The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levees at St. James's-Palace, are requested to bring with them two cards, with their names thereon written, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance in the Presence-chamber, and the other to be delivered to the Lord in Waiting, who will announce the name to Her Majesty.

Those Gentlemen who are to be presented are hereby informed, it is absolutely necessary that their names, with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to present them (not the Lord in Waiting), should be sent to the Lord Chamberlain's-Office, before twelve o'clock, on the Monday previous to each Levee, in

order that they may be submitted for the Queen's approbation; it being Her Majesty's command, that no presentation shall hereafter be made at the Levees, but in conformity with the above regulations; and further, that no person shall be admitted, on any pretence whatever, who has not been so presented.

It is particularly requested, that Gentlemen, who are to be presented at the Levees, will have their names *distinctly* written upon the card to be delivered to the Lord in Waiting, in order that there may be no mistake in announcing them to the Queen.

The state apartments will not be open for the reception of Company coming to Court, until half past one o'clock.

NOTICE is hereby given, that all persons, having Petitions or Addresses to present to Her Majesty at the Levees, are to write on two cards, with their names, a statement of the object of such Petitions or Addresses, and of the persons from whom they come; one card to be delivered to the Page in the Ante-room, and the other to the Lord in Waiting, who will read its contents, at

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act to regulate the trade of the British possessions abroad," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that no goods should be imported into, nor should any goods, except the produce of the fisheries in British ships, be exported from any of the British possessions in America by sea, from or to any place other than the United Kingdom, or some other of such possessions, except into or from the several ports in such possessions called free ports, enumerated in the table therein following :

And whereas it is by the said Act provided, that, if His Majesty shall deem it expedient to extend the provisions of the said Act to any port or ports not enumerated in the said table, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, to extend the provisions of the said Act to such port or ports; and, from and after the day mentioned in such Order, all the privileges and advantages of the said Act, and all the provisions, penalties, and forfeitures therein contained, shall extend, and be deemed and construed to extend, to any such port or ports, respectively, as fully as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in the said table at the time of passing the said Act :

And whereas Her Majesty doth now deem it expedient to extend, in manner hereinafter-mentioned, the provisions of the said Act to the port of New Edinburgh, in St. Mary's Bay, in the province of Nova Scotia :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and by virtue and

in exercise of the powers in Her in that behalf vested by the said recited Act, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the first day of May next, the port of New Edinburgh, in St. Mary's Bay, shall be a free port; and all the privileges and advantages by the said recited Act conferred upon the free ports therein-mentioned, and all provisions, penalties, and forfeitures therein contained, subject to the limitations and restrictions therein provided, shall extend, and be deemed and construed to extend, to the said port of New Edinburgh, as fully and effectually as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in the said table of free ports at the time of the passing of the said recited Act:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Honourable Lord Stanley, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England;" and of another Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act for regulating the cathedral churches of Wales," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twelfth day of December one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the

session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England;" and of another Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act for regulating the cathedral churches of Wales," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for endowing the Deanery of the cathedral church of Llandaff.

"Whereas by an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the tenth day of November last, ratifying a scheme prepared by us under the provisions of the last-recited Act, the deanery of the cathedral church of Llandaff was separated from the archdeaconry of Llandaff, and the Archdeacon of Llandaff has thereby ceased to be the Head of the Chapter of the said cathedral church, and a Dean was appointed to the said deanery on the twenty-ninth day of November last:

"And whereas it is by the said secondly and lastly recited Acts, amongst other things, provided, that, so soon as conveniently may be, the income of the Dean of the said cathedral church of Llandaff may be augmented so that such Dean shall have an average annual income of seven hundred pounds; and it is by the said lastly-recited Act enacted, that such augmentation may be made out of the common fund in the said secondly-recited Act mentioned:

"And whereas the only income accruing to the said Dean of Llandaff would be a small and uncertain share of the corporate revenues of the said Chapter payable to him as the Head thereof:

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that the said deanery shall be endowed by augmentation out of the common fund in the said hereinbefore-recited Acts mentioned; and that there shall be paid by us to the Dean of Llandaff, for the time being, the annual sum of seven hundred pounds, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of February and the first day of August in every year; a proportional part of the first of such half-yearly payments being made on the first day of February next from the date of the appointment of the Dean as aforesaid; and that whenever a vacancy in the said deanery shall happen on any other day than the first day of February or the first day of August, the then next half-yearly payment shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the Dean causing the vacancy, or his representatives, and the Dean succeeding to the deanery so becoming vacant.

"And we further recommend and propose, that, until a permanent house of residence shall be provided for the Dean of Llandaff, there shall also be paid by us to such Dean, for the time being, in like manner and by like half-yearly payments, and subject to the like apportionment, the further annual sum of seventy pounds; provided always, and we further recommend and propose, that the Dean of the said church shall not at any time receive any other emoluments as such Dean, or as Head of such Chapter, out of the revenues of the said church; but that the Treasurer, or other

proper officer for the time being of the said church, shall, from time to time, pay over to us all profits and emoluments, whether consisting of, or arising from, rents, fines, compositions, dividends, stipends, or otherwise howsoever to which the said Dean of Llandaff, for the time being, as such Dean, or as the Head of the Chapter of Llandaff, or to which any Archdeacon of Llandaff, not being also Dean, would have been entitled if this provision had not been made.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing other measures touching the matters aforesaid, in conformity with the provisions of the above recited Acts, or any of them.”

And whereas notice of the said scheme has been duly given, and no objection has been made thereto :

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council ; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Llandaff.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled “ An Act for carrying into effect the reports of the Commissioners appointed to consider the state of the Established Church in England and Wales, with reference to ecclesiastical duties and revenues, so far as they relate to episcopal dioceses, revenues, and patronage;” and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled “ An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;” duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the ninth day of January one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled “ An Act for carrying into effect the reports of the Commissioners appointed to consider the state of the Established Church in England and Wales, with reference to ecclesiastical duties and revenues, so far as they relate to episcopal dioceses, revenues, and patronage;” and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled “ An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;” have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for founding a new archdeaconry of Monmouth, in the diocese of Llandaff, and for providing a temporary endowment for the said archdeaconry, and also for the archdeaconry of Llandaff.

“ Whereas, by the first-recited Act, power is given to place the whole county of Monmouth, in the diocese of Llandaff (subject to such modifications as shall be deemed necessary), and to found a new archdeaconry in the said diocese, to be called the archdeaconry of Monmouth, and to vest the patronage of such archdeaconry in the bishop of the diocese, and newly to arrange the limits of deanries and archdeaconries, so that every parish and extra-parochial place may be within a deanry, and every deanry within an archdeaconry; and it is by the same Act enacted, that all archdeacons throughout England and Wales shall have and exercise full and equal jurisdiction within their respective archdeaconries, any usage to the contrary notwithstanding; and it is by the same Act provided, that none of the proposed alterations affecting the boundaries or jurisdiction of any diocese, the bishop of which was in possession on the fourth day of March one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, should take effect until the avoidance of the see of such bishop, without his consent :

“ And whereas since the passing of the same Act, the sees of Hereford and St. David's have both been vacant :

“ And whereas it is by the secondly-recited Act enacted, that, subject to the consent of the bishop, any archdeaconry may be endowed, amongst other modes of endowment, by augmentation out of the common fund in the said Act mentioned; provided that such augmentation shall not raise the average annual income of any archdeaconry to an amount exceeding two hundred pounds; and it is also provided, that no archdeacon shall be entitled to hold such endowment unless he shall be resident for the space of eight months in every year within the diocese in which his archdeaconry is situate, or as to any then archdeacon, within the diocese in which his archdeaconry was situate before the passing of the first-recited Act, but subject to the same provisions, as to licences for non-residence

which are enacted with respect to incumbents of benefices by an Act relating to pluralities and the residence of the clergy, passed in the second year of your Majesty's reign :

" And whereas it is by the same Act further enacted, that, upon any such endowment, all lands, tithes, and other hereditaments, except any right of patronage, belonging to such archdeaconry at the time of such endowment, may, with the like consent, and with the consent of any archdeacon in possession at the time of the passing of the same Act, be vested in us for the purposes of such Act :

We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Bishop of Llandaff, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that such parts of the deanry of Irchinfield, in the diocese and archdeaconry of Hereford, as are situate in the county of Monmouth (except so much of the said deanry of Irchinfield and county of Monmouth as in no part of the boundary thereof touches upon any part of the existing boundary line of the said diocese of Llandaff), and so much of the second part of the deanry of Brecon, in the diocese of Saint David's and archdeaconry of Brecon, as is also situate within the said county of Monmouth, shall be dis severed from the said dioceses of Hereford and Saint David's, respectively, and shall be and become permanently annexed and united to, and included in and form part of, the said diocese of Llandaff; and that the said first-described portion of the said county of Monmouth shall be within the deanry of Uske, and the said secondly-described portion of the said county shall be within the deanry of Abergavenny; and that all parishes and places, churches and chapels, within the limits of the said firstly and secondly described parts of the said county of Monmouth, and the rural deans, clergy, and others within the same, shall be exempted and released from the jurisdiction, authority, and control of the bishops of Hereford and Saint David's, respectively, and shall be under and subject to the jurisdiction, authority, and control of the Bishop of Llandaff for the time being.

And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be founded, in the said diocese of Llandaff, a new archdeaconry, and that the same shall be called and styled the Archdeaconry of Monmouth, and that the said archdeaconry shall consist of and contain the whole county of Monmouth (except such excepted part as aforesaid of the said deanry of Irchinfield), and that all rural deanries, parishes and places, churches and chapels, and the whole clergy and others within the same county (except as hereinbefore excepted), shall be released and discharged from all jurisdiction of the present and all future Archdeacons of Llandaff, Hereford, and Brecon, respectively, and shall be under and subject to the jurisdiction, authority, and control of the Archdeacon of Monmouth for the time being.

And we further recommend and propose, that the said Edward Bishop of Llandaff may and shall forthwith collate some fit and proper person to

the dignity and office of archdeacon of the said archdeaconry of Monmouth, and that the patronage of and right of collating to the said archdeaconry shall be vested in the said Bishop of Llandaff and his successors, bishops of Llandaff, for ever.

And whereas the Reverend Thomas Williams, M.A. was instituted Archdeacon of Llandaff on the twenty-fourth day of November one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, and is now such archdeacon.

We further recommend and propose, that, until arrangements shall be recommended and proposed by us, and ratified by your Majesty in Council, under the provisions of an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled " An Act for " regulating the cathedral churches of Wales," for permanently annexing canonries residentiary in the cathedral church of Llandaff to the said archdeaconries of Llandaff and Monmouth, respectively, and for duly endowing such canonries, the said Archdeaconries of Llandaff and Monmouth shall be endowed by augmentation out of the common fund in the secondly-recited Act mentioned, with such sums, respectively, as, together with the fees and other emoluments which, upon due inquiry, we have satisfied ourselves will be receivable by them, will raise their average annual incomes, respectively, to the said amount of two hundred pounds; and that accordingly there shall be paid by us, on the first day of January in every year, out of the monies from time to time carried over to such common fund, to the said Venerable Thomas Williams, and his successors, Archdeacons of Llandaff, the annual sum of one hundred and seventy pounds; and to the Archdeacon of Monmouth, for the time being, the annual sum of one hundred and sixty pounds; so long as such archdeacons and their successors, respectively, shall duly reside within the said diocese, according to the provisions of the said secondly-recited Act; and such annual sums, respectively, shall be paid on production to us of a certificate, under the hand of the bishop of the diocese for the time being, that such archdeacon of Llandaff or of Monmouth, as the case may be, has duly resided during the preceding year; and that a proportionate part of the said sum of one hundred and seventy pounds, from the day of the date of his appointment to the first day of January last, shall be forthwith paid to the said Archdeacon of Llandaff; and that on the first day of January next a proportionate part of the said sum of one hundred and sixty pounds shall be paid to the Archdeacon of Monmouth, from the day of his appointment to the said last-mentioned day; and that whenever a vacancy in either of the said archdeaconries shall happen on any other day than the first day of January, the next yearly payment shall be duly apportioned and paid between the archdeacon making the vacancy, or his representatives, and the archdeacon succeeding to the said archdeaconry.

" And we further recommend and propose, that all lands, tithes, tenements, and heredita-

ments, at any time heretofore annexed to and now forming part of the endowment of the said archdeaconry of Llandaff, shall forthwith be disannexed from the said archdeaconry, and shall become and be absolutely transferred to and vested in us, for the purposes of the said Act.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or any of them.”

And whereas notice of the said scheme has been duly given, and no objection has been made thereto :

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council ; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts ; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the several Registrars of the dioceses of St. David's, Hereford, and Llandaff.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled “ An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;” and of another Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled “ An Act for regulating the cathedral churches of Wales,” duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the ninth day of January one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words and figures following, that is to say :

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled “ An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, “ the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;” and of another Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled “ An Act for regulating the “ cathedral churches of Wales,” have prepared,

and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for founding a new archdeaconry, to be called the Archdeaconry of Montgomery, in the diocese of Saint Asaph, and for providing a temporary endowment for the said archdeaconry, and also for the archdeaconry of Saint Asaph.

“ Whereas by the first-recited Act it is enacted, that, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, any archdeaconry or rural deanry may, on account of the magnitude thereof, or of any other peculiar circumstance connected therewith, be divided; and also that any archdeaconry may be endowed, amongst other modes, by augmentation out of the common fund in the said Act mentioned, provided that such augmentation shall not raise the average annual income of any archdeaconry to an amount exceeding two hundred pounds; and provided that no archdeacon shall be entitled to hold any endowment or augmentation or other emolument as such archdeacon under the provisions of that Act unless he shall be resident for the space of eight months in every year within the diocese in which his archdeaconry is situate, or, as to any then archdeacon within the diocese in which his archdeaconry was situate before the passing of the Act in the same Act first recited, but subject to the same provisions as to licences for non-residence which are enacted, with respect to incumbents of benefices, by an Act relating to pluralities and the residence of the clergy, passed in the second year of your Majesty's reign :

“ And whereas by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth (being an Act for carrying into effect certain reports of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues), it is enacted, that all archdeacons, throughout England and Wales, shall have and exercise full and equal jurisdiction within their respective archdeaconries, any usage to the contrary notwithstanding :

“ And whereas it is by the secondly-recited Act enacted, that, from and after the passing thereof, the dignity and office of Archdeacon of Saint Asaph should no longer be holden by the Bishop of Saint Asaph, provided that nothing therein contained should affect any lands, tithes, tenements, or other hereditaments or endowments then forming part of the property and revenues of the see of Saint Asaph :

“ And whereas, by reason of the said last-mentioned enactment, no archidiaconal jurisdiction or superintendence is now exercised in or over any part of the diocese and archdeaconry of Saint Asaph; and the said archdeaconry, the endowments whereof are annexed to the see of Saint Asaph, is without any income or other provision whatsoever :

“ And whereas the said archdeaconry of Saint Asaph is now inconveniently large, being co-extensive with the limits of the said diocese :

“ We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend William Bishop of Saint Asaph, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that there shall

be founded, in the said diocese of Saint Asaph, a new archdeaconry, and that the same shall be styled and called the Archdeaconry of Montgomery, and that the said archdeaconry shall be taken out of the said archdeaconry of Saint Asaph, and shall consist of the deaneries of Penllyn and Edeirnon, Pool and Caereinion, Caedewen, and Ceifeiliog and Mowddy, now in the said diocese and archdeaconry of Saint Asaph; and that the said deaneries, and all parishes and places, churches and chapels, and the whole clergy and others your Majesty's subjects within the same, shall be subject to the archidiaconal jurisdiction, authority, and control of the Archdeacon of Montgomery for the time being, and to none other.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that the said William Bishop of Saint Asaph may and shall forthwith collate some fit and proper person to each of the respective dignities or offices of Archdeacon of the archdeaconry of Saint Asaph and Archdeacon of the archdeaconry of Montgomery; and that the right of collating to the said archdeaconries of Saint Asaph and Montgomery shall be vested in the Bishop of Saint Asaph and his successors, Bishops of Saint Asaph, for ever.

“ Whereas it is by the first-recited Act enacted, that, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, any archdeaconry may be endowed, amongst other modes, by augmentation out of the common fund in the said Act mentioned, provided that such augmentation shall not raise the average annual income of any archdeaconry to an amount exceeding two hundred pounds, and provided that no

archdeacon shall be entitled to hold such endowment unless he shall be resident for the space of eight calendar months in every year within the diocese in which his archdeaconry is situate, or as to any then archdeacon within the diocese in which his archdeaconry was situate before the passing of the Act in the same Act first recited, but subject to the same provisions as to licences for non-residence which are enacted, with respect to incumbents of benefices, by an Act relating to pluralities and the residence of the clergy, passed in the second year of your Majesty's reign :

of the Bishop of Bangor for the time being, that such Archdeacon has duly resided during the preceding year, and that a proportionate part of such sum of one hundred and ninety pounds shall be made on the first day of January next following the day of the first appointment of an Archdeacon of Bangor after the date of this scheme; and that whenever a vacancy in the said archdeaconry shall happen on any other day than the first day of January, the then next yearly payment shall be duly apportioned and paid between the archdeacon making the vacancy, or his representatives, and the archdeacon succeeding to the said archdeaconry.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any measure relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or either of them.”

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Bangor.
