Major-General Sir Charles Napier, K.C.B. to the Governor-General.

Camp, Hyderabad, April 17, 1843.

MY LORD,

I HAVE the honour to inclose to your Lordship, the reports, made by officers commanding regiments, of remarkable actions performed by individuals under their command, in the battle fought on the 24th March.

Also the report of Captain Thomas, of the 8th native infantry, of the preparations made by him for the defence of the entrenchments at the residency, to attack which the enemy had detached 5000 men to Hooseerie, a village hard by, but subsequently he recalled this force to his main body at Dubba. It is right that I should state how much importance attached to the defence of the entrenchments, which, there was every reason to believe, would be attacked, as also the town of Hyderabad. These two garrisons diminished my force by 1079 men and two pieces of cannon; and I have to express my sense of the good arrangements and zeal of Major Reid and Captain Thomas, the officers whom (greatly against their own wishes) I ordered to remain in command of these two garrisons. Camp, Hyderabad, April 8, 1843.

SÌR,

I HAVE the honour to transmit, for the information of Major-General Sir Charles J. Napier, K.C.B. Governor of Sinde, that, on the departure of the force on the morning of the 24th of March, my first care was to assign posts to the officers and men under my command, which was done in the following manner: to Lieutenant Steward, of the 16th grenadiers Bengal native infantry, was con-fided the defence of the left flank of the breast work; to Lieutenant Bosanquet, of the same regiment, the right flank; and Lieutenant Pruen, Bombay artillery, and myself took charge of the front and reserve. The two guns left with me were most judiciously placed, en barbette, by Lieutenant Pruen, so that, in case of attack, they would have swept the whole of the works in front, and one entire flank. Two parties of sepoys, consisting of fifty men each, were formed as a reserve, and posted fifty paces on each side of the abattis, leading into the residency compound. The remaining sepoys were placed round the works, at intervals of ten paces distant, in single files, supported by matchlockmen and dismounted horsemen belonging to Meer Ali Morad, under the command of Sirdar Ali Hussein. Each flank abutting on the Indus was further protected by the Meteor and Nimrod, armed steamers, which effectually guarded against either of them being turned.

A reserve of fifty horse was posted in rear of the residency compound, equally distant from both flanks, and so as to be able to co-operate where most required. A similar reserve, and for a similar purpose, was posted in the centre of the front of the breast-work. The Khyheery horse of detached parties on the other side of the river were divided into two parties, and placed one hundred paces in rear of each flank, near the river, so that, had either flank been turned, these men would have been at hand to drive the enemy back, without requiring any man behind the breast work to leave his post.

Forty men of the Sinde horse, under a jemadar, defended on foot that part of the breast-work behind which they had encamped.

After posting the men, and seeing that each knew his position so as to fall in, in his proper place at a moment's warning, half the men were told off as a working party, to render the unfinished entrenchments as secure, as the limited time allowed us would admit of. By the evening I considered we were perfectly secure, having placed abattis, composed of babool trees, wherever we were unable to finish the trench.

Half the men during the day were always at their posts. At sunset every man fell in at his allotted station, and his arms, ammunition, &c. were carefully inspected. During the night sentries were placed, at intervals of twenty yards, the entire round of the works, the remaining men sleeping in their accoutrements, with the arms loaded by them; the officers doing the same. Outlying picquets of horse were stationed 250 yards outside the entrenchment on both flanks and front, who threw out videttes, and patrolled at the distance of from one to two miles from the works, each patrol crossing the other every half hour, and a report hourly delivered through the night. These at sunrise were withdrawn, and smaller parties of horse swept round the camp at four and five miles' distance during the day.

These were the arrangements I deemed proper for the defence of the camp, the charge of which I had the honour to be entrusted with by the Major-General and Governor in Sinde; and although no attack was made on the camp, still I hope I shall not be deemed presumptuous in declaring that, from the zeal and alacrity displayed by both officers and men under my command, there was no fear that, although our numbers were small, and the works extensive to defend, had we been attacked, we would have endeavoured to emulate the gallant example set us by the troops under the Major-General, more particularly after the reinforcement was received under Brevet Captain Unwin, artillery, consisting of forty European artillerymen, and two 68-pounder howitzers.

On the morning of the 24th March, we were reinforced by the Persian Prince Aga Khan, with twenty-five horsemen. He informed me that he had been driven out of Jurruck by 3000 Beloo--chees, with the loss on his side of 100 killed and -wounded in action, out of 130.

Only on one occasion did I hear of any Beloo-«chees being within four miles of me, and then Sirdar Ali Hussein, with eighty horse, was dispatched, just before daybreak, to reconnoitre, with orders to sweep the country for seven or eight miles round. He returned at ten A. M. and reported that no enemy was to be seen, or heard of. This proved to be the case, and, with the exception | village, passing, in my way to the Fulaillie, three

progressing towards the hills, nothing more was heard of the enemy.

On the arrival of the Planet steamer from Sukkur, Lieutenant M/Leod, of the 20th regiment native infantry, volunteered his services, as also did Lieutenant Pottinger, of the 15th regiment native infantry, of which I gladly availed myself.

