NOTICE is hereby given, that His Royal Highness Prince Albert will, by the desire of Her Majesty, hold a Levee, at St. James's-Palace, on behalf of Her Majesty, on Wednesday the 21st of June next, at two o'clock.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend the Levee at Saint James's-Palace, are requested to bring with them two cards, with their names thereon written, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance in the Presence-chamber, and the other to be delivered to the Lord in Waiting, who will announce the name.

Those Gentlemen who are to be presented are hereby informed, it is absolutely necessary that their names, with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to present them (not the Lord in Waiting), should be sent to the

Lord Chamberlain's-Office, before twelve o'clock, *on the day but one previous* to the Levee, in order that they may be submitted for approbation; it being Her Majesty's command, that no presentation shall hereafter be made at the Levee, but in conformity with the above regulations; and further, that no person shall be admitted, on any pretence whatever, who has not been so presented.

It is particularly requested, that Gentlemen, who are to be presented at the Levee, will have their names *distinctly* written upon the card to be delivered to the Lord in Waiting, in order that there may be no mistake in announcing them.

The state apartments will not be open for the reception of Company coming to Court, until half past one o'clock.

A PROCLAMATION,

In order to the Electing a Peer of Scotland.

VICTORIA, R.

**W**HEREAS James Lord Forbes was duly elected and returned to be one of the Sixteen Peers of Scotland to sit in the House of Peers in the present Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and is since deceased; in order to the electing another Peer of Scotland to sit in his room, We do, by the advice of Our Privy Council, issue forth this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to assemble and meet at Holyrood-House, at Edinburgh, on Wednesday the nineteenth day of July next ensuing, between the hours of twelve and two in the afternoon, to nominate and choose another Peer of Scotland to sit and vote in the House of Peers in this present Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, in the room of the said James Lord Forbes, deceased, by open election and plurality of voices of the Peers that shall be then present, and of the proxies of such as shall be absent (such proxies being Peers, and producing a mandate in writing, duly signed before witnesses, and both the constituent and proxy being qualified according to law): and the Lord Clerk Register, or such two of the Principal Clerks of the Session as shall be appointed by him to officiate in his name, are hereby respectively required to attend such meeting, and to administer the oaths required by law to be taken there by the said Peers, and to take their votes; and, immediately after such election made and duly examined, to certify the name of the Peer so elected, and to sign and attest the same in the presence of the said Peers the electors, and return such certificate into Our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain; and We strictly charge and command that this Our Royal Proclamation be duly published at the Market-Cross at Edinburgh, and in all the county towns of Scotland, twenty-five days at least before the time hereby appointed for the meeting of the said Peers to proceed on such election.

Given at our Court at Buckingham-Palace, this tenth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, and in the sixth year of Our reign.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the thirtieth day of May one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your present Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for empowering and enabling the Master, Fellows, and Scholars of St. Mary Magdalene College, in the University of Cambridge, to convey and assure the advowson of and perpetual right of presentation to the rectory of Elingham, in the county of Norfolk and diocese of Norwich, to the persons, and in the manner, hereinafter mentioned.

Whereas we did, in pursuance of the said recited Act, prepare and lay before your Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the eleventh day of February now last past, for severing the said rectory of Elingham from the mastership of the said college, and for authorizing the sale of the advowson of the said rectory; and by the same scheme we did, amongst other things, recommend and propose, with the consent of the Master and Fellows of the said college, and also with the consent of the Right Honourable Richard Griffin Lord Braybrooke (as Visitor of the said college), and of the Right Honourable and Reverend George Neville Grenville, the then and present Master of the said college, and, as such Master, the then and present Rector and Incumbent of the said rectory of Elingham, that the ad-

vowson of and perpetual right of presentation to the said rectory of Elingham should be severed and disannexed from the said mastership; and that the said advowson and right of presentation, together with all endowments, rights, privileges, and appurtenances thereunto belonging, might and should be sold and conveyed to such person or persons or body corporate, in such manner, and subject to such conditions, and for such price or sum of money as should be determined upon and approved by us, but not for a less price or sum of money than should be approved by the Visitor and Master of the said college for the time being; and, by our said scheme of the eleventh day of February last, we did further recommend and propose, that nothing therein contained should prevent us from recommending and proposing other measures relating to the matters to which the same scheme applied, in conformity with the provisions of the said Act :

