THE following is a copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, assigning chapelry districts; under the 16th section of the 59th Geo. 3, cap. 134, to the churches or chapels of St. Paul, St. Peter, St. James, St. George, and the Holy Trinity, all in the parish of Preston, in the county of Lancaster:

At the Court at Windsor, the 2d of October 1843, present, the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His late Majesty King

George the Third, intituled "An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "that in every case in which the Commissioners appointed for carrying into execution the purposes of the said Act shall be of opinion that it will be expedient to divide any parish into two or more distinct and separate parishes, for all ecclesiastical purposes whatever, it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese in which such parish is locally situated, signified under his hand and seal, to apply to the patron or patrons of the church of such parish for his consent to make such division, and for such patron or patrons to signify his or their consent thereto under his hand and seal; and the said Commissioners shall, upon the consent of the said patron or patrons so signified, represent the whole matter to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which it is proposed, with such consent as aforesaid, to divide such parish, together with the relative and respective proportions of glebe land, tithes, moduses, or other endowments which will by such division arise and accrue, and remain and be, within each of such respective divisions, and also the relative proportions of the estimated amount of the value or produce of fees, oblations, offerings, or other ecclesiastical dues or profits which may arise and accrue within each of such respective divisions; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division; provided always, that no such division of any parish into distinct parishes shall completely take effect until after the death, resignation, or other avoidance of the existing incumbent of the parish to be divided;" and it is by the 21st section of the said Act further enacted, "that in any case in which the said Commissioners shall be of opinion that it is not expedient to divide any populous parish, or extra parochial place, into such complete, separate, and distinct parishes as aforesaid, but that it is expedient to divide the same into such ecclesiastical districts as they, with the consent of the bishop, signified under his hand and seal, may deem necessary for the purpose of affording accommodation for the attending divine service, according to the rites of the United Church of England and Ireland, to persons residing therein, in the churches and parochial chapels already built, or in additional churches or chapels to be built therein, and as may appear to such Commissioners to be convenient for the enabling the spiritual person or persons who may serve such churches or chapels to perform all ecclesiastical duties within the districts attached to such respective churches and chapels, and for the due ecclesiastical superintendence of such district, and the preservation and improvement of the religious and moral habits of the persons residing therein, the said Commissioners shall represent such opinion to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which such districts are proposed to be described; and if, thereupon, His

Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division :”

And whereas by an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled “An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes,” it is, amongst other things, enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, in the same manner and with the like consents as are required in case of division into ecclesiastical districts under the said recited Act, or this Act, to assign a particular district to any chapel of ease or parochial chapel already existing, or to any chapel built, or which may hereafter be built or acquired under the powers of the said Act, or this Act; and such district shall be under the immediate care of the curate appointed to serve such chapel, but subject, nevertheless, to the superintendence and controul of the incumbent of the parish church; and all such curates shall be nominated by the incumbent of the parish to the bishop for his licence, except where the right of nomination shall already be legally vested in any other person or persons, and in every such case by the person or persons possessing such right of nomination, subject to all the laws in force relating to stipendiary curates, except as to the assigning of salaries to such curates; provided always, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, to determine whether any and what part or proportion of the fees or dues for marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials shall be assigned to any such curate; and whether banns of marriage shall be published, and marriages or baptisms, churchings or burials, shall be solemnized or performed in any such chapel or not; and in any case in which marriages shall be allowed in any such chapel, the Commissioners shall cause the boundaries of the district assigned to such chapel to be enrolled in the High Court of Chancery, and in the office of the Registry of the diocese, any thing in the said recited Act to the contrary notwithstanding; and no such chapelry shall become a benefice by reason of any augmentation of the maintenance of the curate, by any grant or bounty under the provision of any Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, for augmenting small livings, any thing in such Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, to the contrary notwithstanding :”

And whereas by another Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled “An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;” and by another Act, made and passed in the first and second years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled “An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled ‘An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of ad-

ditional churches in populous parishes;” and also by another Act, made and passed in the second and third years of His said late Majesty, intituled “An Act to render more effectual an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled ‘An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;’” further provisions are made for carrying such divisions into effect :

And whereas the said Commissioners have made a representation to Her Majesty in Council, bearing date the twentieth day of September one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, in the words following, viz.