Sirdar Ali Hussein co-operated most zealously with me, as also did all his people. The Khyree chiefs, and their men, behaved also very well.

In conclusion, I beg to express my thanks for the assistance I received from the officers during the time I was in command of the entrenched camp. I have, &c.

Return of a Standard taken by the 1st Troop Horse Artillery, in the Action with the Enemy, on the 24th March 1843.

Camp, Allyar-ka-Tanda, March 26, 1843.

Stamped, blue and white linen, on a staff, surmounted with a wooden crescent, on which a motto is inscribed .--- This standard was most gallantly captured close in front of the troop, by trumpeter Martin Phelan, just as the battery was coming into action, within a few paces of the enemy's right.

SIR.

Camp, Allyar-ka-Tanda, March 28, 1843.

IN obedience to Division Orders, I have the honour to report, for the information of Major-General Sir C. J. Napier, K.C.B. commanding in Sinde and Beloochistan, that I am unable to particularize any individual who prominently distinguished himself in action on the 24th instant. I trust, however, the Major-General will not consider me presumptuous, in bringing to his notice the steadiness of the regiment when under a very heavy fire close in front of the village, on the enemy's right, and where we had the irreparable misfortune of losing a gallant and much esteemed officer, Captain Garrett. In the same place, Lieutenant Snow had his horse and shoulder scales struck by matchlock bullets.

The enemy appearing to occupy the village in great force, I did not consider myself justified in leaving the left of our guns exposed, before the order reached me, "cavalry to the front," when I immediately advanced, and came round the

to the left, but seeing no enemy, returned, and then went off to the right, and followed up the enemy for about six miles, cutting up all we met, and brought in two camels. The ground was much intersected by numerous deep canals, and I am happy to state that all the men behaved in a most soldier-like manner, were perfectly obedient to every word of command I gave, and moved steadily in line throughout the whole charge.

Roll of Warrant Officers, Non-commissioned Officers, and Troopers, of the 3d Regiment Light Cavalry, who distinguished themselves in the Action fought on the 24th instant.

Camp, Allyar-ka-Tanda, March 30, 1843.

- Riding Master Walter .-- For gallant conduct, in engaging and killing several of four men that attacked him, and capturing one of their horses, his own charger (private property) being killed in the encounter. He was finally rescued by naick Bhowany Sing, who came to his assistance. Riding Master Walter was acting as Adjutant on that day.
- Havildar Guzerat Sing, 3d Troop.-Conspicuous gallantry, in singly engaging several men as-sembled, both on horseback and on foot, and killing one or more of them.
- Naich Bhowany Sing, 6th Troop .- Steady and gallant conduct, in proceeding to the rescue of Riding Master Walter, who was surrounded by the enemy, and there doing good and essential service.
- Trooper Hussein Bux, 6th Troop.-Gallant conduct, in rushing into the midst of the enemy to the rescue of Subadar Sahabut Khan, who, in endeavouring to capture a standard, had got surrounded by them. He killed several of the enemy on this occasion. He had before distinguished himself, and been wounded in action.
- Lance naick Chunder Sing, 3d Troop .-- Fought nobly; after killing two men, was knocked off his horse, which was immediately afterwards shot. He then had to fight his way on foot, in doing which, it is said, he killed several more.

Camp near Allyar-ka-Tanda, March 28, 1843.

IN compliance with Division Orders of the 26th instant, I have the honour to request you will bring to the notice of Major-General Sir C. J. Napier, K.C.B., that the conduct of the Poona horse, under my command, on the 24th, in the action with the enemy was such, that it would be invidious in me

deep nullahs. We first advanced a short distance to notice any of the numerous acts of gallantry performed by the sowars on that occasion. But when all behaved well, I cannot neglect to notice in particular the conduct of duffadar Ahmed Khan, who, throughout the action, was ever foremost, and led on the men in a manner which elicited my warmest approbation. This man has already the 3d class Order of Merit, from his having, at the fight at Nufoosk, in the Murree-hills, saved (under much peril) his commanding officer's life. He, on the 24th, in my presence, cut down three of the enemy, and also saved my life by sabreing the Beloochee, who wounded me in the sword-hand. I consider his conduct as well deserving the favourable notice of the Major-General.

Camp, March 27, 1843.

IN reference to Division Orders, calling for the names of officers, non-commissioned, and privates, who distinguished themselves in the battle of the 24th instant, I have made every enquiry, and, after due consideration, I have great difficulty in being able to make selections of particularly distinguished conduct, on an occasion when great gallantry and forwardness was conspicuous in the regiment. I hope I am not doing injustice by mentioning the following names:

- Lieutenant Coote was the first to surmount the enemy's works, and, whilst waving a standard he captured, and giving assistance to a soldier to reach the crest of the breast-work, was severely wounded.
- Corporal Timothy Kelly shot a man, bearing a silver knobbed standard, and captured it.
- Privates J. Doherty, C. Lynar, E. Tobin, J. M'Cartin, Thomas Walousley, G. Roberts, E. Watson, and J. Oakley, each of these men shot the bearer, and captured a standard.

