A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

WHEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Tuesday the nineteenth day of this instant December; We, with the advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall be further prorogued, on the said nineteenth day of December instant, to Thursday the first day of February next; and We have given order to Our Chancellor of that part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly; and We do hereby further, with the advice aforesaid, declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, that the said Parliament shall, on the said Thursday the first day of February next, assemble and be holden for the dispatch of divers urgent and important affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said Thursday the first day of February next.

Given at Our Court at Windsor, this thirteenth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, and in the seventh year of Our reign.

THIS day the Right Honourable Richard Pakenham was, by Her Majesty's command, sworn of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and took his place at the Board accordingly.

Her Majesty having been pleased to appoint Lieutenant-General Sir Peregrine Maitland, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath, to be Governor and Commander in Chief in and over the settlement of the Cape of Good Hope, he this day took the oaths appointed to be taken by Governors of Her Majesty's plantations.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for carrying into effect, with

" certain modifications, the fourth report of the " Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and " Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the four and fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, " An " Act to explain and amend two several Acts " relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners " for England," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of November one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, in the words and figures following, that is to say :

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act " for carrying into effect, with certain modifications, " the fourth report of the Commissioners of " Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to explain and amend " two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical " Commissioners for England;" have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for effecting an exchange of certain advowsons between the Bishop of London and the Principal and Scholars of Brase-nose College, in Oxford.

" Whereas it is enacted by the first-recited Act, that, with an especial view to the better care of populous parishes, arrangements may, from time to time, be made, by the authority therein provided, for improving the value or making a better provision for the spiritual duties of ill-endowed parishes, by means of such exchange of advowsons, or of such other alterations in the exercise of patronage as may be agreed upon by patrons, with the consent of the Bishop in every such case; and, by the secondly recited Act, it is enacted, that it shall be competent to the authority, in the first-recited Act provided, to make such arrangements, with respect to the exchange of advowsons or other alteration in the exercise of patronage, notwithstanding that such advowsons, or any or either of them, or such patronage, shall be vested in, or belong to, any ecclesiastical corporation, aggregate or sole :

" And whereas the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Charles James Bishop of London

is, in right of his see, patron of the rectory of Weeley, in the diocese of London and county of Essex, and the Principal and Scholars of Brase-nose College, in Oxford, are patrons of the rectory of Saint Matthew, Bethnal-green, in the same diocese, and in the county of Middlesex, and of certain of the churches within the parish of Saint Matthew, Bethnal-green, and would also be patrons of all other churches or chapels erected therein :

" And whereas it has been made to appear to us, that it is expedient, for the objects contemplated and intended by the said first-recited Act, and would be conducive to the interests of religion, to exchange the advowson or right of patronage of the said rectory of Weeley, for the advowson or right of patronage of the said rectory of Saint Matthew, Bethnal-green, so that the advowson and right of patronage of the said rectory of Weeley may, after such exchange as aforesaid, be vested in, and exercised by, the said Principal and Scholars; and the advowson and right of patronage of the said rectory of Saint Matthew, Bethnal-green, and the right of patronage and nomination of and to all churches and chapels now or hereafter erected within the said parish of Saint Matthew, Bethnal-green, may, in like manner, be vested in, and exercised by, the the said Charles James Bishop of London, and his successors, Bishops of London :

" We, therefore, with the consent of the said Charles James Bishop of London, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, and also of the said Principal and Scholars, in testimony whereof they have hereunto affixed their corporate seal, do humbly recommend and propose, that such exchange of advowsons and right of patronage and nomination, respectively as aforesaid, shall be forthwith made and fully carried into effect."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her

Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of London.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for carrying into effect the reports of the Commissioners appointed to consider the state of the Established Church in England and Wales, with reference to ecclesiastical duties and revenues, so far as they relate to episcopal dioceses, revenues, and patronage;" and of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to alter and amend the laws relating to ecclesiastical houses of residence," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of November one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for carrying into effect the reports of the Commissioners appointed to consider the state of the Established Church in England and Wales, with reference to ecclesiastical duties and revenues, so far as they relate to episcopal dioceses, revenues, and patronage;" and of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications,

"the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to alter and amend the law relating to ecclesiastical houses of residence," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for affording compensation to the Bishop of Bangor for his immediate surrender of a benefice with cure of souls, accustomedly held by the Bishops of Bangor as part of the revenues of the see of Bangor.

