Board of Green Cloth, St. James's-Palace, April 12, 1844.

NoTICE is hereby given, that the carriages coming to Her Majesty's Drawing-Room, on Thursday the 18th of April, are to fall into the line at the top of St. James's-street, come down the left hand side, and enter at the iron gate nearest to the Palace, set down at the Arcade, return by the iron gate nearest to Marlboroughhouse, and pass through Pall-mall into St. James's-square, by George-street. When called, they are to pass from St. James's-square, by Charles-street into Regent-street, Jermyn-street, come down St. James's-street as before, take up, and go away through Pall-mall.

No hackney carriages will be permitted to come within the gates.

For all persons having the privilege of the entrée, tickets will be delivered at the Board of Green Cloth, on Tuesday next, between the hours of eleven and three o'clock; their carriages are to enter the gate at Constitution-hill, proceed down St. James's-park, through Stable-yard, into the Ambassador's-court, set down, and go out into Cleveland-row. The carriages of the Ambassadors, Foreign Ministers, Cabinet Ministers, and Great Officers of State may afterwards wait in the Ambassadors'-court, and those of all other persons having the entrée may wait in Stable-yard or St. James's-park till called; they are then to take up in the same order as they had set down, and pass away up the left hand side of St. James'sstreet.

No carriage will be admitted with company a second time with the same ticket, to prevent which, it must be produced at Constitution-hillgate, and Stable-yard-gate also, where a corner of it will be torn off by the Marshalmen in attendance; and no person can be allowed the privilege of the *entrée* by any other approach to the Palace than the gates last mentioned.

THEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act to "regulate the trade of the British possessions about the trade of the British possessions hat no goods should be imported into, nor should any goods, except the produce of the fisheries in British ships, be exported from any of the British possessions in America by sea, from or to any place other than the United Kingdom, or some other of such possessions, except into or from the several ports in such possessions called free ports, enumerated in the table therein following:

And whereas it is by the said Act provided that, if His Majesty shall deem it expedient to extend the provisions of the said Act to any port or ports not enumerated in the said table, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, to extend the provisions of the said Act to such port or ports; and, from and after the day mentioned in such Order, all the privileges and advantages of the said Act, and all the provisions, penalties, and forfeitures therein contained, shall extend, and be deemed and construed to extend, to any such port or ports, respectively, as fully as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in the said table at the time of passing the said Act:

And whereas Her Majesty doth now deem it expedient to extend, in manner hereinafter-mentioned, the provisions of the said Act to the port of New Edinburgh, in St. Mary's Bay, in the province of Nova Scotia:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers in Her in that behalf vested by the said recited Act, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the first day of May next, the port of New Edinburgh, in St. Mary's Bay, shall be a free port; and all the privileges and advantages by the said recited Act conferred upon the free ports thereinmentioned, and all provisions, penalties, and forfeitures therein contained, subject to the limitations and restrictions therein provided, shall extend, and be deemed and construed to extend, to the said port of New Edinburgh, as fully and effectually as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in the said table of free ports at the time of the passing of the said recited Act:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Honourable Lord Stanley, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled " An Act for carrying into effect the reports of " the Commissioners appointed to consider the " state of the Established Church in England and " Wales, with reference to ecclesiastical duties " and revenues, so far as they relate to episcopal dioceses, revenues, and patronage;" and of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to carry into effect, with " certain modifications, the fourth report of the " Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and " Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An " Act to alter and amend the law relating to " ecclesiastical houses of residence," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-third day of January one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled " An Act for " carrying into effect the reports of the Com-" missioners appointed to consider the state of " the Established Church in England and Wales, " with reference to ecclesiastical duties and re-" venues, so far as they relate to episcopal dioceses, ' revenues, and patronage;" and of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modi-fications, the fourth report of the Commissioners " of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to alter and amend the " law relating to ecclesiastical houses of resi-"dence," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for authorising the application of certain monies, and a sale of certain stock belonging to the Dean and Chapter of Worcester, and for enabling the said Dean and Chapter to purchase therewith certain premises near the cathedral church of Worcester, for the improvement of the precincts thereof.