Camp, near Allyar-ka-Tanda, March 28, 1843.

WITH reference to Division Orders, of the 26th instant, I do myself the honour to report, for the information of Major-General Sir C. J. Napier, K.C.B., commanding the troops in Sinde and Beloochistan, that in the general engagement which took place on the 24th instant, Purgass Sing, jema-dar of the light company of the regiment under my command, whilst skirmishing, accompanied by five sepoys of his own company, killed seven of the enemy, one of them supposed to be a chief, whom the jemadar slew in single combat, and captured Lesis arms. Private Appojee Surosce, of the light company, killed one of the enemy's standard bearers, capturing his standard, pursued and killed another of the enemy, in whose possession was a sword belonging to the 3d regiment light cavalry, which he recovered. Private Rugonat Sing, of the 3d company, bayonetted two of the enemy in presence of Captain Tait, commanding the Poona horse; he also bayonetted two of the enemy, and wounded a third, in presence of some of the Poona horse; which latter circumstance, the men belonging to that corps who witnessed the deeds, especially requested Captain Tait to bring to my notice. Major Waddington also was present.

IN obedience to Division Orders of yesterday's date, I beg to hand up the names of the under-mentioned European commissioned and non-commissioned officers and men, as follows :

sioned officers and men, as follows: Lieutenant W. E. Wilkinson, Adjutant, 21st native infantry, came to the front to support me, as I was leading the regiment over the centre ridge in the canal, which formed the enemy's position, and seeing a man, who has, I believe, since been ascertained to be Meer Goolam Alli Talpooree, coming at me, sword in hand, stepped in between and cut him down, in doing which he received a wound on the head, which cut through his pugree, and displaced the metal peak of a horse artillery helmet, and must have killed him, but for this defence, and he also got wounded in the sword arm.

Naick Sew Umber Bhut, grenadier company, was wounded in four or five places (I have no means of ascertaining more exactly, as the man was sent into Hyderabad so soon). Some of the wounds severe, but he would not leave the ranks, setting an example of fearlesness, and devotion to his duty, which I hope may be looked upon favourably. I have promised this man the first vacancy for the third stripe.

Private Oree Guzuria, 4th company, severely wounded in the thigh, but would not leave the ranks, and while I was requesting him to do so, seeing some heads over the bank, fired his piece, and continued loading and firing till the end of the engagement.

I beg to explain, that the nature of the duty entrusted to the 21st regiment was such, as in a great measure to preclude the possibility of any display of individual courage. The regiment was ordered to reserve its fire till within ten or fifteen paces of the enemy, and not a shot was fired till I gave the word, which I did not do till I got to within from ten to fifteen paces from the canal; consequently the whole regiment was able to jump into it at almost the same moment, and advanced in the same order, as much as the nature of the position

admitted, the most active getting up the centre ridge first. Officers not being encumbered with a musket and pouch of course had the advantage; but I can safely say, that none were backward, and I consider it would be invidious to mention the name of any, whom chance, or a superior degree of bodily activity, had enabled to gain a position to which all appeared to aspire equally.

To prove that I was as well supported by my men as I could desire, I hope it may not be considered foreign to the subject to mention, that, though attacked by several men, one after the other, I had not occasion once to act in my own defence. I have, &c.

Camp, neur Allyar-ka-Tanda, March 28, 1843.

IN reference to Division Orders of the 26th instant, calling on commanding officers to forward a statement of acts of gallantry performed by any commissioned, non-commissioned officers, or men, in the action of the 24th instant, I do myself the honour to transmit the only letter on this subject, which I have received in the 2d brigade.

2. As I was myself partly a witness to an act of courage and good example in the 25th regiment, I beg to be allowed to submit it to the Major-General commanding. When this regiment reached the village, the firing of the enemy, though greatly lessened, was still kept up in a very galling way from mapy of the houses. This was particularly the case from a mosque which had been loopholed, and the shots from it knocked over several sepoys. The building was entered by some of the men who were almost immediately driven out by the enemy. On seeing this, Ensign Nixon and Lieutenant Thomson, 25th regiment, instantly rushed into it, sword in hand, and attacked the enemy, eight in number. The former officer cut down three with his own hand, but while so engaged, his life was saved by the latter (Licutenant Thomson) warding off cuts made at him. The sepoys having, in the mean time got in, disposed of the remaining five. In this affair subadar Russall Singh, a gallant old native officer, took a prominent part, and had his sword broken in giving point to one of the enemy, and colour havildar Hoolass Singh, grenadier company, got a wound in the leg by a sword cut. In addition to these, Lieutenant Thomson has mentioned to me, that havildar Ballik Ram Tewarree, 5th; naick Ram Sah Panday, 4th; private Pursaud Murray, 5th ; and private Soomur Singh, 5th companies, particularly distinguished themselves by their courageous conduct on the occasion referred to, and all four were wounded in it.

3. In conclusion I can only state that, so far as came under my observation, every officer and man in the 2d brigade did his duty well and truly.