"Whereas by the first-recited Act it is enacted, that, after the passing thereof, no ecclesiastical dignity, office, or benefice shall be held in commendam by any bishop, unless he shall so hold the same at the time of passing thereof, and that every commendam thereafter granted, whether to retain or to receive, and whether temporary or perpetual, shall be absolutely void to all intents and purposes:

"And whereas by the secondly-recited Act it is enacted, that, by the authority thereafter provided, and for the purpose of fully carrying into effect any of the provisions of the Act now in recital, or of the said first-recited Act, any sum of money which shall have been invested in the public funds, or in other security or securities, in trust, for any ecclesiastical body corporate, aggregate or sole, may, upon an application in writing, to us, under the hand and seal of such body corporate, be directed to be sold, and the same shall be sold accordingly; and the produce of such sale shall be applied to such purpose, and in such manner, as shall appear most conducive to the permanent benefit of such body corporate:

"And whereas by the thirdly-recited Act, it is declared and enacted, that the provisions of the said secondly-recited Act, relating to the sale and application of any sum of money invested, in trust, for any ecclesiastical body corporate, do and shall include and apply to all moneys, and securities for money, and to all stock in the Government funds, or elsewhere, standing in the name of the Accountant General of the Court of Chancery, or in the name or names of any other public officer, or of any individual or individuals, for or to the credit, or for the benefit of, or in trust, for any bishop, whether for the purpose of being laid out in land, or otherwise:

" And whereas by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled " An Act for carrying into effect an agreement for sale of certain messuages or tenements, and parcels of ground in the parish of Saint Andrew, Holborn, in the county of Middlesex, part of the possessions of the see of Bangor, and for applying the money arising therefrom in manner therein mentioned," it was enacted, that it should be lawful for the then Bishop of Bangor, and his successors, to join with the parties therein respectively named and described, in carrying into effect a certain agreement, therein recited, for the sale of the several messuages or tenements, hereditaments, and premises, in the same Act also particularly described, and the estates, terms, and interests of the respective lessees therein; and that the share of the Bishop of Bangor of the purchase money agreed upon for the said messuages or tenements, hereditaments, and premises, amounting to the sum of six thousand two hundred and twelve pounds ten shillings, should be paid into the Bank of England, in the name and with the privity of the Accountant General of the High Court of Chancery, to be placed to his account there, exparte " the Bishop of Bangor," and to be, from time to time, laid out by him in the purchase of Navy or Victualling Bills, or Exchequer Bills; and it was further enacted, that it should be lawful for the Court of Chancery, upon a petition to be presented to that Court by the said Bishop, or his successors, to direct the said Accountant General to apply the whole or any part of the money so directed to be paid into the Bank, and the interest arising thereon, for the purchase of a freehold messuage or mansion-house for the residence of the Bishop of Bangor for the time being, to be situate in the city of London, or the suburbs thereof, or in the city and liberties of Westminster, or the suburbs thereof:

" And whereas the sale of the said several messuages or tenements, hereditaments, and premises, accordingly took place, and the said sum of six thousand two hundred and twelve pounds ten shillings was thereupon paid into the Bank of England, in accordance with the directions contained in the same Act, which said sum is still remaining in the Bank of England, in the name

and to the account as aforesaid, the same having been invested in the purchase of Exchequer Bills, and; together with the accumulated interest thereon, now amounts to the sum of eight thousand four hundred pounds:

" And whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend Christopher Bishop of Bangor, and it appears to us, that it is not expedient that the said last-mentioned sum, or any part thereof, should be applied towards the purpose contemplated by the said last-recited Act; but that it would be more for the permanent benefit of the said see, to apply such sum in manner hereinafter recommended:

" And whereas the rectory of Llanddyffnan, with the chapelries of Pentraeth, Llanbedr-goch, and Llanfairmathavarmeithaf thereunto annexed, in the county of Anglesea, and in the diocese of Bangor, has, for a long series of years, been accustomedly held by the Bishops of Bangor, as part of the revenues of the said see; and it is proposed by the said Christopher Bishop of Bangor, immediately to surrender and vacate the same, upon due provision being made for him and his successors in the said see, in compensation for the loss of the emoluments derived from the said rectory:

" And whereas it appears by the provisions of the said first-recited Act, that one of the purposes thereof was to prevent the necessity for the holding of such benefices by any bishop:

" And whereas an application, in writing, has been made to us, under the hand and seal of the said Christopher Bishop of Bangor, for the sale of the said Exchequer Bills, and for the appropriation of the produce of such sale in manner hereinafter mentioned:

" Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, that the said Exchequer Bills, now standing in the name of the Accountant General of the Court of Chancery, in the books of the Governor and Company of the Bank of England, and placed to his account there, exparte " the Bishop of Bangor," shall be forthwith sold, and the produce of such sale shall thereupon be paid to us, and shall be reinvested in the joint names of the Bishop of Bangor for the time being and ourselves, in such Government or Parliamentary Stock, or other public security or securities, in England, as shall be approved by us, with the consent of the said Christopher Bishop of Bangor, or the Bishop

of Bangor for the time being, under his hand and seal, and the same shall form part of the possessions of the said see of Bangor, and the dividends, interest, and annual produce thereof shall be received by the said Christopher Bishop of Bangor, and his successors; and that, immediately upon such reinvestment being certified by us, by an instrument in writing under our common seal, and such instrument being published in the London Gazette, the said rectory of Llanddyffnan, with the said several chapelries thereunto annexed, shall become and be absolutely vacant, without any formal resignation thereof by the said Christopher Bishop of Bangor, and the patronage thereof shall be and remain in the said Bishop and his successors, Bishops of Bangor, for ever:

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing other measures relating to the several matters and things herein referred to, or either of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or any of them.”

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Bangor. *Wm. The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament, made in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled “ An Act to regulate the trade of the British possessions abroad,” it was, amongst other things, enacted, that it should be lawful for His Majesty, by

and with the advice of His Privy Council, by any Order or Orders in Council, to be issued from time to time, to give such directions and make such regulations, touching the trade and commerce to and from any British possessions on or near the Continent of Europe, or within the Mediterranean Sea, or in Africa, or within the limits of the East India Company's charter (excepting the possessions of the said Company), as to His Majesty in Council should appear most expedient and salutary, any thing in the said Act to the contrary notwithstanding :

And whereas, under and by virtue of the said Act of Parliament, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, did, on the eleventh day of July one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, make a certain Order for regulating the Customs of the island of Saint Helena, whereby it was ordered, that all duties of Customs, payable in the said island under the said Order in Council, should be paid and received according to British weights and measures in use on the sixth day of July one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five :

And whereas it is now deemed expedient, that the duties of Customs, in the said island of Saint Helena, should henceforth be levied according to the imperial weights and measures by law established, and not according to the weights and measures in use on the sixth of July one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in Her in that behalf vested by the said recited Act, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that so much of the said recited Order in Council as relates to the weights and measures, according to which the duties of Customs in the said island of Saint Helena should be paid and received, shall be, and the same is hereby, rescinded and revoked; and that all duties of Customs, hereafter to be levied in the said island of Saint Helena, shall be paid and received according to the imperial weights and measures for the time being by law established :

And it is hereby further ordered, that the governor, or the officer for the time being administering the government of the said colony, shall and is hereby required to promulgate this present Order, within one calendar month next after the receipt thereof by him; and this Order shall take

effect within the said island of Saint Helena, and have the force of law there, from and after the date of such promulgation thereof as aforesaid, and not before :

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury and the Right Honourable Lord Stanley are to give the necessary directions accordingly.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fourth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, cap. 77, intituled "An Act to authorize His Majesty, under certain circumstances, to regulate the duties and drawbacks on goods imported or exported in foreign vessels, and to exempt certain foreign vessels from pilotage," it was, amongst other things, enacted, that it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, or by any Order or Orders in Council, in all cases in which British vessels, of less burthen than sixty tons, are not required by law to take pilots, to exempt foreign vessels, being of less burthen than sixty tons, from taking on board a pilot to conduct them into or from any of the ports of the United Kingdom, any law, custom, or usage to the contrary notwithstanding :

"And whereas His said late Majesty King George the Fourth in Council did, by six several Orders, respectively bearing date the twenty-first July one thousand eight hundred and twenty-three, the eighteenth November one thousand eight hundred and twenty-three, the tenth March one thousand eight hundred and twenty-four, the tenth March one thousand eight hundred and twenty-four, the twenty-fifth May one thousand eight hundred and twenty-four, and the nineteenth October one thousand eight hundred and twenty-four, issued in pursuance of the said recited Act, grant the exemption, by the said Act authorized to be granted as hereinbefore is mentioned, to vessels of less burthen than sixty tons, belonging to the following countries and places (that is to say),

The Netherlands,
Hanover,
Denmark,
Hamburgh,
Lubeck, and
Bremen :

