The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fourteenth day of May one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words and figures following, that is to say :

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act " to carry into effect, with certain modifications, " the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for uniting the sinecure rectory of Sherborne Saint John, in the county of Southampton and in the diocese of Winchester, with the vicarage of Sherborne Saint John, in the same county and diocese.

" Whereas by the said Act it is enacted, that, with respect to any benefice with cure of souls which is held, together with or in the patronage of the holder of any prebend or other sinecure preferment, belonging to any college in either of the universities or to any private patron, arrangements may be made, by the authority therein provided, and with the consents of the respective patrons, for permanently uniting such preferment with such benefice:

" And whereas there is in the said county of Southampton and diocese of Winchester, a vicarage, being a benefice with cure of souls within the meaning of the said recited Act, called or known by the name of the vicarage of Sherborne Saint John, and there is also in the same county and diocese, an ecclesiastical rectory without cure of souls, being a sinecure preferment within the meaning of the same Act, called or known by the name of the rectory of Sherborne Saint John:

" And whereas the said vicarage is now held by the Reverend John Harwood, Clerk, together with the said sinecure rectory; and William Lyde Wiggett Chute, of the Vine, in the parish of Sherborne Saint John, in the said county of Southampton, Esquire, Member of Parliament, is owner of the advowson, as well of such vicarage as of such sinecure rectory, but Robert Lawson, of Everley Lodge, in the parish of East Barnet, in

the county of Hertford, Esquire, is entitled to the next presentation to the said vicarage and rectory respectively :

" And whereas application has been made to us, to make arrangements for the union of the said sinecure rectory with the said vicarage, and it appears to us to be expedient that such union should be forthwith effected, and that such other arrangements relating thereto should be made as are hereinafter mentioned :

" Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the said William Lyde Wiggett Chute, and of the said Robert Lawson, in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this scheme, that the said rectory and vicarage of Sherborne St. John shall be forthwith permanently united and consolidated, and the same shall become and be one benefice with cure of souls, by the name of the rectory of Sherborne St. John; and that the said John Harwood shall thereupon become and be Rector of such rectory, and he and his successors, Rectors of the same rectory, shall be entitled to all the emoluments, both of the said sinecure rectory and of the said vicarage, and that the said rectory of Sherborne St. John shall, from and after such union as aforesaid, be in the patronage of the said William Lyde Wiggett Chute, his heirs and assigns.

" And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the said rectory of Sherborne St. John, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Act, or any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Winchester.

An Act to enable the Northern and Eastern Railway Company to make certain deviations in the line of their railway between Bishop's Stortford and Newport; and to alter and amend the Acts relating to the said railway.

THE following is a copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, assigning a consolidated chapelry district to St. James's Church, at North-hill, in the parish of Mathon, in the county of Worcester, formed from contiguous parts of the said parishes of Mathon and of Leigh, in the said county of Worcester, and of the parishes of Cradley and Colwall, in the county of Hereford, under the 6th section of the 59th Geo. 3., cap. 134 :

At the Court at Buckingham-Palace, the 4th of March 1844, present, the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "that in every case in which the Commissioners appointed for carrying into execution the purposes of the said Act shall be of opinion that it will be expedient to divide any parish into two or more distinct and separate parishes, for all ecclesiastical purposes whatever, it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese in which such parish is locally situated, signified under his hand and seal, to apply to the patron or patrons of the church of such parish for his consent to make such division, and for such patron or patrons to signify his or their consent thereto under his hand and seal; and the said Commissioners shall, upon the consent of the said patron or patrons so signified, represent the whole matter to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which it is proposed, with such consent as aforesaid, to divide such parish, together with the relative and respective proportions of glebe land, tithes, moduses, or other endowments which will by such division arise and accrue, and remain and be, within each of such respective divisions, and also the relative proportions of the estimated amount of the value or produce of fees, oblations, offerings, or

other ecclesiastical dues or profits which may arise and accrue within each of such respective divisions; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division; provided always, that no such division of any parish into distinct parishes shall completely take effect until after the death, resignation, or other avoidance of the existing incumbent of the parish to be divided;” and it is by the 21st section of the said Act further enacted, “that in any case in which the said Commissioners shall be of opinion that it is not expedient to divide any populous parish, or extra-parochial place, into such complete, separate, and distinct parishes as aforesaid, but that it is expedient to divide the same into such ecclesiastical districts as they, with the consent of the bishop, signified under his hand and seal, may deem necessary for the purpose of affording accommodation for the attending divine service, according to the rites of the United Church of England and Ireland, to persons residing therein, in the churches and parochial chapels already built, or in additional churches or chapels to be built therein, and as may appear to such Commissioners to be convenient for the enabling the spiritual person or persons who may serve such churches or chapels to perform all ecclesiastical duties within the districts attached to such respective churches and chapels, and for the due ecclesiastical superintendence of such district, and the preservation and improvement of the religious and moral habits of the persons residing therein, the said Commissioners shall represent such opinion to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which such districts are proposed to be described; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division:”

