The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

THEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with "certain modifications, the fourth report of the "Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and "Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act ' to explain and amend two several Acts relating " to explain and amend two several Acts relating " to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for Eng-" land;" and of another Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, initialed "An Act for " regulating the cathedral churches of Wales," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twelfth day of December one thousand eight hundred and of December one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and session of Parliament neighbor the time time and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with cer-"tain modifications, the fourth report of the "Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and "Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act " to explain and amend two several Acts re-" lating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for " England," and of another Act, passed in the half-yearly payments being made on the first day

last session of Parliament, intituled " An Act for " regulating the cathedral churches of Wales," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for endowing the Deanery of the cathedral church of Llandaff.

"Whereas by an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the tenth day of November last, ratifying a scheme prepared by us under the provisions of the last-recited Act, the deanery of the cathedral church of Llandaff was separated from the archdeaconry of Llandaff, and the Archdeacon of Llandaff has thereby ceased to be the Head of the Chapter of the said cathedral church, and a Dean was appointed to the said deanery on the twenty-ninth day of November last: "And whereas it is by the said secondly and

lastly recited Acts, amongst other things, provided, that, so soon as conveniently may be, the income of the Dean of the said cathedral church of Llandaff may be augmented so that such Dean shall have an average annual income of seven hundred pounds; and it is by the said lastly-recited Act enacted, that such augmentation may be made out of the common fund in the said secondlyrecited Act mentioned :

" And whereas the only income accruing to the said Dean of Llandaff would be a small and uncertain share of the corporate revenues of the said Chapter payable to him as the Head thereof :

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that the said deanery shall be endowed by augmentation out of the common fund in the said hereinbefore-recited Acts mentioned; and that there shall be paid by us to the Dean of Llandaff, for the time being, the annual sum of seven hundred pounds, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of February and the first day of August in every year; a proportional part of the first of such
