**T**HE following is a copy of an Order of Her  
Majesty in Council, assigning a chapelry  
district to St. John's Chapel, at Shidfield, in  
the parish of Droxford, in the county of South-  
ampton, under the 16th section of the 59th Geo 3.,  
cap. 134 :

At the Court at Windsor, the 10th of  
December 1842, present, the Queen's Most  
Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fifty-  
eighth year of the reign of His late Majesty King  
George the Third, intituled "An Act for building,  
and promoting the building, of additional churches  
in populous parishes," it is, amongst other things,  
enacted, "that in every case in which the Com-  
missioners appointed for carrying into execution  
the purposes of the said Act shall be of opinion  
that it will be expedient to divide any parish into

two or more distinct and separate parishes, for all ecclesiastical purposes whatever, it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese in which such parish is locally situated, signified under his hand and seal, to apply to the patron or patrons of the church of such parish for his consent to make such division, and for such patron or patrons to signify his or their consent thereto under his hand and seal; and the said Commissioners shall, upon the consent of the said patron or patrons so signified, represent the whole matter to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which it is proposed, with such consent as aforesaid, to divide such parish, together with the relative and respective proportions of glebe land, tithes, moduses, or other endowments which will by such division arise and accrue, and remain and be, within each of such respective divisions, and also the relative proportions of the estimated amount of the value or produce of fees, oblations, offerings, or other ecclesiastical dues or profits which may arise and accrue within each of such respective divisions; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division; provided always, that no such division of any parish into distinct parishes shall completely take effect until after the death, resignation, or other avoidance of the existing incumbent of the parish to be divided;” and it is by the 21st section of the said Act further enacted, “that in any case in which the said Commissioners shall be of opinion that it is not expedient to divide any populous parish, or extra parochial place, into such complete, separate, and distinct parishes as aforesaid, but that it is expedient to divide the same into such ecclesiastical districts as they, with the consent of the bishop, signified under his hand and seal, may deem necessary for the purpose of affording accommodation for the attending divine service, according to the rites of the United Church of England and Ireland, to persons residing therein, in the churches and parochial chapels already built, or in additional churches or chapels to be built therein, and as may appear to such Commissioners to be convenient for the enabling the spiritual person or persons who may serve such churches or chapels to perform all ecclesiastical duties within the districts attached to such respective churches and chapels, and for the due ecclesiastical superintendence of such district, and the preservation and improvement of the religious and moral habits of the persons residing therein, the said Commissioners shall represent such opinion to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which such districts are proposed to be described; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division:”

And whereas by an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled “An Act to amend and render

more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes:” it is, amongst other things, enacted “that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, in the same manner and with the like consents as are required in case of division into ecclesiastical districts under the said recited Act, or this Act, to assign a particular district to any chapel of ease or parochial chapel already existing, or to any chapel built, or which may hereafter be built or acquired under the powers of the said Act, or this Act; and such district shall be under the immediate care of the curate appointed to serve such chapel, but subject, nevertheless, to the superintendence and controul of the incumbent of the parish church; and all such curates shall be nominated by the incumbent of the parish to the bishop for his licence, except where the right of nomination shall already be legally vested in any other person or persons, and in every such case by the person or persons possessing such right of nomination, subject to all the laws in force relating to stipendiary curates, except as to the assigning of salaries to such curates; provided always, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, to determine whether any and what part or proportion of the fees or dues for marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials shall be assigned to any such curate; and whether banns of marriage shall be published, and marriages or baptisms, churchings or burials, shall be solemnized or performed in any such chapel or not; and in any case in which marriages shall be allowed in any such chapel, the Commissioners shall cause the boundaries of the district assigned to such chapel to be enrolled in the High Court of Chancery, and in the office of the Registry of the diocese, any thing in the said recited Act to the contrary notwithstanding; and no such chapelry shall become a benefice by reason of any augmentation of the maintenance of the curate, by any grant or bounty under the provision of any Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, for augmenting small livings, any thing in such Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, to the contrary notwithstanding:”