And whereas at a Court, held at Buckingham-Palace on the twenty-fourth day of February now last past, your Majesty was graciously pleased to approve and ratify the said scheme by an Order in Council, which has been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act :

And whereas, in pursuance of the said scheme of the eleventh day of February last, and by virtue of your Majesty's said Order, we did cause certain particulars to be printed, offering the said advowson of and perpetual right of presentation to the said rectory of Elingham for sale, with a form of tender for the purchase thereof annexed :

And whereas the Reverend John Brewster Wilkinson, of Holbrook, in the county of Suffolk, Clerk, Thomas Clark Brettingham, of Brookdish-place, in the county of Norfolk, Esquire, and William Elliott Le Blanc, of New Bridge-street, Blackfriars, in the city of London, Gentleman, did, agreeably to the said printed particulars and form of tender, offer the sum of six thousand five hundred pounds for the purchase of the said advowson and perpetual right of presentation :

"And whereas the said price or sum of six thousand five hundred pounds having been approved by the said Richard Griffin Lord Braybrooke (the said present Visitor of the said college), and by the said George Neville Grenville (the said present Master of the

said college), testified by their having, respectively, signed and sealed this present scheme, we have approved the said offer of the said John Brewster Wilkinson, Thomas Clark Brettingham, and William Elliott Le Blanc, to become purchasers of the said advowson and perpetual right of presentation at or for that price or sum :

"And whereas doubts are now entertained whether, in consequence of the Act of Parliament, by virtue of which the said rectory of Elingham was annexed and united to the said mastership of the said college, having rendered it unnecessary for the Master, for the time being, of the said college to be presented to the said rectory, the advowson of and right of presentation to the said rectory is now legally vested in any person or body corporate; and it is therefore expedient, in order to carry the said scheme of the eleventh day of February last, and the said sale which has been made in pursuance thereof as aforesaid, into full and complete effect, that some person or body corporate should be duly authorized and empowered to convey and assure the said advowson of and perpetual right of presentation to the said rectory unto the said John Brewster Wilkinson, Thomas Clark Brettingham, and William Elliott Le Blanc :

We, therefore, further recommend and propose with the consent of the Master, Fellows, and Scholars of the said college (testified by their having sealed this scheme with their common seal), and also with the consent of the said Richard Griffin Lord Braybrooke, as Visitor of the said college, and of the said George Neville Grenville (testified by their having, respectively, signed and sealed this scheme), that the said Master, Fellows, and Scholars of the College of Saint Mary Magdalene, in the University of Cambridge, and their successors, shall be hereby authorized and empowered, with our consent (testified under our common seal), and upon the said purchase money or sum of six thousand five hundred pounds being paid to us by the said John Brewster Wilkinson, Thomas Clark Brettingham, and William Elliott Le Blanc, to convey and assure (under the common seal of the said Master, Fellows, and Scholars) the said advowson of and perpetual right of presentation to the said rectory of Elingham, together with all endowments, rights, privileges, and appurtenances thereunto belonging, unto the said

John Brewster Wilkinson, Thomas Clark Brettingham, and William Elliott Le Blanc, their heirs and assigns, or to such uses as they shall direct :

" And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing other measures relating to the matters to which this scheme applies, in conformity with the provisions of the said Act."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the dioceses of Norwich and Ely respectively.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled " An Act to alter and amend the law relating to ecclesiastical houses of residence," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fourth day of April one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, in the words and figures following, viz. :

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled " An Act to alter and amend the law relating to ecclesiastical houses of residence," have pre-

pared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for improving the demesne lands belonging to the see of Hereford.

