The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the fourth VV year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, cap. 77, intituled "An Act to " authorize His Majesty, under certain circum-" stances, to regulate the duties and drawbacks on " goods imported or exported in foreign vessels, " and to exempt certain foreign vessels from " pilotage," it was, amongst other things, enacted, that it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, or by any Order or Orders in Council, in all cases in which British vessels, of less burthen than sixty tons, are not required by law to take pilots, to exempt foreign vessels, being of less burthen than sixty tons, from taking on board a pilot to conduct them into or from any of the ports of the United Kingdom, any law, custom, or usage to the contrary notwithstanding:

" And whereas His said late Majesty King George the Fourth in Council did, by six several Orders, respectively bearing date the twenty-first July one thousand eight hundred and twenty-three, the eighteenth November one thousand eight hundred and twenty-three, the tenth March one thousand eight hundred and twenty-four, the tenth March one thousand eight hundred and twenty-four, the twenty-fifth May one thousand eight hundred and twenty-four, and the nineteenth October one thousand eight hundred and twenty-four, issued in pursuance of the said recited Act, grant the exemption, by the said Act authorized to be granted as hereinbefore is mentioned, to yessels of less

And whereas by an Act of Parliament, passed in the sixth year of the reign of His said late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled " An Act for " the amendment of the law respecting pilots and " pilotage, and also for the better preservation of " floating lights, buoys, and beacons," it is enacted, that the several Acts therein recited, and all and every the clauses, provisions, powers, penalties, forfeitures, matters, and things relating as well to pilots appointed by the Corporation of the Trinity-house of Deptford Strond, as to pilots of the Fellowship of Dover, Deal, or the isle of Thanet, and to the pilotage by, and regulation of, all such pilots as aforesaid, and also as to the conduct of all persons in matters of pilotage within the jurisdiction of the said Corporation of the Trinity-house of Deptford Strond, and the liberty of the Cinque Ports, which are contained in any Act or Acts of Parliament theretofore made, shall be and the same are thereby repealed:

And by the said Act now in recital it is enacted, that the master of any ship or vessel, not exceeding the burthen of sixty tons, and having a British register, may lawfully pilot his own ship, so long as he shall pilot the same without the aid of any unlicenced pilot, or other persons than the ordinary crew of the ship:

And by the said Act now in recital it is also enacted, that, after the passing thereof, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by any Order in Council,

to permit and authorize ships and vessels, not exceeding the burthen of sixty tons, and not having a British register, to be piloted and conducted without having a duly licenced pilot on board, upon the same terms and conditions as are, by the said Act, imposed on British ships and vessels not exceeding the like burthen:

And by the said Act now in recital it is likewise enacted, that nothing therein contained shall extend to the taking away, abridging, defeating, or interrupting of any grants, liberties, franchises, or privileges heretofore granted by any charters or Acts of Parliament to the pilots of the Trinity-house of the town of Kingston-upon-Hull, or the Trinity-house of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, or to alter or repeal any provisions contained in any Act of Parliament relating to the pilots of any ports or districts in relation to which particular provision shall have been made in any Act of Parliament as to the pilots or pilotage, or to the pilotage within the limits prescribed by any Act of Parliament relating to pilotage for such ports, or to the burthen of vessels navigating to or from such ports:

And whereas Her Majesty is desirous of confirming the exemption so granted as aforesaid to the vessels of the countries and places heretofore mentioned, and of placing such vessels as are hereinafter described, being under sixty tons burthen, upon the same footing, with regard to exemption from pilotage, as vessels of like burthen having a British register, and for that purpose to exercise the powers so vested in Her as hereinbefore is mentioned, in manner hereinafter exercises the powers are the pressed:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Acts respectively, and of every other power authorizing Her Majesty in that behalf, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the date of this Order, as respects the ports and places following, namely,

