The Doge and Senators made low Reverences to the King, who then flood up and took off his Hatt and afterwards put it on again, The Doge likewise put on his Cap, and made his Speech (which was in fubmiffive Terms) covered, the King standing and all the Princes being likewise covered but the four Senators bare; The King answered the Doge very obligingly; And then the Senators made severally their Compliments to his Majesty. .. Aster which the Dogg and Senators were reconducted to the Apartment of Ambassadors, where they were entertained at Dinner and served by the Kings Officers. In the afternoon they had Audience of the Dauphin, Dauphine's, the Duke of Burgundy, the Duke d'Anjou, of the Duke and Dutchels of Or-leans, and the rest of the Royal Family, and in the Evening were brought back to Paris by the Introductor of Ambassadors in the same manner they went. .
