to Her Majesty's several Dock-yards, that there
will be no objection to receive tenders for the full
quantities required for any one or more of the
said Dock-yards; but no tender will be received
which does not contain a distinct offer for the full
quantities in each of the three classifications of
timber, thickstuff, plank, and treenails, speci-
fied in the printed form of tender for each of the
Dock-yards comprised in the party's tender. The
amount of security for the performance of a part
only of the contract will be in due proportion to
the amount of penalty fixed for the whole contract.