"Whereas by the secondly-recited Act it is enacted, that, by the authority therein provided, and for the purpose of fully carrying into effect any of the provisions thereof, any sum of money which shall have been invested in the public funds,

or in other security or securities, in trust, for any ecclesiastical body corporate, aggregate or sole, may, upon an application, in writing, to us, under the hand and seal of such body corporate, and in case of any chapter, with the consent of the visitor thereof, be directed to be sold, and the same shall be sold accordingly, and the produce of such sale shall be applied to such purpose and in such manner as shall appear most conducive to the permanent benefit of such body corporate;

"And whereas by the thirdly-recited Act it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for the dean and chapter of any cathedral church, under the authority provided in the herein first-recited Act, to purchase any house or site, being contiguous or near to such cathedral church, and to add to, alter, or improve any such house, or to take down the same, and to build another house, or more houses than one, upon the site thereof, or to apply the site of any such house, or any part thereof, by and with the authority aforesaid, to the improvement of the cathedral or the precincts thereof:

"And whereas by the same Act it is declared and enacted, that the provisions of the said secondly-recited Act, relating to the sale and application of any sum of money invested in trust for any ecclesiastical body corporate, do and shall include and apply to all monies and securities for money, and to all stock in the Government Funds, or elsewhere, standing in the name of the Accountant-General of the Court of Chancery, or in the name or names of any other public officer, or of any individual or individuals, for or to the credit or for the benefit of or in trust for any dean and chapter, whether for the purpose of being laid out in land or otherwise; and that the same provisions shall extend and may be applied to any of the purpose of the Act now in recital:

"And whereas the sum of four hundred and fifty-eight pounds, being the amount of the purchase money of certain lands in the parishes of Bredicot and Tibberton, in the county of Worcester, sold by the said Dean and Chapter to the Birmingham and Gloucester Railway Company, under the authority of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth year of the reign of His said late Majesty, intituled "An "Act for making a railway from Birmingham to "Gloucester, with a branch therefrom," has been paid by the said Company into the Bank of England, in the name and with the privity of the Accountant-General of the Court of Chancery, and placed to his account there?

"And whereas certain other sums of money, amounting together to the sum of two hundred and seventy pounds, the purchase moneys of certain other lands sold by the said Dean and Chapter to the said Company, in the parishes of Stoke Prior and Himbleton, in the said county of Worcester, have been, under the authority of the same Act, paid to Edmund Hungerford Lechmere, of Great Malvern, in the county of Worcester, Esquire, and John Whitmore Isaac, of Boughton, in the parish of Saint John in Bedwardine, in the said county of Worcester, Esquire, as Trustees for the said Dean and Chapter:

"And whereas certain other sums of money, being the purchase monies of lands sold by the said Dean and Chapter to the Stratford and Moreton Railway Company, under the authority of an Act. passed in the session of Parliament held in the first and second years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act for " making and maintaining a railway or tramroad " from Stratford-upon-Avon, in the county of "Warwick, to Moreton in Marsh, in the county " of Gloucester, with a branch to Shipston-upon-"Stour, in the county of Worcester;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third year of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for " enabling the Stratford and Moreton Railway "Company to make a new branch of railway to "Shipston-upon-Stour, in the county of Wor-" cester," have been also paid to the said Edmund Hungerford Lechmere and John Whitmore Isaac, as Trustees for the said Dean and Chapter, and have been invested in their names in the purchase of one hundred and twenty-two pounds seven shillings and five pence Three per Cent. Consolidated Bank Annuities, and the dividends thereof have been, from time to time, paid to the said Deam and Chapter, in accordance with the provisions of the same Acts:

"And whereas the said Dean and Chapter are entitled, subject to a certain lease, bearing date the first day of December one thousand eight hundred and thirty-one, and made between the said Dears and Chapter, of the one part, and Ann Wylde, widow, of the other part, to the fee simple and inheritance of and in the dwelling-house, garden, and premises decribed in the schedule hereunto annexed, which dwelling-house and premises were, by the said indenture of lease, demised to the said Ann Wylde for the term of forty years from the twenty-fifth day of November next before the making thereof, and the residue of the said term is now vested in Edward Oldnall, of the city of Worcester, Gentleman:

" And whereas the said dwelling-house and premises are near the west end of the said cathedral church, and it has been represented to us by the said Dean and Chapter, and it appears to us, that it will be most conducive to the permanent benefit of the said Dean and Chapter, and to the improvement of the said cathedral church and the precincts thereof, that all the estate and interest of the present lessee in the said dwelling-house and premises should be forthwith purchased by the said Dean and Chapter, and to that end that the said sums of four hundred and fifty-eight pounds, and two hundred and seventy pounds sterling, and the produce of so much of the said sum of one hundred and twenty-two pounds seven shillings and five pence Three per Cent. Consolidated Bank Annuities, as shall be necessary for that purpose, should be applied by the said Dean. and Chapter in the purchase of such leasehold estate as aforesaid, and that the said Dean and Chapter should thereupon be empowered to apply such premises to the purposes hereinafter mentioned; and an application, accordingly, has been duly made to us, in writing, by the said Dean and Chapter:

Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Bishop of Worcester, as Visitor of the said Chapter, in testimony whereof he hath hereunto set his hand and episcopal seal, that the said sum of four hundred and fifty-eight pounds, standing in the name of the Accountant-General of the Court of Chancery in the Bank of England as aforesaid, and also the said sum of two hundred and seventy pounds, in the hands of the said Edmund Hungerford Lechmere and John Whitmore Isaac, shall be forthwith paid to the said Dean and Chapter of Worcester, and shall be applied by them in the purchase of all the leasehold estate and interest in the dwelling-house and premises described in the said schedule, and that so much of the said sum of one hundred and twenty-two pounds seven shillings and five-pence Three per Cent. Consolidated Bank Annuities, standing in the names of the said Edmund Hungerford Lechmere and John Whitmore Isaac in the Bank of England, as shall be necessary, shall be forthwith sold by them, and the produce paid to the said Dean and Chapter, to be by them applied for the purposes aforesaid; and that thereupon it shall be lawful for the said Dean and Chapter to take down the said dwelling-house and buildings, or any part thereof, and to apply the site thereof, or of any part thereof, to the improvement of the said cathedral church of Worcester and the precincts thereof.

And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing other measures relating to the matters to which this scheme refers, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or either of them.

SCHEDULE.

A messuage or dwelling-house, called Ivylodge, with the outhouses and buildings, near the west end of the said cathedral church, adjoining or near to the charmel-house, bounded on the north by the Palace-green, on the south by the ground leading to the stables and garden belonging to the fifth canonry or prebendal stall of the said church, and the garden and garden-ground adjoining the said dwelling-house, as now inclosed with a strong stone wall, and extending from the said house unto the wall of the river Severn, and likewise the court before the said dwelling-house, extending from the same into the cemetry of the said cathedral church.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Ma* jesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Worcester.

THE following is a copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, assigning a chapelry district to Saint Peter's Chapel, at Upper Gornal, in the parish of Sedgley, in the county of Stafford, under the 16th section of the 59th Geo. 3., cap. 134 t

At the Court at Buckingham-Palace, the 31st of January 1844, present, the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fiftyeighth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "that in every case in which the Commissioners appointed for carrying into execution Order shall have been duly published in the London the purposes of the said Act shall be of opinion

that it will be expedient to divide any parish into two or more distinct and separate parishes, for all ecclesiastical purposes whatever, it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese in which such parish is locally situated, signified under his hand and seal, to apply to the patron or patrons of the church of such parish for his consent to make such division, and for such patron or patrons to signify his or their consent thereto under his hand and seal; and the said Commissioners shall, upon the consent of the said patron or patrons so signified, represent the whole matter to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which it is proposed, with such consent as aforesaid, to divide such parish, together with the relative and respective proportions of glebe land, tithes, moduses, or other endowments which will by such division arise and accrue, and remain and be, within each of such respective divisions, and also the relative proportions of the estimated amount of the value or produce of fees, oblations, offerings, or other ecclesiastical dues or profits which may arise and accrue within each of such respective divisions; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division; provided always, that no such division of any parish into distinct parishes shall completely take effect until after the death, resignation, or other avoidance of the existing incumbent of the parish to be divided;" and it is by the 21st section of the said Act further enacted, "that in any case in which the said Commissioners shall be of opinion that it is not expedient to divide any populous parish, or extra parochial place, into such complete, separate, and distinct parishes as aforesaid, but that it is expedient to divide the same into such ecclesiastical districts as they, with the consent of the bishop, signified under his hand and seal, may deem necessary for the purpose of affording accommodation for the attending divine service, according to the rites of the United Church of England and Ireland, to persons residing therein, in the churches and parochial chapels already built, or in additional churches or chapels to be built therein, and as may appear to such Commissioners to be convenient for the enabling the spiritual person or persons who may serve such churches or chapels to perform all ecclesiastical duties within the districts attached to such respective churches and chapels, and for the due ecclesisstical super-intendence of such district, and the preservation and improvement of the religious and moral habits of the persons residing therein, the said Commissioners shall represent such opinion to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which such districts are proposed to be described; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division:"