" Whereas it is by the first-recited Act enacted, that, by the authority therein provided, and for the purpose of fully carrying into effect any of the provisions of the same Act, or of another Act therein recited, any sum of money which shall have been invested in the public funds, or in other security or securities, in trust, for any ecclesiastical body corporate, aggregate, or sole, may, upon an application, in writing, to us, under the hand and seal of such body corporate, be directed to be sold, and the same shall be sold accordingly, and the produce of such sale shall be applied to such purpose and in such manner as shall appear most conducive to the permanent benefit of such body corporate :

" And whereas by the secondly-recited Act it is, amongst other things, enacted, that whenever it shall appear to be expedient to improve any episcopal house of residence, or the demesnes thereof, it shall be lawful, with the consent, under the hand and episcopal seal of the Bishop, to make such arrangements as may be deemed most expedient for improving any episcopal house of residence, or for improving the demesnes adjoining to any such house, by the purchase of any land, tenement, or hereditament in the immediate neighbourhood, or within the view thereof :

" And whereas it is by the same Act declared and enacted, that the provisions of the first-recited Act, relating to the sale and application of any sum of money invested, in trust, for any ecclesiastical body corporate, do and shall include and apply to all monies and securities for money, and to all stock in the Government funds or elsewhere, standing in the name of the Accountant-General of the Court of Chancery or in the name or names of any other public officer, or of any individual or individuals, for or to the credit, or for the benefit of or in trust for, any bishop, whether for the purpose of being laid out in land or otherwise, and that the same provisions do and shall extend and may be applied to any of the purposes of the Act now in recital :

" And whereas certain estates, belonging to or held under the see of Hereford, were sometime since sold and enfranchised under the provisions of certain Acts of Parliament relating to the redemption of the land tax, made and passed in the forty-second and fifty-fourth years respectively of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, and the monies arising from such sale and enfranchisement were invested in the purchase of twenty-three thousand three hundred and twelve pounds, seven shillings, and ten pence, Three Pounds per Centum Reduced Annuities, in the names of the Commissioners for the Reduction of the National Debt, to the account of the sale of the land tax, for the purpose of being applied to the redemption of the land tax charged on the estates and livings belonging to the said see of Hereford :

" And whereas several sums, amounting altogether to the sum of sixteen thousand two hundred and ninety-four pounds, one shilling, and four

pence, part of the said sum of twenty-three thousand three hundred and twelve pounds, seven shillings, and ten pence, have been, from time to time, applied in and for the redemption of such land tax, and such land tax has accordingly been redeemed; and there was lately standing in the books of the Governor and Company of the Bank of England, in the names of the said Commissioners for the Reduction of the National Debt, 'the account of the sale of the land tax,' the sum of seven thousand and eighteen pounds, six shillings, and six pence, like Annuities, in trust for the said see of Hereford, being the surplus remaining after such redemption, and the dividends thereof have been, from time to time, paid to the Bishop of Hereford for the time being :

And whereas by a certificate, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of January one thousand eight hundred and forty three, under the hands and seals of three of the Commissioners of your Majesty's Treasury, it was certified, in pursuance of the said Act of the fifty-fourth year of His Majesty King George the Third, that it had been satisfactorily made to appear to them the said Commissioners, that so much of the land tax charged on the estates of the see of Hereford, or on livings in the gift or patronage of the see, had been redeemed, as under the circumstances of the case they the said Commissioners thought reasonable :

" And whereas, in pursuance of the said several Acts of Parliament, passed in the forty-second and fifty-fourth years of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, and in pursuance of the said certificate, the said Commissioners for the Reduction of the National Debt have caused to be transferred to the Accountant-General of the Court of Chancery, with his privy, the sum of seven thousand and eighteen pounds, six shillings, and six pence, Three Pounds per Cent. Reduced Annuities, and the same is now standing in his name in the books of the Governor and Company of the Bank of England, 'the account of the Right Reverend Thomas Lord Bishop of Hereford :

" And whereas the lands, tenements, and hereditaments, particularly described in the schedule hereto annexed, are situate on the south bank of the river Wye, and within view of the episcopal house of residence belonging to the said see of Hereford, and it appears to us to be expedient, for the purpose of improving the said house and the demesnes adjoining thereto, which come down to the north bank of the said river, opposite the lands described in the said schedule, that the said lands, tenements, and hereditaments should be purchased and added to the demesne lands of the said episcopal house, so as to become the permanent property of the said see of Hereford :

