The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for carrying into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of November one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for carrying into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England;" have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for effecting an exchange of certain advowsons between the Bishop of London and the Principal and Scholars of Brase-nose College, in Oxford.

"Whereas it is enacted by the first-recited Act that, with an especial view to the better care of populous parishes, arrangements may, from time to time, be made, by the authority therein provided, for improving the value or making a better provision for the spiritual duties of ill-endowed parishes, by means of such exchange of advowsons, or of such other alterations in the exercise of patronage as may be agreed upon by patrons, with the consent of the Bishop in every such case; and, by the secondly recited Act, it is enacted, that it shall be competent to the authority in the first-recited Act provided, to make such arrangements, with respect to the exchange of advowsons or other alteration in the exercise of patronage, notwithstanding that such advowsons, or any or either of them, or such patronage, shall be vested in, or belong to, any ecclesiastical corporation, aggregate or sole:

"And whereas the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Charles James Bishop of London is, in right of his see, patron of the rectory of Weeley, in the diocese of London and county of Essex, and the Principal and Scholars of Brase-nose College, in Oxford, are patrons of the rectory of Saint Matthew, Bethnal-green, in the same diocese, and in the county of Middlesex, and of certain of the churches within the parish of Saint Matthew, Bethnal-green, and would also be patrons of all other churches or chapels erected therein:

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us, that it is expedient, for the objects contemplated and intended by the said first-recited Act, and would be conducive to the interests of religion, to exchange the advowson or right of patronage of the said rectory of Weeley, for the advowson or right of patronage of the said rectory of Saint Matthew, Bethnal-green, so that the advowson and right of patronage of the said

rectory of Weeley may, after such exchange as aforesaid, be vested in, and exercised by, the said Principal and Scholars; and the advowson and right of patronage of the said rectory of Saint Matthew, Bethnal-green, and the right of patronage and nomination of and to all churches and chapels now or hereafter erected within the said parish of Saint Matthew, Bethnal-green, may, in like manner, be vested in, and exercised by, the said Charles James Bishop of London, and his successors, Bishops of London :

"We, therefore, with the consent of the said Charles James Bishop of London, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, and also of the said Principal and Scholars, in testimony whereof they have hereunto affixed their corporate seal, do humbly recommend and propose, that such exchange of advowsons and right of patronage and nomination, respectively as aforesaid, shall be forthwith made and fully carried into effect."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of London.

THE following is a copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, assigning a district chapelry, under the 16th section of the 59th Geo. 3, cap. 134, to Christ Church, at New Mill, in the parish of Kirkburton, in the county of York :

At the Court at Windsor, the 10th of November 1843, present, the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intitled "An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "that in every case in which the Commissioners appointed for carrying into execution the purposes of the said Act shall be of opinion that it will be expedient to divide any parish into two or more distinct and separate parishes; for all ecclesiastical purposes whatever, it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese in which such parish is locally situated, signified under his hand and seal, to apply to the patron or patrons of the church of such parish for his consent to make such division, and for such patron or patrons to signify his or their consent thereto under his hand and seal; and the said Commissioners shall, upon the consent of the said patron or patrons so signified, represent the whole matter to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which it is proposed, with such consent as aforesaid, to divide such parish, together with the relative and respective proportions of glebe land, tithes, moduses, or other endowments which will by such division arise and accrue, and remain and be, within each of such respective divisions, and also the relative proportions of the estimated amount of the value or produce of fees, oblations, offerings, or other ecclesiastical dues or profits which may arise and accrue within each of such respective divisions; and if thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division; provided always, that no such division of any parish into distinct parishes shall completely take effect until after the death, resign

tion, or other avoidance of the existing incumbent of the parish to be divided ;" and it is by the 21st section of the said Act further enacted, " that in any case in which the said Commissioners shall be of opinion that it is not expedient to divide any populous parish, or extra parochial place, into such complete, separate, and distinct parishes as aforesaid, but that it is expedient to divide the same into such ecclesiastical districts as they, with the consent of the bishop, signified under his hand and seal, may deem necessary for the purpose of affording accommodation for the attending divine service, according to the rites of the United Church of England and Ireland, to persons residing therein, in the churches and parochial chapels already built, or in additional chureles or chapels to be built therein, and as may appear to such Commissioners to be convenient for the enabling the spiritual person or persons who may serve such churches or chapels to perform all ecclesiastical duties within the districts attached to such respective churches and chapels, and for the due ecclesiastical superintendence of such district, and the preservation and improvement of the religious and moral habits of the persons residing therein, the said Commissioners shall represent such opinion to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which such districts are proposed to be described ; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division : "