“Your Majesty’s Commissioners for building new churches, appointed by virtue of an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled “An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;” continued by an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled “An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;” and further continued by an Act, passed in the first year of your Majesty’s reign, intituled “An Act to prolong, for ten years, Her Majesty’s Commission for building new churches;” beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, when the last census was taken, the parish of Preston, in the county of Lancaster and diocese of Chester, contained a population of about fifty thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine persons :

“And that, besides the parish church, which affords accommodation to one thousand six hundred and seventy persons, there are eleven consecrated churches or chapels in the said parish, five of which, namely, St. Paul, St. Peter, St. James, St. George, and Trinity, afford the accommodation following, that is to say; St. Paul’s Chapel, built by your Majesty’s said Commissioners, affords accommodation to one thousand two hundred and fifty-nine persons, including eight hundred and thirteen free seats appropriated to the use of the poor; St. Peter’s Chapel, also built by your Majesty’s said Commissioners, affords accommodation to one thousand two hundred and fifty persons, including eight hundred and sixty-one free seats appropriated to the use of the poor; St. James’s Chapel affords accommodation to nine hundred and eighty persons, including five hundred and fifty-four free seats appropriated to the use of the poor; St. George’s Chapel affords accommodation to nine hundred persons, including one hundred free seats appropriated to the use of the poor; and Trinity Chapel affords accommodation to one thousand two hundred and fifty persons, including three hundred and fifty free seats appropriated to the use of the poor; and that divine service is regularly performed in the said chapels :

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave, further, to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending this parish, it appears to them to be expedient, that particular districts should be assigned to the said five last-mentioned chapels, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intitled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and that such districts should be named, respectively, "The Chapelry District of St. Paul, Preston;" "The Chapelry District of St. Peter, Preston;" "The Chapelry District of St. James, Preston;" "The Chapelry District of St. George, Preston;" and "The Chapelry District of Holy Trinity, Preston," with boundaries as follow :

Saint Paul's District.

"The boundary commences in the middle of Duke-street East, opposite the south end of Horrock's eastern boundary wall, and proceeds westward along the middle of Duke-street East, to the east end of Queen-street; from thence in a northwardly direction along the east end of premises at the east end of Queen-street and Queen-street-court, to the northeastern boundary of premises adjoining Queen-street-court; from thence westward along the north boundary of premises on the north side of Queen-street and Queen-street-court, to the middle of Grimshaw-street; it then proceeds north westward along the middle of Grimshaw-street, to the middle of Church-street, opposite the middle of Derby-street, along the middle of Derby-street, to the middle of Lord's-walk; from thence in a westerly direction along the middle of Lord's-walk and Lord-street, to opposite the middle of Lancaster-street; from thence in a northerly direction along the middle of Lancaster-street, to the turn in the Ormskirk-road; from whence it continues in the same northerly direction across High-street, along the middle of Lancaster-road, to the middle of Upper Walker-street, and along the middle of that street, in an easterly direction, to Park-lane; from thence along the middle of Meadow-street, to opposite the western boundary of the premises of Saint Ignatius; it then proceeds in a northerly direction along the western boundary of the premises of Saint Ignatius, and in a line in continuation therewith, to the middle of Sedgwick-street; from thence in an eastwardly direction, along the middle of Sedgwick-street, to opposite the eastern boundary of Park-lane-mill; and from thence in a northwardly direction along the east end of Park-lane-mill; and from thence in a straight line northward, to the foot-path at the east end of Brunswick-place-mill; and from thence northward along that foot-path to the south side of Moor-park; and from thence in a straight line northward, across the Moor-park, to the boundary of Preston and Fulwood townships, at a point seven hundred yards east of the Garstang and Preston turnpike-road; it then proceeds in an

easterly direction along the boundary of Preston and Fulwood townships, to the boundary of Ribbleton township; from thence southward, along the boundary of Preston and Ribbleton townships, to the middle of Ribbleton-lane; from thence westward, along the middle of Ribbleton-lane, to the House of Correction gates; from thence to the east end of Golden-square; and from thence south eastward, along Horrock's eastern boundary wall, to the middle of Duke-street East, where the boundary commences, as shewn by the map, and thereon coloured blue :