The port of Kingston-upon-Hull,

The port of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, and the ports or places being members thereof, respectively, and all other ports and places in respect of which the power vested in Her Majesty by virtue of the said recited Act, of the fourth year of the reign of His said late Majesty King George the · Fourth, is still subsisting, all such vessels as are described in the schedule to this Order annexed. being of less burthen than sixty tons, which shall enter into or clear out from any of the said ports or places, shall be, and they are hereby, exempted from taking on board a pilot to conduct them into or from any such port or place, in all cases where British vessels, being of less burthen than sixty tons, are not required by law to take pilots, any law, custom, or usage to the contrary notwithstanding:

after the date of this Order, as respects all other ports and places in the United Kingdom, all such vessels as are described in the schedule to this Order

annexed, being of less burthen than sixty tons, which shall enter and clear out of any of such ports and places, shall be, and they are hereby, authorized and permitted to be piloted and conducted without having a duly licenced pilot on board, upon the same terms and conditions as by the said recited Act, of the sixth year of the reign of His said late Majesty King George the Fourth, are required upon British ships and vessels not exceeding the like burthen:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions accordingly.

N compliance with the Act of Parliament, 5th and 6th of Victoria, cap. cx, sect. 9, I hereby acknowledge the receipt of the following rotice, from Thomas Gilbertson, of Birkenhead, in the county of Chester, referring to works proposed to be executed by him on the margin of Tranmere-pool.

To the Lords Conservators of the River Mersey, and the Acting Conservator thereof.

You will please to take notice, that Mr. Thomas Gilbertson, of the township of Birkenhead, in the county of Chester, corn merchant, purposes to enclose that portion of the shore lying contiguous to property belonging to him, situate in Birkenhead, on the margin of Tranmerepool, bounded on the north by Abbey-street, on the east by land and shore land belonging to the Corporation of Liverpool, and on the south by the low water gut in Tranmere-pool aforesaid, for the purpose of producing wharfage room and landing accommodation, by constructing a river wall of one hundred and ninety yards and one foot in length (including the opening of the basin next mentioned), and a dry low water bssin, having an entrance from Tranmore pool of twenty-six feet wide, and being in width within the entrance fiftyfive feet, and in length one hundred and five yards from the face of the said river wall; the general design and intention of which will be understood by reference to the accompanying plan and sec-The river wall will be carried in rectilinear directions, E.N.E. and W.S.W. respectively, forming an obtuse angle at the approach to the dry basin, which lies due north and south; the average height of the low water gut above the Old Dock Sill, Liverpool, is six feet two inches; it is, therefore, intended, with a view to obtain six feet water at a twelve feet tide, to open out and excavate from the gut to the face of the proposed wall, and for the whole area of the basin, the material that will be required to be removed to give the above-mentioned depth; the river wall and face of basin will be founded upon the rock Sandstone, with the exception of a short length of about fifty lineal yards, for which a good firm stiff clay bottom can be obtained. The walls are proposed to be built of sandstone rabble, set flush in good Aberthaw lime, backed with clay puddle, and supported by the filling from the shore.

Advantage will be taken of the rock face opened out by the excavation to step the masonry upon. The whole surface of the wharf will be paved with square sets or boldres, as may hereafter be deemed expedient. With regard to the interruption of the tidal waters, it has been ascertained that an increased capacity, amounting to 133,887 cubic feet, during a twenty-one foot tide, will be given by taking a credit for the increased volume

due to the excavation on the shore and in the basin—thus,

Hope Assurance Company.

HEREAS upwards of three-fourths of all the Directors of the said Company have, by writing under their hands and seals, dated the 19th day of January 1844, agreed to rescind and revoke and to alter, respectively, in manner hereinafter mentioned, such of the existing laws, rules, and regulations of the said Company relating to the said Company generally as are hereinafter in that behalf mentioned (that is to say):

To rescind and revoke the law, rule, or regulation contained in the 129th clause of the deed of settlement of the Company.