And whereas by another Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled “An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;” and by another Act, made and passed in the first and second years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled “An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled ‘An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;’” and also by another Act, made and passed in the second and third years of His said late Majesty, intituled “An Act to render more effectual an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled ‘An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act,

passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" further provisions are made for carrying such divisions into effect:

And whereas the said Commissioners have made a representation to Her Majesty in Council, bearing date the twentieth day of October one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, in the words following, viz.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches, appointed by virtue of an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" continued by an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and further continued by an Act, passed in the first year of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to prolong, for ten years, Her Majesty's Commission for building new churches;" beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, when the census was taken in 1841, the parish of Droxford, in the county of Southampton and diocese of Winchester, contained a population of one thousand eight hundred and twenty-eight persons:

"That, besides the parish church, which affords accommodation to five hundred persons, there is one chapel, at Shidfield, in the said parish, called St. John's Chapel, which affords accommodation to three hundred and seven persons, including one hundred and seventy-three free seats appropriated to the use of the poor; that the said chapel has been consecrated and divine service is performed therein:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending this parish, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the said chapel, called St. John's Chapel, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and that such district should be named, "St. John's District, Shidfield," which should consist of the southernmost part of the said parish of Droxford, with boundaries as follow:

"It is bounded on or towards the east by the parishes of Wickham and Titchfield, on or towards the north by the Chase, and on or towards the west and south by the parish of Bishop's Waltham, as the same is more particularly delineated in the plan hereunto annexed, and therein coloured pink:

"That marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in

the said chapel; and that the fees arising therefrom should be received by and belong to the Minister of the said chapel:

"That the consent of the Lord Bishop of Winchester has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third; in testimony of which the said Lord Bishop has signed and sealed this present instrument:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, beg leave to lay before your Majesty the before-mentioned circumstances, and humbly pray your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made, and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.

"That, besides the parish church, which affords accommodation to eight hundred and sixty-five persons, there are six consecrated chapels in the said parish, videlicet; at Atworth, Holt, South Wraxall, Winsley, Limpley Stoke, and Leigh and Woolley; and that the chapel at Leigh and Woolley affords accommodation for seven hundred and seventy-eight persons, including five hundred and fifty-nine free seats appropriated to the use of the poor:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending this parish, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the said chapel, at Leigh and Woolley, called Christ Church, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and that such district should be named, "The Chapelry District of Christ Church, Bradford:"

"This district is to consist of the chief part of the tything of Leigh and Woolley, with portions of the tythings of Winsley, the borough of Bradford and Troll, and small portions of the tything of Holt; the boundary thereof to commence at the point on the turnpike road leading from Bradford to the city of Bath, where the parish of Bradford joins the parish of Monkton Farleigh, marked in the map of the said district with the letter A; and then proceed along the boundary line of the tything of Leigh and Woolley, which divides that tything from the said parish of Monkton Farleigh, and from the several chapelries of South Wraxhall and Holt, in the parish of Bradford, to the point where such boundary line reaches the turnpike road leading from Bradford to Melksham, through Holt, marked on the said map or plan with the