Saint Peter's District.

"The boundary commences opposite the middle of Bridge-street, in the middle of Friargate, and proceeds in a north westerly direction along the middle of Friargate to Moor-lane; along the middle of Moor-lane to Harrington-street; and along the middle of Moor-hall-street; from Harrington-street northward, as far as the same is continued; and northward from thence, to the boundary of Preston and Fulwood townships, at a point three hundred yards west from the Garstang and Preston turnpike road; and from that point proceeds westward along the said boundary, to the boundary of Ashton township; and from thence southward, and along the boundary between the township of Preston and Ashton, to the Wyre Railway; and from thence, along the middle of the Wyre Railway, to the southern boundary of the railway station, adjoining Leighton-street; and from thence eastward, along a straight line to the middle of the canal, opposite the canal factory dock; from thence southward, along the middle of the canal, to the middle of Bridge-street; and from thence eastward, along the middle of Bridge-street, to the middle of Friargate, where the boundary commenced, as shewn by the map, and thereon coloured red :

Saint James's District.

"The boundary commences in the middle of Avenham-lane, opposite the middle of Frenchwood-street, and proceeds in a south eastwardly direction along the middle of Frenchwood-street, and in a direct line in continuation of the centre line of Frenchwood-street to Swillbrook; and along that brook, in a north easterly direction, to the fish ponds at Lark-hill; and along the south side of the ponds, to a line drawn in continuation with the western boundary of Brewery-field; it then proceeds in a northerly direction to the middle of the eastern end of Queen-street; from thence, in a northwardly direction, along the eastern boundary of the premises at the east end of Queen-street and Queen-street-court, to the north eastern boundary of the premises adjoining Queen-street-court; from thence westward, along the northern boundary of the premises on the north side of Queen-street and Queen-street-court, to the middle of Grimshaw-street; from thence northward, along the middle of Grimshaw-street, to opposite the middle of Back Grimshaw-street; from thence in a south westerly direction, along the middle of back Grimshaw-street, to the middle of Water-street; from

thence southward, along the middle of Shepherd-street, to Syke-hill, and proceeds along the middle of Syke-hill and Avenham-lane (including all the houses on the east and south sides thereof), to opposite the end of Frenchwood-street, where the boundary commenced, as shewn by the map, and thereon coloured green :

Saint George's District.

"The boundary commences in the middle of Fishergate, opposite the middle of Cheapside, and extending along the middle of Cheapside, north westward, down the middle of Friargate, to opposite the middle of Bridge-street; westward, down the middle of Bridge-street, to the middle of the canal; from thence southward, along the middle of the canal, to opposite the dry dock and the canal branch; from thence, in a south westerly direction, to the middle of the railway at the back of the houses on the south side of Dock-street; and from thence southward, along the middle of the railway, to the middle of Fishergate; and from thence eastward, along the middle of Fishergate, to opposite the middle of Cheapside, where the boundary commenced, as shewn by the map, and thereon coloured brown :

"That baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in all the above-mentioned chapels; and that the fees arising therefrom should be received by and belong to the respective Ministers of the said chapels :

"That the consent of the Lord Bishop of Chester has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third; in testimony whereof, the said Lord Bishop has signed and sealed this present instrument :

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, beg leave to lay before your Majesty the before-mentioned circumstances, and humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made, and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the solemnization of churchings, baptisms, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.
