That this Court does, therefore, most earnestly recommend to the Court of Directors, the immediate adoption of such steps, by representation to Her Majesty's Government or otherwise, as may cause all practicable reparation to be made for the injustice already committed, and enforce the abandonment of a line of policy inconsistent with good faith and subversive of the interests of the British rule in India.
