The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act to regulate the trade of the British possessions abroad," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that no goods should be imported into, nor should any goods, except the produce of the fisheries in British ships, be exported from any of the British possessions in America by sea, from or to any place other than the United Kingdom, or some other of such possessions, except into or from the several ports in such possessions called free ports, enumerated in the table therein following :

And whereas it is by the said Act provided, that, if His Majesty shall deem it expedient to extend the provisions of the said Act to any port or ports not enumerated in the said table, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, to extend the provisions of the said Act to such port or ports; and, from and after the day mentioned in such Order, all the privileges and advantages of the said Act, and all the provisions, penalties, and forfeitures therein contained, shall extend, and be deemed and construed to extend, to any such port or ports, respectively, as fully as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in the said table at the time of passing the said Act :

And whereas Her Majesty doth now deem it expedient to extend, in manner hereinafter-mentioned, the provisions of the said Act to the port of New Edinburgh, in St. Mary's Bay, in the province of Nova Scotia :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers in Her in that behalf vested by the said recited Act, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the first day of May next, the port of New Edinburgh, in St. Mary's Bay, shall be a free port; and all the privileges and advantages by the said recited Act conferred upon the free ports therein mentioned, and all provisions, penalties, and forfeitures therein contained, subject to the limitations and restrictions therein provided, shall extend, and be deemed and construed to extend, to the said port of New Edinburgh, as fully and effectually as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in the said table of free ports at the time of the passing of the said recited Act :

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Honourable Lord Stanley, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

THE following is a copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, assigning a chapelry district to Trinity Chapel, at Ware, in the united parishes of Ware and Thundridge, in the county of Hertford, under the 16th section of the 59th Geo. 3, cap. 134:

At the Court at Buckingham-Palace, the 31st of January 1844, present, the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His late Majesty King

George the Third, intituled "An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "that in every case in which the Commissioners appointed for carrying into execution the purposes of the said Act shall be of opinion that it will be expedient to divide any parish into two or more distinct and separate parishes, for all ecclesiastical purposes whatever, it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese in which such parish is locally situated, signified under his hand and seal, to apply to the patron or patrons of the church of such parish for his consent to make such division, and for such patron or patrons to signify his or their consent thereto under his hand and seal; and the said Commissioners shall, upon the consent of the said patron or patrons so signified, represent the whole matter to His Majesty in Council; and shall state in such representation the bounds by which it is proposed, with such consent as aforesaid, to divide such parish, together with the relative and respective proportions of glebe land, tithes, moduses, or other endowments which will by such division arise and accrue, and remain and be, within each of such respective divisions, and also the relative proportions of the estimated amount of the value or produce of fees, oblations, offerings, or other ecclesiastical dues or profits which may arise and accrue within each of such respective divisions; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division; provided always, that no such division of any parish into distinct parishes shall completely take effect until after the death, resignation, or other avoidance of the existing incumbent of the parish to be divided;" and it is by the 21st section of the said Act further enacted, "that in any case in which the said Commissioners shall be of opinion that it is not expedient to divide any populous parish, or extra parochial place, into such complete, separate, and distinct parishes as aforesaid, but that it is expedient to divide the same into such ecclesiastical districts as they, with the consent of the bishop, signified under his hand and seal, may deem necessary for the purpose of affording accommodation for the attending divine service, according to the rites of the United Church of England and Ireland, to persons residing therein, in the churches and parochial chapels already built, or in additional churches or chapels to be built therein, and as may appear to such Commissioners to be convenient for the enabling the spiritual person or persons who may serve such churches or chapels to perform all ecclesiastical duties within the districts attached to such respective churches and chapels, and for the due ecclesiastical superintendence of such district, and the preservation and improvement of the religious and moral habits of the persons residing therein, the said Commissioners shall represent such opinion to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which such districts are proposed to be described; and if, thereupon, His

Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division:"

And whereas by an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, in the same manner and with the like consents as are required in case of division into ecclesiastical districts under the said recited Act, or this Act, to assign a particular district to any chapel of ease or parochial chapel already existing, or to any chapel built, or which may hereafter be built or acquired under the powers of the said Act, or this Act; and such district shall be under the immediate care of the curate appointed to serve such chapel, but subject, nevertheless, to the superintendence and controul of the incumbent of the parish church; and all such curates shall be nominated by the incumbent of the parish to the bishop for his licence, except where the right of nomination shall already be legally vested in any other person or persons, and in every such case by the person or persons possessing such right of nomination, subject to all the laws in force relating to stipendiary curates, except as to the assigning of salaries to such curates; provided always, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, to determine whether any and what part or proportion of the fees or dues for marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials shall be assigned to any such curate; and whether banns of marriage shall be published, and marriages or baptisms, churchings or burials, shall be solemnized or performed in any such chapel or not; and in any case in which marriages shall be allowed in any such chapel, the Commissioners shall cause the boundaries of the district assigned to such chapel to be enrolled in the High Court of Chancery, and in the office of the Registry of the diocese, any thing in the said recited Act to the contrary notwithstanding; and no such chapelry shall become a benefice by reason of any augmentation of the maintenance of the curate, by any grant or bounty under the provision of any Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, for augmenting small livings, any thing in such Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, to the contrary notwithstanding:"

And whereas by another Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and by another Act, made and passed in the first and second years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled 'An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of ad-

ditional churches in populous parishes ;” and also by another Act, made and passed in the second and third years of His said late Majesty, intituled “An Act to render more effectual an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled ‘An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes ;’” further provisions are made for carrying such divisions into effect :

And whereas the said Commissioners have made a representation to Her Majesty in Council, bearing date the ninth day of January one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words following, viz.