" And whereas the said lands, tenements, and hereditaments were sometime since purchased by the Right Reverend Thomas Lord Bishop of Hereford, at and for the price and cost to the said Bishop of two thousand five hundred and ninety-seven pounds, seven shillings, and three pence, and the sum of one hundred and thirty-four pounds

and sixteen shillings hath since been expended by the said Bishop in levelling the same lands, and making good the banks of the river, whereby the value of the said lands have been improved to that amount; and application in writing has been lately made to us, under the hand and episcopal seal of the said Bishop, that the same lands, tenements, and hereditaments may be conveyed to the said see for the sum of two thousand seven hundred and thirty-two pounds, three shillings, and three pence, being the aggregate amount of the said several sums of two thousand five hundred and ninety-seven pounds, seven shillings, and three pence, and one hundred and thirty-four pounds and sixteen shillings, expended by the said Bishop as aforesaid; and that a competent part of the said last-mentioned Annuities may be directed to be sold, for the purpose of paying the said sum of two thousand seven hundred and thirty-two pounds, three shillings, and three pence, and the costs, charges, and expences of and attending the transfer of the said sum of seven thousand and eighteen pounds, six shillings, and six pence to the Accountant-General of the Court of Chancery, and of and attending the sale and purchase of the said lands, tenements, and hereditaments; and after due enquiry we have satisfied ourselves, that the said sum of two thousand seven hundred and thirty-two pounds, three shillings, and three pence is a fair and reasonable price for the said lands, tenements, and hereditaments, and we are of opinion that it would be most conducive to the permanent benefit of the said see so to apply the proceeds of such sale :

" And whereas we have duly investigated and do approve of the title to the said lands, tenements, and hereditaments :

" Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, that the said lands, tenements, and hereditaments, so described in the said schedule hereto annexed, may be purchased for or on account of the said see of Hereford, and be added to the demesne lands belonging to the said episcopal house of residence, at or for the sum of two thousand seven hundred and thirty-two pounds, three shillings, and three pence; and that the said purchase money, together with the costs, charges, and expences of and attending the said transfer of the said seven thousand and eighteen pounds, six shillings, and six pence to the Accountant-General of the Court of Chancery, and of and attending the sale and purchase of the said lands, tenements, and hereditaments, may be provided in the manner hereinafter stated :

" And we recommend and propose, that so much of the said sum of seven thousand and eighteen pounds, six shillings, and six pence, Three Pounds per Cent. Reduced Annuities, so standing in the name of the Accountant-General of the Court of Chancery in the books of the Governor and Company of the Bank of England, the account of the Bishop of Hereford, as will be sufficient to raise the said sum of two thousand seven hundred and thirty-two pounds, three shillings, and three pence, and such further sum of money as our Treasurer shall certify, in writing under his hand,

to be necessary for defraying the said costs, charges, and expences, may be sold by the said Accountant-General of the Court of Chancery, and that, out of the proceeds thereof, the sum of two thousand seven hundred and thirty-two pounds, three shillings, and three pence may be paid unto the said Thomas Bishop of Hereford, as and for the purchase money for the said lands, tenements, and hereditaments, upon his executing a proper conveyance thereof as hereinafter mentioned, and that the residue thereof may be paid into the hands of our Treasurer, to be by him applied in satisfaction of such costs, charges, and expences; and that the said Thomas Bishop of Hereford, his heirs or assigns, and all other proper and necessary parties, upon payment of the said sum of two thousand seven hundred and thirty-two pounds, three shillings, and three pence, as aforesaid, do and shall, by some proper and sufficient deed or assurance in the law, convey and assure the said lands, tenements, and hereditaments so and in such manner that the same may be effectually vested in him, the said Thomas Lord Bishop of Hereford, as such Bishop, and in his successors, Bishops of Hereford, for ever:

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the said see of Hereford, in conformity with the provisions of the said Acts.”

