THE following is a copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, assigning a chapelry district, under the 16th section of the 59th Geo. 3., cap. 134, to St Thomas's Church, at Kimberworth, in the parish of Rotherham, in the county of York :

At the Court at Windsor, the 2d of October 1843, present, the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "that in every case in which the Commissioners appointed for carrying into execution the purposes of the said Act shall be of opinion that it will be expedient to divide any parish into two or more distinct and separate parishes, for all ecclesiastical purposes whatever, it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese in which such parish is locally situated, signified under his hand and seal, to apply to the patron or patrons of the church of such parish for his consent to make such division, and for such patron or patrons to signify his or their consent thereto under his hand and seal ; and the said Commissioners shall, upon the consent of the said patron or patrons so signified, represent the whole matter to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which it is proposed, with such consent as aforesaid, to divide such parish, together with the relative and respective proportions of glebe land, tithes, moduses, or other endowments which will by such division arise and accrue, and remain and be, within each of such respective divisions, and also the relative proportions of the estimated amount of the value or produce of fees, oblations, offerings, or other ecclesiastical dues or profits which may arise and accrue within each of such respective divisions ; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division ; provided always, that no such division of any parish into distinct parishes shall completely take effect until after the death, resignation, or other avoidance of the existing incumbent of the parish to be divided ;" and it is by the 21st section of the said Act further enacted, "that in any case in which the said Commissioners shall be of opinion that it is not expedient to divide any populous parish, or extra parochial place, into such complete, separate, and distinct parishes as aforesaid, but that it is expedient to divide the same into such ecclesiastical districts as they, with the consent of the bishop, signified under his hand and seal, may deem necessary for the purpose of affording accommodation for the attending divine service, according to the rites of the United Church

of England and Ireland, to persons residing therein, in the churches and parochial chapels already built, or in additional churches or chapels to be built therein, and as may appear to such Commissioners to be convenient for the enabling the spiritual person or persons who may serve such churches or chapels to perform all ecclesiastical duties within the districts attached to such respective churches and chapels, and for the due ecclesiastical superintendence of such district, and the preservation and improvement of the religious and moral habits of the persons residing therein, the said Commissioners shall represent such opinion to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which such districts are proposed to be described ; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division :"

And whereas by an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, in the same manner and with the like consents as are required in case of division into ecclesiastical districts under the said recited Act, or this Act, to assign a particular district to any chapel of ease or parochial chapel already existing, or to any chapel built, or which may hereafter be built or acquired under the powers of the said Act, or this Act ; and such district shall be under the immediate care of the curate appointed to serve such chapel, but subject, nevertheless, to the superintendence and controul of the incumbent of the parish church ; and all such curates shall be nominated by the incumbent of the parish to the bishop for his licence, except where the right of nomination shall already be legally vested in any other person or persons, and in every such case by the person or persons possessing such right of nomination, subject to all the laws in force relating to stipendiary curates, except as to the assigning of salaries to such curates ; provided always, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, to determine whether any and what part or proportion of the fees or dues for marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials shall be assigned to any such curate ; and whether banns of marriage shall be published, and marriages or baptisms, churchings or burials, shall be solemnized or performed in any such chapel or not ; and in any case in which marriages shall be allowed in any such chapel, the Commissioners shall cause the boundaries of the district assigned to such chapel to be enrolled in the High Court of Chancery, and in the office of the Registry of the diocese, any thing in the said recited Act to the contrary notwithstanding ; and no such chapelry shall become a benefice by reason of any augmentation of the maintenance of the curate, by any grant or bounty

under the provision of any Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, for augmenting small livings, any thing in such Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, to the contrary notwithstanding :”

And whereas by another Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled “An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes ;” and by another Act, made and passed in the first and second years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled “An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled ‘An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes ;’” and also by another Act, made and passed in the second and third years of His said late Majesty, intituled “An Act to render more effectual an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled ‘An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes ;’” further provisions are made for carrying such divisions into effect :

And whereas the said Commissioners have made a representation to Her Majesty in Council, bearing date the fourteenth day of September one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, in the words following, viz.

“Your Majesty’s Commissioners for building new churches, appointed by virtue of an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled “An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes ;” continued by an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled “An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes ;” and further continued by an Act, passed in the first year of your Majesty’s reign, intituled “An Act to prolong, for ten years, Her Majesty’s Commission for building new churches ;” beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, when the last census was taken, the parish of Rotherham, in the county and diocese of York, contained a population of thirteen thousand three hundred and eighty-five persons :

“And that, besides the parish church, which affords accommodation to one thousand one hundred persons, there are three consecrated churches or chapels in the said parish, one of which, called St. Thomas’s, at Kimberworth, and built by your Majesty’s said Commissioners, affords accommodation to six hundred and two persons, including four hundred and seven free seats appropriated to the use of the poor; and that divine service is regularly performed in the said chapel :

“Your Majesty’s said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending this parish, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the said chapel at Kimberworth, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled “An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes ;” and that such district should be named, “The Chapelry District of St. Thomas, Kimberworth,” with boundaries as follow :