And whereas by an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled " An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, in the same manner and with the like consents as are required in case of division into ecclesiastical districts under the said recited Act, or this Act, to assign a particular district to any chapel of ease or parochial chapel already existing, or to any chapel built, or which may hereafter be built or acquired under the powers of the said Act, or this Act; and such district shall be under the immediate care of the curate appointed to serve such chapel, but subject, nevertheless, to the superintendence and controul of the incumbent of the parish church ; and all such curates shall be nominated by the incumbent of the parish to the bishop for his licence, except where the right of nomination shall already be legally vested in any other person or persons, and in every such case by the person or persons possessing such right of nomination, subject to all the laws in force relating to stipendiary curates, except as to the assigning of salaries to such curates ; provided always, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, to determine whether any and what part or proportion of the fees or dues for marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials shall be assigned to any such curate ; and whether banns of

marriage shall be published, and marriages or baptisms, churchings or burials, shall be solemnized or performed in any such chapel or not ; and in any case in which marriages shall be allowed in any such chapel, the Commissioners shall cause the boundaries of the district assigned to such chapel to be enrolled in the High Court of Chancery, and in the office of the Registry of the diocese, any thing in the said recited Act to the contrary notwithstanding ; and no such chapelry shall become a benefice by reason of any augmentation of the maintenance of the curate, by any grant or bounty under the provision of any Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, for augmenting small livings, any thing in such Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, to the contrary notwithstanding : "

And whereas by another Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled " An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes ;" and by another Act, made and passed in the first and second years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled " An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled ' An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes ;' " and also by another Act, made and passed in the second and third years of His said late Majesty, intituled " An Act to render more effectual an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled ' An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes ;' " further provisions are made for carrying such divisions into effect :

And whereas the said Commissioners have made a representation to Her Majesty in Council, bearing date the eleventh day of October one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, in the words following, viz.

" Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches, appointed by virtue of an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled " An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes ;" continued by an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled " An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes ;" and further continued by an Act, passed in the first year of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to prolong, for ten years, Her Majesty's Commission for building new churches ;" beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, when the last census was taken, the parish of Kirkburton, in the county of York and diocese of Ripon, contained a population of eighteen thousand four hundred and fifty-two persons :

"And that, besides the parish church, which affords accommodation to about fourteen hundred persons, there are two consecrated chapels therein, one of which, built by your Majesty's said Commissioners, at New Mill, in the said parish, and called Christ Church, affords accommodation to eleven hundred and fifty persons, including five hundred free seats appropriated to the use of the poor; and that divine service is regularly performed therein :

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending this parish, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the said chapel, called Christ Church, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and that such district should be named, "The Chapelry District of Christ Church, New Mill," and consist of parts of the townships of Foulstone and Wooldale, with boundaries as follows :

"The boundary to commence at the public highway, at Mitholm-bridge, where the townships of Wooldale and Thurstonland join, and proceed, in an easterly direction, along the boundary line which separates the last-mentioned township from the township of Foulstone, until it meets the boundary line separating those townships from that of Shepley; when it proceeds, in a southerly direction, along the boundary line separating the said townships of Foulstone and Shepley, as far as the township of Cumberworth, in the parish of Silkstone, when it follows the boundary line between the said townships of Cumberworth and Foulstone to where they join the parish of Penistone; and then along the boundary line of the said parish of Penistone and the township of Foulstone as far as a detached portion of the township of Hepworth; it then pursues a westerly course along the boundary line separating the said township of Foulstone from the said detached portion of Hepworth, and also a detached portion of the township of Wooldale, till it again joins the township of Hepworth; it then proceeds along the line separating the said townships of Foulstone and Hepworth in a westerly, northerly, easterly, northerly, and westerly direction, till it joins the highway at Jackson's-bridge; up the middle of which public highway it proceeds, in a north westerly and easterly direction, through Totties and Wooldale, till it enters the said township of Thurstonland at Mytholm-bridge, the point where the boundary commenced, as is shewn on the map hereto annexed, and thereon coloured pink :

"That marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said chapel; and that the fees arising therefrom should be received by and belong to the Minister of the said chapel for the time being :

"That the consent of the Lord Bishop of Ripon has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third; in testimony whereof, the said Lord Bishop has signed and sealed this present instrument :

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, beg leave to lay before your Majesty the before-mentioned circumstances, and humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made, and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.

And it is also intended, by the said Act to be applied for, to enable such intended associated board of directors, or new company (as the case may be), to levy the tolls, rates, and duties for and in respect of the use of the said Manchester and Leeds Railway and Hull and Selby Railway, respectively, which are, by the Acts relating to the said railways, respectively authorized to be levied; and to exercise any powers now vested in either of the said companies; and to insert in the same Act all such powers and provisions as may be considered proper or expedient for carrying into effect the several objects above mentioned; and, for the purposes aforesaid, it is intended to alter, amend, and enlarge the powers and provisions of the several Acts relating to the Manchester and Leeds Railway, passed, respectively, in the sixth and seventh and seventh years of the reign of King William the Fourth, and in the second and third and in the fourth years of the reign of Her present Majesty; and relating to the Hull and Selby Railway, passed, respectively, in the sixth year of the reign of King William the Fourth, and in the sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty.—Dated this 2d day of January 1844.