letter B; then proceed along the centre of the said turnpike road, towards the town of Bradford, to the entrance gate of Seven Field, the residence of the Reverend Henry Harvey, at the point where the fence, which separates a small close of land, in the occupation of Thomas Davies, as tenant to the assignees of Mr. John Jones, joins the said road, and marked on the said map or plan with the letter C; then along the said fence until it joins the fence which bounds the property of the said Henry Harvey from the lands of the Right Honourable Earl Manvers and Bartholomew Smith, Esquire, unto the point where such boundary fence joins the public road leading from the town of Bradford towards Woolley, and marked in the said map or plan with the letter D; then proceed along the centre of the public road towards the town of Bradford, to the passage or way leading to certain cottages, the property of Mary Mills and Thomas Mizen, marked on the said map or plan with the letter E; then proceed along the southern boundary of the lands, late the property of Mr. Jeremiah Batten, deceased, into a certain street, part of the town of Bradford, called White-hill, at the north end of a tenement belonging to John Carrier, and in the occupation of the same, and marked in the said map or plan with the letter F; thence across the said street, in a straight direction, westward, into part of the road leading from Bradford to Bath, which is called Mason's-lane, at the point where the boundary wall, which separates the gardens belonging to the dwelling-house of the late Mr. James Bridget from the back way or road leading to the Wesleyan chapel, joins the said road, called Mason's-lane, and marked on the said map or plan with the letter G; then to proceed in a northward direction up the centre of the said said road, called Mason's-lane, and at the back of some tenements at the top of the said lane, to the point where the footpath, opposite the western end of the new church, marked on the said map or plan with the letter H; thence along the direction of the said footpath, and in front of certain tenements some time since erected by John Saunders, Esquire, into a certain lane, called Budbury-lane, and marked on the said map or plan with the letter I; thence westward along the said lane to the point where the footpath from Conkwell to Bradford joins the said lane, and marked on the said map or plan with the letter K; and then along the said footpath to the point where the said footpath joins the lane leading from Ashley to Turley, and marked on the said map or plan with the letter L; then along the centre of the said lane, through Great and Little Ashley, to the point where the said lane joins the turnpike road from Bradford to Bath, and marked on the said map or plan with the letter M; and from thence along the centre of the said road to the point firstly hereinbefore mentioned, where the said parish of Bradford adjoins the parish of Monkton Farleigh aforesaid, marked on the said map or plan with the letter A; which said boundary lines, hereinbefore particularly detailed and set forth, are more particularly delineated in the map or plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured green:

"That marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said chapel, called Christ Church; and that the fees arising therefrom should belong and be paid to the Minister of the said chapel:

"That the consent of the Lord Bishop of Salisbury has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third; in testimony whereof the said Lord Bishop has signed and sealed this present instrument:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, beg leave to lay before your Majesty the before-mentioned circumstances, and humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made, and that the recommendation of the said Commissioners, in respect of the solemnization of marriages, churchings, baptisms, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.

#### NOTICE TO MARINERS.

*East India-House, London,  
February 15, 1843.*

NOTICE is hereby given, that a floating light is stationed in the Fair Channel into Bombay Harbour, about  $\frac{3}{4}$  of a mile to the S. W. by S. from the Fair Way Buoy, in about 9 fathoms at high water, and 7 fathoms at low spring tides, with the following bearings and distances:

Flag Staff on Malabar Point, N.  $5^{\circ} 46''$  E. distant 6. 90. nautic miles.

The Light-house on Colaba, N.  $21^{\circ} 34''$  E. distant 4. 58. nautic miles.

The Fair Way Buoy, N. E. by N. distant  $\frac{3}{4}$  of a mile.

The Floating Light at the Sunken Rock, N.  $38^{\circ} 50''$  E. distant 4. 68 miles.

Kennerly Island, S.  $14^{\circ} 15''$  E. distant 7. 43. miles.

The Point of the S. W. Prong, in 6 fathoms foul ground, bears north about 2 miles.

The Middle of Thull Shoal, E. S. E. 2 miles.

When approaching the harbour, if the floating light vessel is seen bearing upon any point from N. by E. round to the eastward as far as S. E. by S., a ship might steer directly for it, and when up with the light vessel should steer from her N. E. easterly, so as to pass about three quarters of a mile to the eastward of the other light vessel, which is moored about a quarter of a mile to the southward of the Sunken Rock. After rounding the Rock Light Vessel, you may steer more northerly, and if it be at night, should anchor about one mile to the N. E. by N. from it, where the water will be smooth. The south point of the Middle Ground Shoal bears N. N. E. distant two miles from the Rock Light Vessel.

Both light vessels are painted red, each carrying a ball on the light mast, and during day light they hoist a red flag when a sail is in sight.

The Outer Floating Light burns a blue light at the end of each hour during the night, and displays a torch at the half hours.

The flood tide comes in from S. W. and ebb from the N. E. It is high water at twelve hours on full and change of the moon.

#### TRINITY COLLEGE, DUBLIN.