And whereas by an Act, passed in the fiftyninth year of His late Majesty King George the

Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, in the same manner and with the like consents as are required in case of division into ecclesiastical districts under the said recited Act, or this Act, to assign a particular district to any chapel of ease or parochial chapel already existing, or to any chapel built, or which may hereafter be built or acquired under the powers of the said Act, or this Act; and such district shall be under the immediate care of the curate appointed to serve such chapel, but subject, nevertheless, to the superintendence and controul of the incumbent of the parish church; and all such curates shall be nominated by the incumbent of the parish to the bishop for his licence, except where the right of nomination shall already be legally vested in any other person or persons, and in every such case by the person or persons possessing such right of nomination, subject to all the laws in force relating to stipendiary curates, except as to the assigning of salaries to such curates; provided always, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, to determine whether any and what part or proportion of the fees or dues for marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials shall be assigned to any such curate; and whether banns of marriage shall be published, and marriages or baptisms, churchings or burials, shall be solemnized or performed in any such chapel or not; and in any case in which marriages shall be allowed in any such chapel, the Commissioners shall cause the boundaries of the district assigned to such chapel to be enrolled in the High Court of Chancery, and in the office of the Registry of the diocese, any thing in the said recited Act to the contrary notwithstanding; and no such chapelry shall become a benefice by reason of any augmentation of the maintenance of the curate, by any grant or bounty under the provision of any Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, for augmenting small livings, any thing in such Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, to the contrary notwithstanding:"

And whereas by another Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and by another Act, made and passed in the first and second years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled "An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and also by another Act, made and passed in the second and third years of His said late Majesty, intituled "An Act to render more effectual an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An

Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, | being in and within the said parish of Sedgley; passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" further provisions are made for carrying such divisions into

And whereas the said Commissioners have made a representation to Her Majesty in Council, bearing date the twelfth day of December one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, in the words following, viz.

- "Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches, appointed by virtue of an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" continued by an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled " An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and further continued by an Act, passed in the first year of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to prolong, for ten years, Her Majesty's Commission for building new churches;" beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, when the last census was taken, the parish of Sedgley, in the county of Stafford and diocese of Lichfield, contained a population of twenty-four thousand eight hundred and nineteen persons:
- " That, besides the parish church, which affords accommodation to one thousand three hundred and nine persons, there are four consecrated churches or chapels in the said parish, one of which, called Saint Peter's Chapel, situate at Upper Gornal, affords accommodation to nine hundred and twentyone persons, including six hundred and forty-five free seats appropriated to the use of the poor; and that divine service is regularly performed therein:
- "Your Majesty's Commissioners beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending this parish, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the said chapel of Saint Peter, Upper Gornal, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and that such district should be named "The Chapelry District of Saint Peter, Upper Gornal," with boundaries as
- " The chapelry district of Saint Peter, Upper Gornal, is to consist of the village of Upper Gornal, the same being bounded on the east by the village of Wood Setton; on the north by the village of Sedgley; on the north west by the village of Calwall End; on the south west by the village of Lower Gornal, all such several villages |

and on the south by the parish of Dudley, as the same is more particularly delineated on the map hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured green:

"That marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said chapel; and that the fees arising therefrom should be received by and belong to the Minister of the said chapel:.

- "That the consent of the Lord Bishop of Lichfield has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third; in testimony whereof, the said Lord Bishop has signed and sealed this present instrument:
- "Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, beg leave to lay before your Majesty the before-mentioned circumstances, and humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall geem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made, and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.
