After our hearty Commendations.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fifth and sixth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to amend the laws relating to the Customs," it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, or any three or more of them, by any order under their hands, to declare that a certificate of production shall be required upon the importation of any goods whatever from the British possessions abroad, and other places; and to frame such regulations respecting such certificates as they may think fit; and if any goods, in respect of which such certificates shall have been so required, shall be imported into the United Kingdom without such certificate, the same shall be deemed and taken to be of foreign growth, production, or manufacture:

And whereas we, being three of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the authority vested in us by the said Act, do hereby order, that a certificate of production should be required upon the importation of tin into the United Kingdom, as the produce of, and imported from, the British possessions in India; and that the issuing of such certificate, and the production thereof in the United Kingdom, shall be subject to the same rules and regulations as certificates for sugar, the produce of places within the limits of the East India Company's charter are subject and liable to, under the third and fourth of William Fourth, cap. 59, sect. 83, and the third and fourth of William Fourth, cap. 52, sect. 38:

These are to authorize you to require a certificate of production for all tin imported into the United Kingdom from the British possessions in India, from and after the 1st day of January 1845, in conformity to this order—for which this shall be your warrant.