And whereas by an Act, passed in the fiftyninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled “An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes,” reciting that a considerable population is frequently collected together at the extremities of, and locally situate in, parishes or extra-parochial places contiguous to each other, at a distance from the respective churches or chapels of such respective parishes or extra-parochial places, it is, amongst other things, enacted, that it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, with such consent as is required by the said recited Act in the case of district parishes, to unite and consolidate any such contiguous parts of such parishes and extra-parochial places into a separate and distinct district for all ecclesiastical purposes, and to cause such district to be named, ascertained, and marked out by described bounds, and such name, and the description of such bounds, when approved by His Majesty in Council, to be enrolled in the High Court of Chancery, and in the office of the Registry of the diocese to which

such district shall belong, under the provisions of this Act; and to make grants or loans for or towards the building of, or to build, any chapel or chapels, with or without cemeteries, in and for the use of the inhabitants of any such district, in such manner, and under such regulations as may, in the judgment of the Commissioners, appear from the circumstances to be most expedient, and to constitute any such district a consolidated chapelry; and every such chapelry shall be under the superintendence of such spiritual person as shall be appointed under the provisions of this Act to serve any such chapel, and such spiritual person shall have cure of souls in such district; and the right of presentation and appointment of such spiritual person shall thenceforth belong to such person or persons, and be exercised in such manner as may be agreed by the several patrons of the churches or chapels of such parishes and extra-parochial places respectively, with the approbation of the Commissioners; and banns of marriage may be published, and marriages, christenings, churchings, and burials may be solemnized and performed in any such chapel, immediately and at all times after the consecration thereof, and the pew rents in such chapel shall be fixed, and salaries to the minister and clerk assigned therefrom, in such manner as is directed in the said recited Act, or in this Act, concerning pew rents and salaries in separate or distinct parishes; and all fees and offerings which may arise and accrue within such chapelry, according to such table of fees as the Commissioners shall make, with the approbation of the bishop, may be demanded, received, sued for, prosecuted, and recovered by the spiritual person having cure of souls therein, and by the clerk and sexton of such chapelries, in like manner as if every such chapelry was a distinct parish; and it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, and they are hereby required in every such case, to ascertain and make compensation, in manner directed in like cases under the said recited Act, for any loss which may be sustained by the incumbent of any contiguous parish or extra-parochial place, which shall form part of any such district, by reason of any fees, oblations, and offerings being transferred to the spiritual person serving any such chapel; and all such chapelries shall be deemed to be benefices, and be subject to the jurisdiction of the bishop and archdeacon within whose diocese and archdeaconry the altar of such chapel shall be locally situate, and to all the laws in force concerning presentation and appointment to benefices and churches, and lapse, and all other laws relating to the holding of benefices and churches: and it is thereby further enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, in the same manner and with the like consents as are required in case of division into ecclesiastical districts under the said recited Act, or this Act, to assign a particular district to any chapel of ease or parochial chapel already existing, or to any chapel built, or which may hereafter be built or acquired under the powers of the said Act, or this Act; and such district shall be under the immediate care of the curate appointed to serve such chapel, but sub-

ject, nevertheless, to the superintendence and controul of the incumbent of the parish church; and all such curates shall be nominated by the incumbent of the parish to the bishop for his licence, except where the right of nomination shall already be legally vested in any other person or persons, and in every such case by the person or persons possessing such right of nomination, subject to all the laws in force relating to stipendiary curates, except as to the assigning of salaries to such curates; provided always, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, to determine whether any and what part or proportion of the fees or dues for marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials shall be assigned to any such curate; and whether banns of marriage shall be published, and marriages or baptisms, churchings or burials, shall be solemnized or performed in any such chapel or not; and in any case in which marriages shall be allowed in any such chapel, the Commissioners shall cause the boundaries of the district assigned to such chapel to be enrolled in the High Court of Chancery, and in the office of the Registry of the diocese, any thing in the said recited Act to the contrary notwithstanding; and no such chapelry shall become a benefice by reason of any augmentation of the maintenance of the curate, by any grant or bounty under the provision of any Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, for augmenting small livings, any thing in such Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, to the contrary notwithstanding."

And whereas by another Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and by another Act, made and passed in the first and second years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled 'An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;'" and also by another Act, made and passed in the second and third years of His said late Majesty, intituled "An Act to render more effectual an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled 'An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;'" further provisions are made for carrying such divisions into effect:

And whereas the said Commissioners have made a representation to Her Majesty in Council, bearing date the seventeenth day of February one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words following, viz.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches, appointed by virtue of an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An

Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" continued by an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and further continued by an Act, passed in the first year of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to prolong, for ten years, Her Majesty's Commission for building new churches;" beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, when the last census was taken, the parishes of Mathon and Leigh, in the county and diocese of Worcester, and the parishes of Cradley and Colwall, in the county and diocese of Hereford, contained, respectively, a population as follows, viz. the parish of Mathon contained a population of seven hundred and sixteen persons; the parish of Leigh contained a population of two thousand and eleven persons; the parish of Cradley contained a population of one thousand five hundred and four persons; and the parish of Colwall contained a population of nine hundred and forty persons:

"That in the parish of Mathon, besides the parish church, which affords accommodation to three hundred persons, there is only one consecrated church, called St. James's Church, which affords accommodation to three hundred and fifty persons, including three hundred and twenty free seats appropriated to the use of the poor; that in the parish of Leigh, besides the parish church, which affords accommodation to three hundred and fifty persons, there is a consecrated church at Bransford, and that in the said parishes of Cradley and Colwall there are only the parish churches, which, respectively, afford accommodation as follows, viz. the parish church of Cradley to five hundred persons, and the parish church of Colwall to three hundred and fifty persons:

"That the said church of St. James, in Mathon parish, is distant from the parish church of Mathon about two miles and a half, from the parish church of Leigh about five miles, from the parish church of Cradley about three miles, and from the parish church of Colwall about three miles and a half, which are the places nearest to the said church appropriated to the celebration of divine service according to the rites of the Church of England:

"That the extremities of the said parishes of Mathon, Leigh, Cradley, and Colwall, which lie contiguous to the said church of St. James, and are delineated in the accompanying plan, contain a population of six hundred persons:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances above mentioned, it appears to them to be expedient to unite and consolidate the said contiguous parts of the above-mentioned four parishes into a separate and distinct district, to be assigned to the said church of St. James, for all ecclesiastical purposes, and to constitute such district a consolidated chapelry, under the sixth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed consolidation and assignment be accordingly made and effected, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.