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled “ An Act to regulate the trade of the British possessions abroad,” it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, by any Order or Orders in Council, to be issued from time to time, to give such directions and make such regulations touching the trade and commerce to and from any British possessions in or near the Continent of Europe as to His Majesty in Council shall appear most expedient and salutary, any thing in the said Act to the contrary notwithstanding :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty doth, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and in pursuance and in exercise of the powers so vested in Her as aforesaid by the said Act of Parliament, order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the day of the date hereof, upon all manufactures of the island of Heligoland, made of materials of foreign origin or produce, or of materials liable to any duty of customs upon importation into the United Kingdom, which shall be entered for exportation from the said island, there shall be levied and paid to such officer as the Lieutenant-Governor of the said island shall appoint for that purpose, the following duty, that is to say, a duty equal to the difference between the duty to which such manufactures would be liable upon importation and entry for home consumption into the United Kingdom, if the produce of, and imported from, foreign countries, and the duty to which such manufactures would be liable upon importation and entry for home consumption into the United Kingdom, if the produce of, and imported from, a British possession; whereupon the exporter, upon making a declaration before the Lieutenant-Governor, or a magistrate of the island, that the goods, describing the same, are the manu-

facture of the said island, the Lieutenant-Governor or magistrate shall administer and sign such declaration; and, thereupon, the Lieutenant-Governor shall grant a certificate, under his hand, of the proof contained in such declaration, stating the ship in which the goods are exported, and such certificate shall be deemed to be the proper document to be produced at the port of importation, in proof that the goods are the manufacture of the said island:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Honourable Lord Stanley, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the third and fourth years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act to regulate the trade of the British possessions abroad," it was, amongst other things, enacted, that no goods should be imported into, nor should any goods, except the produce of the fisheries in British ships, be exported from, any of the British possessions in America by sea, from or to any place other than the United Kingdom, or some other of such possessions, excepting to or from the several ports in such possessions called free ports, enumerated or described in the table in the said Act contained; and it was thereby provided that, if His Majesty should deem it expedient to extend the provisions of the said Act to any port or ports not enumerated in the said table, it should be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, to extend the provisions of the said Act to such port or ports; and that, from and after the day mentioned in such Order in Council, all the privileges and advantages of the said Act, and all the provisions, penalties, and forfeitures therein contained, subject, nevertheless, to the limitations and restrictions thereafter provided, should extend, and be deemed and construed to extend, to any such port or ports, respectively, as fully as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in the said table at the time of passing the said Act:

And whereas Her Majesty doth deem it expedient to extend the before-mentioned provisions of the said Act, respecting such free ports, to the port of Dalhousie, on the river Restigouche, in the province of New Brunswick:

Now, therefore, under and by virtue of the said Act of Parliament, and in exercise of the powers thereby in Her Majesty in Council in that behalf

vested, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered accordingly, that, from and after the first day of August next, the provisions of the said Act, and of any Act or Acts amending the same, as far as such provisions relate to the free ports respectively mentioned in the said recited Act, shall be, and the same are hereby, extended to the port of Dalhousie, on the river Restigouche, in the province of New Brunswick; and that, from and after the said first day of August next, all the privileges and advantages by the said recited Act, and by any Act or Acts amending the same, conferred upon the free ports mentioned in the said recited Act, and all the provisions, penalties, and forfeitures in the said Acts contained, subject to the limitations and restrictions therein provided, shall extend to the said port of Dalhousie, as fully and effectually as if such port had been inserted and enumerated in the said table at the time of passing the said recited Act:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

THE following is a copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, assigning chapelry districts to the Chapels, Saint Peter, Saint Andrew, Saint Philip, and Saint James the Less, in the parish of Saint Matthew, Bethnal-green, in the county of Middlesex, under the 16th section of the 59th Geo. 3., cap. 134 :