“The boundary commences at the bridge over the North Midland Railway, on the road from Rotherham to Kimberworth, and proceeds south along the western side of the line of the said railway to the point where it crosses the river Don; from thence it proceeds in a westerly direction up the course of the said river to the point where Blackburn-brook empties itself into the said river Don; the boundary then proceeds along the said brook, in a north westerly direction, to a point two and a half chains distant from the Homestead-wall of Grange-mill, at which point it reaches the boundary of the Thorp Church district; along which last-mentioned boundary it continues in a north easterly direction across the Meadow and Blackburn-lane, and along the south side of Lord’s-field, across Barber-wood; whence it continues by the south side of the park fence and Nursery-field, down the eastern side of the latter, to a gate at the end of an occupation road; it then continues along the said road to the westward, as far as the carriage road from the Rotherham and Wortley turnpike road to the Grange; it then proceeds along the said carriage road to the said turnpike road; and then continues along the said turnpike road to the west, as far as a gate leading into a field on the east side of the said last-mentioned road, called Low Croft; it then passes along the western side of the said field, then crosses Middle Croft in a line with the fence at the end of Upper Croft; along which it passes to the fence wall of Schole’s-wood; whence it continues to the eastward by the south side of the said fence wall of Schole’s-wood to a point which divides the townships of Kimberworth and Greaseborough; and continues by the said boundary to the east along the north side of Hudson Rough, and on the south side of Basingthorpe Spring-wood, as far as the bridle road from Bradgate to Greaseborough; it then proceeds in a south westerly direction along the said bridle road, as far as the occupation road, across the south side of a certain field in the occupation of G. W. Chambers, Esq. called the Far Wood Close, and continues along the said occupation road in a south easterly direction as far as Masbro’-common-road; it then crosses the said road, and continues in a direct line to the fence of the North Midland Railway; along the western line of which railway it proceeds to the south as far as the bridge over the

same, where the boundary commenced, as is more particularly delineated on the map hereunto annexed, and thereon tinted green :

“ That baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said chapel; and that the fees arising therefrom should be received by and belong to the Minister thereof :

“ That the consent of his Grace the Archbishop of York has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third; in testimony whereof, the said Archbishop has signed and sealed this present instrument :

“ Your Majesty’s Commissioners, therefore, beg leave to lay before your Majesty the before-mentioned circumstances, and humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet.”

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made, and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the solemnization of baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches, appointed by virtue of an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" continued by an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and further continued by an Act, passed in the first year of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to prolong, for ten years, Her Majesty's Commission for building new churches;" beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, when the last census was taken, the parish of Bromsgrove, in the county and diocese of Worcester, contained a population of nine thousand six hundred and seventy-two persons:

"That, besides the parish church, which will afford accommodation to one thousand seven hundred persons, there is one consecrated church or chapel in the said parish, situate at Catshill, and built partly by a grant from your Majesty's said Commissioners, which affords accommodation to five hundred and forty-six persons, including four hundred and four free seats appropriated to the use of the poor; and that divine service is regularly performed therein:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave, therefore, to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending this parish, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the said chapel at Catshill, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and that such district should be named, "The Chapelry District of Christ Church, at Catshill," with boundaries as follow:

"The boundary of such district commences at the point in Warbage-lane, where the parishes of Bromsgrove and Belbroughton meet, and then proceeds in an easterly and north easterly direction along the middle of Warbage-lane into Alfred's Well-lane; along the middle of Alfred's Well-lane into Fockbury-lane; across Fockbury-lane along the public foot path which terminates

close to Fockbury Mill-pond; from which Mill-pond the boundary proceeds up the course of the brook to a certain point in a meadow called Martin's Meadow, belonging to John Knight, Esq. where there is a public footpath which commences near to the Crown Inn, Catshill; and passes over the said brook on to the land of the said John Knight, and terminates in the Bromsgrove and Birmingham turnpike road, about fifty yards from the junction of the old and new roads; the boundary then proceeds from the above-named point along the said footpath to its termination as above stated; then along the middle of the Birmingham road to the end of the Old Birmingham road; along the middle of the Old Birmingham road to the end of Linehouse-lane; along the middle of Linehouse-lane to the end of Brookhouse-lane; along the middle of Brookhouse-lane to the end of Green otherwise Stony Hill-lane; along the middle of Green otherwise Stony Hill-lane into Twatling-street; across Twatling-street into the Shrubbery-lane; up the middle of the Shrubbery-lane to the end of the Warren-lane; down the middle of the Warren-lane to the point where the parishes of Bromsgrove and Coston Hacket meet; it then proceeds in a northerly direction along the boundary line which separates the parish of Bromsgrove from the parishes of Coston Hacket, King's Norton, and Frankley, to the point where the latter parish joins the parish of Hale's Owen; it then proceeds in a southerly and south westerly direction along the boundary line which separates the said parish of Bromsgrove from the parishes of Hale's Owen and Belbroughton, as far as Warbage-lane, where the boundary commenced, as shewn by the plan, and thereon coloured pink :

" That baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said chapel; and that the fees arising therefrom should be received by and belong to the Minister of the said chapel :

" That the consent of the Lord Bishop of Worcester has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third; in testimony whereof, the said Lord Bishop has signed and sealed this present instrument :

" Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, beg leave to lay before your Majesty the before-mentioned circumstances, and humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made, and

the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the solemnization of baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.

To the Lords Conservators of the River Mersey, and the Acting Conservator thereof.

YOU will please to take notice, that Mr. Thomas Gilbertson, of the township of Birkenhead, in the county of Chester, corn merchant, purposes to enclose that portion of the shore lying contiguous to property belonging to him, situate in Birkenhead, on the margin of Tranmere-pool, bounded on the north by Abbey-street, on the east by land and shore land belonging to the Corporation of Liverpool, and on the south by the low water gut in Tranmere-pool aforesaid, for the purpose of producing wharfage room and landing accommodation, by constructing a river wall of one hundred and ninety yards and one foot in length (including the opening of the basin next mentioned), and a dry low water basin, having an entrance from Tranmere-pool of twenty-six feet wide, and being in width within the entrance fifty-five feet, and in length one hundred and five yards from the face of the said river wall; the general

design and intention of which will be understood by reference to the accompanying plan and sections.