“Your Majesty’s Commissioners for building new churches, appointed by virtue of an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled “An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes ;” continued by an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled “An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes ;” and further continued by an Act, passed in the first year of your Majesty’s reign, intituled “An Act to prolong, for ten years, Her Majesty’s Commission for building new churches ;” beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, when the last census was taken, the united parishes of Ware and Thundridge, in the county of Hertford and diocese of London, which form one consolidated vicarage, contained a population of five thousand one hundred and eighty-eight persons :

“That, besides the parish churches, which together afford accommodation to about one thousand six hundred persons, there is only one chapel, called Trinity Chapel, situate near the hamlet of Wareside, in the parish of Ware, which affords accommodation to five hundred persons, all in free seats ; and that divine service is regularly performed therein :

“Your Majesty’s said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending this parish, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the said chapel of the Holy Trinity, at the Wareside, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled “An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes ;” and that such district should be named, “The Chapelry District of Wareside,” with boundaries as follow, that is to say :

“The district is to consist of the easternmost parts of the parishes of Ware and Thundridge, the

same being bounded on the north east by the parishes of Standon and Hadham ; on the south east by the parish of Widford ; on the south by the parishes of Hunsdon and Stanstead, as far as the river Ash ; from whence the boundary proceeds in an easterly direction along the river as far as the bridge close to Waters-place ; it then proceeds from that bridge in a northerly and north easterly direction by a road bounding Waters-place on the west, and up a field, called Birdcroft, to the main road leading from Ware to Bishops Stortford by Wareside, and proceeding by that road to the first gate to the left, and passing through that gate by the road into Woodlane, skirting Pitt Redding-field to the north east ; thence by that lane up to the Old-farm, and from thence to the gate entering into Packuly’s-field, and proceeds along the path skirting the west side of that field and of two others, called Old Hoiley and Dog-field, into the road leading from Ware to New-hall-green, and up that road as far as Mackhouse, skirting the top of two fields, called Artwick and Pats-ley, into a Green-lane, and along the middle of that lane down to Swangle’s-farm ; from thence turning to the east by the road leading to Timber-hall, from whence it proceeds by a bridleway direct to Sawtries, and from thence along the road to Barwick, till that road crosses the boundary line between the parishes of Thundridge and Standon, as is more particularly shewn by the map hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured pink :

“That marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said chapel ; and that the fees arising therefrom should be received by and belong to the Minister thereof :

“That the consent of the Lord Bishop of London has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third ; in testimony whereof, the said Lord Bishop has signed and sealed this present instrument :

“Your Majesty’s Commissioners beg leave to lay before your Majesty the before-mentioned circumstances, and humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet.”

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made, and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.

#### PORTSMOUTH, COWES, AND SOUTHAMPTON PILOTS.

*Trinity-House, London, April 23, 1844.*

**P**URSUANT to an Act of Parliament, passed in the forty-eighth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for the better regulation of pilots, and of the pilotage of ships and vessels navigating the British seas," the Corporation of Trinity-House of Deptford Strond, shortly after the passing of the said Act, licensed pilots for Portsmouth, and for Cowes, in the isle of Wight, and the harbours, channels, and coasts within the district called "The Portsmouth and Cowes District," the limits of which were described, and the names of the pilots so licensed were set forth in the notice of such licences, thereupon published, as directed by such Act; and other pilots having been licensed by the said Corporation for the said district as vacancies have occurred, or occasion required, the names of the pilots now licensed for such district, and the limits within which they are, respectively, licensed to act, are hereinafter set forth: and, pursuant to an Act, passed in the sixth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act for the amendment of the law respecting pilots and pilotage, and also for the better preservation of floating lights, buoys, and beacons," the said Corporation of Trinity-House have lately licensed pilots for the port of Southampton, and the coasts near thereto, and the names of such pilots, and the limits within which they are licensed to act, are hereinafter set forth; and the said Corporation do hereby give notice of such licences as last aforesaid; and do also give notice, that, from and after the 15th day of June next (up to, and inclusive of, which day ships and vessels are to be piloted as heretofore), all ships

and vessels sailing, navigating, or passing within the limits of the said licences are to be conducted and piloted by such pilots only as are, or shall be, so licensed as aforesaid, and by no other pilots or persons whomsoever; but in relation to ships and vessels at present absent on foreign voyages, and which shall remain absent on the said 15th day of June next, the said Corporation do appoint further time for compliance by the masters or other persons having the command of such ships and vessels, with the provisions of the said last-mentioned Act, namely, until the return of such ships and vessels, respectively, into port from their said present voyages: and the regulations to be observed by the Portsmouth, Cowes, and Southampton pilots, respectively, are also hereinafter mentioned; and all pilots now licensed, or hereafter to be licensed, for the several ports aforesaid, and the coasts adjoining the same, are hereby required to observe such regulations, and conform themselves strictly thereto.