To alter the laws, rules, or regulations contained in the 5th, 7th, 8th, 25th, 26th, 31st, 32d, 36th, 37th, 38th, 39th, 44th, 52d, 121st, 122d, 123d, 124th, 125th, 126th, 127th, 128th, 132d, and 135th clauses of the said deed of settlement, so that such clauses shall, respectively, stand and be as follows (that is to say):

Clause 5.—That the Proprietors of the Company holding shares, whether partly in both the Fire and Life Assurance Departments, or wholly in either, shall assemble together, not oftener than once in every year, for the election of new Directors and Auditors, when necessary, as hereinafter is provided; and that the Proprietors of the said Company, holding shares in the Fire Assurance Department, shall assemble together once in every year at least for the transaction of business relating to the Fire Department; and that the Proprietors of the said Company, holding shares in the Life Assurance Department, shall assemble together once in every year at least, for the transaction of business relating to the Life Assurance Department; and that other General Meetings of such Proprietors, respectively, shall be also held at such other times as they shall be duly convened in manner hereinafter also mentioned.

Clause 7.—That the Yearly General Court of the Members of both Departments of the said Company, for the election of Directors and Auditors when necessary, shall be held on the 25th day of March, or within fifteen days afterwards; and that the Yearly General Court for the Fire Assurance Department shall be held on the second Friday in the month of May in every

year; or within lifteen days afterwards; and the Yearly General Court for the Life Assurance Department shall be held on the second Friday in the month of November in every year, or within fifteen days afterwards; and such Yearly General Courts shall be convened by the Court of Directors in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

Clause 8.—That the business of any such Yearly General Court shall not commence until a majority of the Directors, for the time being, shall have assembled, and be present at the meeting.

Clause 25.—That at every Yearly General Court, to be holden when necessary by the Proprietors of both Departments, on the said 25th day of March, or within fifteen days afterwards as aforesaid, there shall be chosen as many new Directors, and as many new Auditors, respectively, as shall at such Court go out of office by rotation.

Clause 26.—That in the event of the death, resignation, or removal of any Director, if the surviving or continuing Directors shall be fewer in number than six, but not otherwise; and in the event of the death, resignation, or removal of any Auditor, if there shall not be more than one surviving or continuing Auditor, but not otherwise, notice of an Extraordinary General Court of both Departments of the Company shall, within fourteen days after the happening of such event, or after the same shall come to the knowledge of the Court of Directors, be given in manner hereinafter provided for the calling of an Extraordinary General Court for the purpose of electing some other qualified Proprietor in his stead.

Clause 31.—That four-fifths of the Members present at two successive Extraordinary General Courts for both Departments, specially called for the purpose, and consisting of at least fifty qualified Members, shall have full power to make any new laws, regulations, or provisions for the government or management of the Company.

Clause 32.—That four-fifths of the Members present at two successive Extraordinary General Courts for either of the said Departments, specially called for that purpose, and consisting of at least fifty qualified Members, shall have full power to make any new laws, regulations, or provisions for the government of management of that Department.

Clause 36.—That the Directors shall meet together at the house or office of the Company, at such times as they shall be duly convened in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

Clause 37.—That any two of the Directors may require the Secretary of the Company to call a Court of Directors, who shall accordingly call the same, by sending to each of the other Directors a circular letter, signed by him, mentioning the day and hour of the meeting.

Clauses 38 and 39.—That no business shall be transacted at any Court of Directors, unless apwards of one-third of the whole number of Directors be present at the commencement of the business, nor shall any decision take place upon the whole or part of the business of the meeting, unless upwards of one-third of the whole number of Directors be then present.

Clauses 44 and 132.—That a majority of the Directors shall always attend and be present at every Yearly General Court.

Clause 52.—That when and so often as there shall be a vacancy by removal, death, or resignation, or any other means, except that of going out of office by rotation in the office of Director, whereby the number of Directors shall be reduced to less than six, or in the office of Auditor, whereby the number of Auditors shall be reduced to less than two, the Court of Directors shall, within the space of one calendar month next after the happening of such event, or after they shall have received satisfactory evidence thereof, give notice of an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Proprietors, for the purpose of electing a Director or Auditor in the place of the person occasioning the vacancy.

Clause 121.—That the Directors of the Company shall never consist of more than fifteen, or less than six, including the Chairman and Deputy Chairman of the Company.

Clause 122.—That at every Yearly General Court to be held, when necessary, on the 25th day of March, or within fifteen days afterwards as aforesaid, the Directors or Director (if any) who shall have been in office two years and eleven months, or upwards, from the time of their or his last election, shall go out by rotation.