At the Court at Buckingham-Palace, the 3d of April 1843, present, the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "that in every case in which the Commissioners appointed for carrying into execution the purposes of the said Act shall be of opinion that it will be expedient to divide any parish into two or more distinct and separate parishes, for all ecclesiastical purposes whatever, it shall be lawful



for the said Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese in which such parish is locally situated, signified under his hand and seal, to apply to the patron or patrons of the church of such parish for his consent to make such division, and for such patron or patrons to signify his or their consent thereto under his hand and seal; and the said Commissioners shall, upon the consent of the said patron or patrons so signified, represent the whole matter to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which it is proposed, with such consent as aforesaid, to divide such parish, together with the relative and respective proportions of glebe land, tithes, moduses, or other endowments which will by such division arise and accrue, and remain and be, within each of such respective divisions, and also the relative proportions of the estimated amount of the value or produce of fees, oblations, offerings, or other ecclesiastical dues or profits which may arise and accrue within each of such respective divisions; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division; provided always, that no such division of any parish into distinct parishes shall completely take effect until after the death, resignation, or other avoidance of the existing incumbent of the parish to be divided; and it is by the 21st section of the said Act further enacted, "that in any case in which the said Commissioners shall be of opinion that it is not expedient to divide any populous parish, or extra parochial place, into such complete, separate, and distinct parishes as aforesaid, but that it is expedient to divide the same into such ecclesiastical districts as they, with the consent of the bishop, signified under his hand and seal, may deem necessary for the purpose of affording accommodation for the attending divine service, according to the rites of the United Church of England and Ireland, to persons residing therein, in the churches and parochial chapels already built, or in additional churches or chapels to be built therein, and as may appear to such Commissioners to be convenient for the enabling the spiritual person or persons who may serve such churches or chapels to perform all ecclesiastical duties within the districts attached to such respective churches and chapels, and for the due ecclesiastical superintendence of such district, and the preservation and improvement of the religious and moral habits of the persons residing therein, the said Commissioners shall represent such opinion to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which such districts are proposed to be described; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division."

And whereas by an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the build-

ing, of additional churches in populous parishes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, in the same manner and with the like consents as are required in case of division into ecclesiastical districts under the said recited Act, or this Act, to assign a particular district to any chapel of ease or parochial chapel already existing, or to any chapel built, or which may hereafter be built or acquired under the powers of the said Act, or this Act; and such district shall be under the immediate care of the curate appointed to serve such chapel, but subject, nevertheless, to the superintendence and controul of the incumbent of the parish church; and all such curates shall be nominated by the incumbent of the parish to the bishop for his licence, except where the right of nomination shall already be legally vested in any other person or persons, and in every such case by the person or persons possessing such right of nomination, subject to all the laws in force relating to stipendiary curates; except as to the assigning of salaries to such curates; provided always, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, to determine whether any and what part or proportion of the fees or dues for marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials shall be assigned to any such curate; and whether banns of marriage shall be published, and marriages or baptisms, churchings or burials, shall be solemnized or performed in any such chapel or not; and in any case in which marriages shall be allowed in any such chapel, the Commissioners shall cause the boundaries of the district assigned to such chapel to be enrolled in the High Court of Chancery, and in the office of the Registry of the diocese, any thing in the said recited Act to the contrary notwithstanding; and no such chapelry shall become a benefice by reason of any augmentation of the maintenance of the curate, by any grant or bounty under the provision of any Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, for augmenting small livings, any thing in such Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, to the contrary notwithstanding."

And whereas by another Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and by another Act, made and passed in the first and second years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled 'An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;'" and also by another Act, made and passed in the second and third years of His said late Majesty, intituled "An Act to render more effectual an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled 'An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional

churches in populous parishes;" further provisions are made for carrying such divisions into effect:

And whereas the said Commissioners have made a representation to Her Majesty in Council, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of February one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, in the words following, viz.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches, appointed by virtue of an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" continued by an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and further continued by an Act, passed in the first year of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to prolong, for ten years, Her Majesty's Commission for building new churches;" beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, when the last census was taken, the parish of Saint Matthew, Bethnal-green, in the county of Middlesex, and diocese of London, contained a population of about seventy-four thousand persons:

