west and west by the township of Hapton ; and on the north west by the township of Padiham, as shewn on the map hereunto annexed, tinted red :

“The chapelry district of Saint John, Holme, is bounded on the north by the township of Worsthorne with Hurstwood ; on the east by an extremity of the parish of Halifax, in the county of York ; on the south east by the township of Todmorden, in the parish of Rochdale ; on the south and south west by the township of New Church ; on the west by the township of Habergham Eaves ; and on the north west by the township of Burnley, as shewn on the said map, tinted green :

“The chapelry district of Saint James, Briercliffe, comprises that part of the township of Briercliffe with Extwistle which is called Briercliffe, and a part of the northern extremity of the township of Burnley, and is bounded on the north and north west by the townships of Great Marsden and Little Marsden ; on the east by the southern part of the township of Trawden ; on the south by that part of the township of Briercliffe with Extwistle which is called Extwistle ; on the south west by the township of Burnley ; and on the west by a foot road leading from Reedly Hollows to Burnley-lane ; thence down Burnley-lane, and by an occupation road called Hall-lane, to its junction

with the boundary line of Briercliffe above Pheasant-ford, as shewn on the said map, tinted purple :

“The chapelry district of Christ Church, Chatburn, comprises the townships of Chatburn and Warstow, and is bounded on the north by the river Ribble, which bounds the counties of Lancaster and Yorkshire ; on the east by the townships of Downham and Barley Booth ; on the south by the township of Great Mearly ; and on the west by the township of Clitheroe, as shewn on the said map, tinted yellow :

“The chapelry district of Saint John, Worsthorne, is to consist of the township of Worsthorne with Hurstwood, and that part of the township of Briercliffe with Extwistle which is called Extwistle, and is bounded on the north and north west by the township of Briercliffe with Extwistle ; on the north east by the township of Trawdon ; on the east by an extremity of the parish of Halifax, in the county of York ; and on the south and south west by the townships of Cliviger and Burnley, as shewn on the said map, tinted blue :

“Your Majesty’s Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that the said chapel of St. John, at Bacup, is distant from New Church about three miles, and from the church of Whitworth, in Spotland, about four miles, which are the places nearest to the said chapel at Bacup, appropriated to the celebration of divine service according to the rites of the Church of England ; that the extremities of the said parish of Whalley, and of the parish of Rochdale, which lie contiguous to each other, at Bacup, are delineated in the accompanying map, and contain a population of six thousand four hundred and ten persons :

“That your Majesty’s Commissioners, having taken into consideration all the circumstances above-mentioned, it appears to them to be expedient to unite and consolidate the said contiguous parts of the said parishes of Whalley and Rochdale into a separate and distinct district, to be assigned to the said chapel at Bacup, called St. John’s, for all ecclesiastical purposes, under the sixth section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, for the purpose of affording accommodation for attending divine service to the persons residing in the said district, and for enabling the spiritual person serving such chapel to perform all ecclesiastical duties within the said district attached to such chapel, and for the due ecclesiastical superintendence of such district, and the preservation and improvement of the moral habits of the persons residing therein ; and that such district should be named “The Consolidated District Chapelry of St. John, Bacup ;” and that the boundaries thereof should be as follow :

“The consolidated district of Saint John, Bacup, is to consist of that part of the township of New Church which is called Bacup Booth, in the parish of Whalley, and that part of the township of Spotland which is called Higher Brandwood, being a tripart of the hamlet of Whitworth and

Brandwood, in the parish of Rochdale, and is bounded on the north by the township of Cliviger; on the west by the remaining part of the township of New Church, both in the parish of Whalley; on the south west and south east by the remaining part of the township of Spotland, in the parish of Rochdale; and on the north east by the township of Todmorden, in the parish of Rochdale, as shewn on the said map, tinted pink and brown:

“That marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said chapels at Habergham Eaves, at Briercliffe, at Chatburn, at Worsthorne, and Holme, in Cliviger; and that the fees arising therefrom should be received by and belong to the Ministers of the said chapels respectively:
