

in exercise of the powers in Her in that behalf vested by the said recited Act, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the first day of May next, the port of New Edinburgh, in St. Mary's Bay, shall be a free port; and all the privileges and advantages by the said recited Act conferred upon the free ports therein-mentioned, and all provisions, penalties, and forfeitures therein contained, subject to the limitations and restrictions therein provided, shall extend, and be deemed and construed to extend, to the said port of New Edinburgh, as fully and effectually as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in the said table of free ports at the time of the passing of the said recited Act:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Honourable Lord Stanley, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England;" and of another Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act for regulating the cathedral churches of Wales," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twelfth day of December one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the

session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England;" and of another Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act for regulating the cathedral churches of Wales," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for endowing the Deanery of the cathedral church of Llandaff.

"Whereas by an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the tenth day of November last, ratifying a scheme prepared by us under the provisions of the last-recited Act, the deanery of the cathedral church of Llandaff was separated from the archdeaconry of Llandaff, and the Archdeacon of Llandaff has thereby ceased to be the Head of the Chapter of the said cathedral church, and a Dean was appointed to the said deanery on the twenty-ninth day of November last:

"And whereas it is by the said secondly and lastly recited Acts, amongst other things, provided, that, so soon as conveniently may be, the income of the Dean of the said cathedral church of Llandaff may be augmented so that such Dean shall have an average annual income of seven hundred pounds; and it is by the said lastly-recited Act enacted, that such augmentation may be made out of the common fund in the said secondly-recited Act mentioned:

"And whereas the only income accruing to the said Dean of Llandaff would be a small and uncertain share of the corporate revenues of the said Chapter payable to him as the Head thereof:

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that the said deanery shall be endowed by augmentation out of the common fund in the said hereinbefore-recited Acts mentioned; and that there shall be paid by us to the Dean of Llandaff, for the time being, the annual sum of seven hundred pounds, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of February and the first day of August in every year; a proportional part of the first of such half-yearly payments being made on the first day of February next from the date of the appointment of the Dean as aforesaid; and that whenever a vacancy in the said deanery shall happen on any other day than the first day of February or the first day of August, the then next half-yearly payment shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the Dean causing the vacancy, or his representatives, and the Dean succeeding to the deanery so becoming vacant.

"And we further recommend and propose, that, until a permanent house of residence shall be provided for the Dean of Llandaff, there shall also be paid by us to such Dean, for the time being, in like manner and by like half-yearly payments, and subject to the like apportionment, the further annual sum of seventy pounds; provided always, and we further recommend and propose, that the Dean of the said church shall not at any time receive any other emoluments as such Dean, or as Head of such Chapter, out of the revenues of the said church; but that the Treasurer, or other