"That, besides the parish church, which affords accommodation to two thousand persons, and Saint John's church, which affords accommodation to two thousand persons, there are four consecrated chapels in the said parish, namely, Saint Peter's, Saint Andrew's, Saint Philip's, and Saint James the Less, the first three of which will accommodate one thousand one hundred persons each, and the last will accommodate one thousand two hundred persons, all are free seats, and unappropriated seats:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending this parish, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the said four last-mentioned chapels, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and that such districts should be named, respectively, "The Chapelry District of Saint Peter," "The Chapelry District of Saint Andrew," "The Chapelry District of Saint Philip," and "The Chapelry District of Saint James the Less," with boundaries as follow:

*"The Chapelry District of Saint Peter."*

"The boundary of this district commences in the centre of the Hackney-road, opposite to Bird Cage-walk; and thence proceeds in an easterly and northerly direction along the boundary line which divides the parish of Saint Matthew, Bethnal-green, from the district parish of Haggerstone, as far as a point opposite to the centre of

Sebright-street; whence it proceeds south by an imaginary line drawn parallel with the centre of that street, and thence down the centre of the said street and Durham-street, as far as the Old Bethnal-green-road; whence it proceeds west along the centre of that road as far Wellington-row; up the centre of which last-mentioned row in proceeds in a northerly and westerly direction as far as Virginia-street and Bird Cage-walk; it then proceeds in a north easterly direction up the centre of Bird Cage-walk to the Hackney-road, at the point where the boundaries commenced, as shewn by the map, and thereon tinted brown:

*"The Chapelry District of Saint Andrew."*

"The boundary of this district commences in the Bethnal-green-road, opposite to Mapes-street; and proceeds in an easterly direction along the centre of that road as far as the Cambridge-road; down the centre of which said last-mentioned road it proceeds in a southerly direction to the Eastern Counties Railway; it then proceeds in a westerly direction along the centre of that railway as far as Wellington-street; and then proceeds in a northerly direction up the centre of such last-mentioned street and White-street, as far as Derbyshire-street; then east along the centre of Derbyshire-street to Mape-street, when it proceeds north up the centre of Mape-street to the Bethnal-green-road, at the point where the boundary commenced, as is shewn by the map, and thereon tinted yellow:

*"The Chapelry District of Saint Philip"*

"Is bounded on the north by a line drawn in the centre of Castle-street and Virginia-street; on the east by a line drawn in the centre of Turk-street, Tyssen-street, and Brick-lane; on the south by the parish of Spitalfields; and on the west by the parish of Saint Leonard, Shoreditch, as is shewn by the map, and thereon tinted blue:

*"The Chapelry District of Saint James the Less"*

"Is to consist of the easternmost part of the parish of Saint Matthew, Bethnal-green, from the remainder of which it is divided by a line commencing at the point where the Regent-canal intersects the boundary line of the parishes of Hackney and Bethnal-green; it then proceeds south easterly along the centre of such canal to the bridge adjacent to Bonner's-hall; then along the centre of a road leading in a south westerly direction from the said bridge to Bonner's-hall; whence it proceeds south along the centre of Green's-place, Bonner's-lane, Bonner's-street, and William-street (including all the houses on the easternmost sides of the said lanes, streets, &c.), to the point where the last-mentioned street meets the hamlet of Mile-end Old-town; whence it proceeds in an easterly, northerly, and westerly direction along the boundary line that divides the parish of Saint Matthew, Bethnal-green, from the said hamlet of Mile-end Old-town, in the parish of Saint Dunstan, Stepney, and the respective parishes of Bow by Stratford and Hackney, to the point where the boundary commenced at the Regent's-canal, as is shewn by the map, and thereon tinted green:

"That marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in each of the said chapels of Saint Peter, Saint Andrew, Saint Philip, and Saint James the Less; and that two thirds of the fees arising therefrom should, during the incumbency of the present Rector, belong and be paid to him, and the remaining third to the Ministers of the said respective chapels; and that, from and after the avoidance of the living, the whole of the fees should belong and be paid to the Ministers of the said chapels respectively:

"That the consent of the Lord Bishop of London has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third; in testimony whereof the said Lord Bishop has signed and sealed this present instrument:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, beg leave to lay before your Majesty the before-mentioned circumstances, and humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignments be accordingly made, and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.