Clause 123.—That no person shall be capable of being elected a Director of the Company, unless at the time of his election he shall be a holder of one hundred shares at least in his own right in the capital of the Life Assurance Department of the Company, and shall not hold any office in any other Fire or Life Assurance Company; and if after his election he shall, at any time, cease to hold one hundred such shares at least in his own right in such Department, or shall accept any office in any other Fire or Life Assurance Company, then, and in any such case, his office of Director shall become vacant, and shall be so declared vacant by the Court of Directors.

Clause 124.—That if any Director or Auditor of the Company shall, during the time he shall be such Director or Auditor, be declared bankrupt, or shall take the benefit of any Act or Acts of Parliament, passed or to be passed for the relief of insolvent debtors, or shall compound with his creditors, then, and in any such case, he shall forthwith cease to be a Director or Auditor of the Company, and his office shall, ipso facto, become vacant, and shall be so declared vacant, by the Court of Directors.

Clause 125.—That the Auditors of the Company | and revoked and altered, respectively, and of apshall never consist of more than five, nor less than two.

Clause 126.— -That at every Yearly General Court to be held, when necessary, on the 25th day of March, or within fifteen days afterwards as aforesaid, the Auditors or Auditor (if any) who shall have been in office two years and eleven months, or upwards, from the time of their or his last election, shall go out of office by rotation.

Clause 127.—That no person shall hereafter be capable of being elected an Auditor of the Company unless, at the time of his election, he shall be a holder of forty shares at least in his own right in the Life Assurance Department of the Company, and shall not hold any office in any other Fire or Life Assurance Company; and if after his election he shall, at any time, cease to hold forty such shares at least in his own right in such Department, or shall accept any office in any other Fire or Life Assurance Company, then, and in any such case, his office of Auditor shall become vacant, and shall be so declared vacant by the Court of Directors.

Clause 128.—That the respective reports to be prepared, in pursuance of the directions hereinbefore contained, by the Court of Directors, previously to the holding of such respective Yearly General Courts for the said Fire and Life Departments in every year as aforesaid, shall be audited by at least two of the Auditors for the time being of the Company; and in order thereto the said Auditors shall, with the assistance of the Actuary, Secretary, and Clerks of the Company, examine such reports with all the books, papers, and vouchers of the Company, which they shall think necessary to inspect for that purpose; and, after a careful examination of such reports with such books, papers, and vouchers, and correcting or altering the same, if necessary, the said Auditors shall, previously to the day on which the Yearly General Meetings are to be held, at which such reports must, respectively, be produced, sign their names at the foot thereof, in testimony of their approbation of the same.

Clause 135.—That there shall be not less than three or more than five Trustees of the Company, who shall be chosen by the Directors by ballot from among themselves, and shall be removable by the Court of Directors at pleasure.

*HEREAS upwards of three-fourths of all the Directors of the said Company have, by writing under their hands and seals, dated the 19th day of January 1844, agreed to rescind and revoke such of the existing laws, rules, and regulations of the said Company relating to the Life Assurance Department thereof as are hereinafter in that behalf mentioned; and to add such new laws, rules, regulations, clauses, or provisoes as are hereinafter in that behalf mentioned to the existing laws, rules, and regulations of the said Company relating to the Life Assurance Depart $ment\ thereof\ (that\ is\ to\ say)$:

To rescind and revoke the laws, rules, or regulations contained in the 87th, 111th, 143d, and 144th clauses of the deed of settlement of the Company.

To add the following new laws, rules, regulations, clauses, or provisions to the existing laws, rules, and regulations of the Company (that is to

1st.—That the Court of Directors may effect reassurances of all or any of the policies of life assurance effected with the Company, by effecting policies of assurance upon the life or lives thereby assured with any other company or companies for the assurance of lives, to be approved of by the Court of Directors, such re-assurance to be effected at such rates and on such terms as the Court of Directors shall think proper; and the Court of Directors may afterwards surrender such policies of re-assurance, or any of them, to the company or companies with whom the same shall be effected, for such consideration and upon such terms as the Court of Directors shall think proper.