And whereas by an Act of Parliament, passed in the sixth year of the reign of His said late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act for the amendment of the law respecting pilots and pilotage, and also for the better preservation of floating lights, buoys, and beacons," it is enacted, that the several Acts therein recited, and all and every the clauses, provisions, powers, penalties, forfeitures, matters, and things relating as well to pilots appointed by the Corporation of the Trinity-house of Deptford Strond, as to pilots of the Fellowship of Dover, Deal, or the isle of Thanet, and to the pilotage by, and regulation of, all such pilots as aforesaid, and also as to the conduct of all persons in matters of pilotage within the jurisdiction of the said Corporation of the Trinity-house of Deptford Strond, and the liberty of the Cinque Ports, which are contained in any Act or Acts of Parliament theretofore made, shall be and the same are thereby repealed :

And by the said Act now in recital it is enacted, that the master of any ship or vessel, not exceeding the burthen of sixty tons, and having a British register, may lawfully pilot his own ship, so long as he shall pilot the same without the aid of any unlicenced pilot, or other persons than the ordinary crew of the ship :

And by the said Act now in recital it is also enacted, that, after the passing thereof, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by any Order in Council, to permit and authorize ships and vessels, not exceeding the burthen of sixty tons, and not having a British register, to be piloted and conducted without having a duly licenced pilot on board, upon the same terms and conditions as are, by the said Act, imposed on British ships and vessels not exceeding the like burthen :

And by the said Act now in recital it is likewise enacted, that nothing therein contained shall extend to the taking away, abridging, defeating, or interrupting of any grants, liberties, franchises, or privileges heretofore granted by any charters or Acts of Parliament to the pilots of the Trinity-house of the town of Kingston-upon-Hull, or the

Trinity-house of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, or to alter or repeal any provisions contained in any Act of Parliament relating to the pilots of any ports or districts in relation to which particular provision shall have been made in any Act of Parliament as to the pilots or pilotage, or to the pilotage within the limits prescribed by any Act of Parliament relating to pilotage for such ports, or to the burthen of vessels navigating to or from such ports :

And whereas Her Majesty is desirous of confirming the exemption so granted as aforesaid to the vessels of the countries and places heretofore mentioned, and of placing such vessels as are hereinafter described, being under sixty tons burthen, upon the same footing, with regard to exemption from pilotage, as vessels of like burthen having a British register, and for that purpose to exercise the powers so vested in Her as hereinbefore is mentioned, in manner hereinafter expressed :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Acts respectively, and of every other power authorizing Her Majesty in that behalf, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the date of this Order, as respects the ports and places following, namely,

The port of Kingston-upon-Hull,

The port of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, and the ports or places being members thereof, respectively, and all other ports and places in respect of which the power vested in Her Majesty by virtue of the said recited Act, of the fourth year of the reign of His said late Majesty King George the Fourth, is still subsisting, all such vessels as are described in the schedule to this Order annexed, being of less burthen than sixty tons, which shall enter into or clear out from any of the said ports or places, shall be, and they are hereby, exempted from taking on board a pilot to conduct them into or from any such port or place, in all cases where British vessels, being of less burthen than sixty tons, are not required by law to take pilots, any law, custom, or usage to the contrary notwithstanding :

And it is hereby further ordered, that from and after the date of this Order, as respects all other

ports and places in the United Kingdom, all such vessels as are described in the schedule to this Order annexed, being of less burthen than sixty tons, which shall enter and clear out of any of such ports and places, shall be, and they are hereby, authorized and permitted to be piloted and conducted without having a duly licenced pilot on board, upon the same terms and conditions as by the said recited Act, of the sixth year of the reign of His said late Majesty King George the Fourth, are required upon British ships and vessels not exceeding the like burthen :

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions accordingly.

themselves variable according to the position of the spectator. The rapidity of movement is so adjusted, that the duration of the flashes will vary from 0'' to 48'', and that of the eclipses from 0'' to 72'', the sums of the duration of light and darkness bearing however, in every position, the constant ratio of 2 to 3. From the south eastern extremity of the Pulicat Shoal, the New Light-house bears S. 23° W., and is distant 13 miles; but no ship or vessel, when hauling in from the northward for the Madras roadstead, should bring the light to bear to the southward of S. 28° W., or S. S. W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., unless her position is well ascertained. Commanders of vessels are hereby warned of the serious risk they incur by incautiously approaching the dangerous vicinity of the Pulicat Shoal, as hazy weather or other causes may obscure the light, true soundings therefore and a vigilant look out are imperatively called for. The limits of the Madras roadstead (in 8 or 9 fathoms) are comprised within the following

bearings, viz. from the northward the Light-house will bear S. 56° W., and from the southward N. 81° W. or from S. W. b. W. to W. $\frac{3}{4}$ N.
