WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act for regulating the cathedral churches of Wales;" duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the eleventh day of June one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words and figures following, that is to say :

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications,

" the fourth report of the Commissioners of " Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled " An Act for regulating the " cathedral churches of Wales;" have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for providing a new temporary endowment for the archdeaconry of Merioneth, in the diocese of Bangor, and for augmenting the income of the archdeaconry of Derby, in the diocese of Lichfield.

" Whereas it was by the said first recited Act enacted, that any archdeaconry might, subject to the consent of the bishop, be endowed, amongst other modes, out of the common fund in the said Act mentioned, but not so as to raise the average annual income thereof to an amount exceeding two hundred pounds; provided, that no archdeacon should be entitled to hold any endowment or augmentation, or other emolument, as such archdeacon, under the provisions of the same Act, unless resident for the space of eight months in every year within the diocese in which his archdeaconry should be situate, or as to any archdeacon then existing within the diocese in which his archdeaconry was situate before the passing of

the said Act; but subject to the same provisions as to licences for non-residence which are enacted, with respect to incumbents of benefices, by the Act relating to residence and pluralities in the same Act mentioned; and that upon any endowment of an archdeaconry being made, under the provisions of the same Act, all lands, tithes, and other hereditaments (except any right of patronage), belonging to such archdeaconry at the time of such endowment, might, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, and of any archdeacon in possession at the time of the passing of the same Act, and by the authority therein provided, be vested in us, for the purposes of such Act :

“ And whereas by the secondly recited Act, the provisions of the said first recited Act were extended and made applicable to the diocese and cathedral church of Bangor, and to the dignities, offices, canonries, and prebends of the same church, and to the respective holders thereof :

“ And whereas the said archdeaconry of Merioneth is a dignity and office founded in the said cathedral church of Bangor, and is endowed by the annexation thereto of the appropriate rectory of Llandudno, in the county of Carnarvon, in the said diocese of Bangor, and of a piece or parcel of land, in the city of Bangor, containing, by estimation, one acre and a half, and the remaining emoluments of the archdeaconry do not exceed the average annual sum of ten pounds; and the Venerable Richard Newcome was, at the time of the passing of the said first recited Act, and still is, archdeacon of the said archdeaconry :

“ And whereas the said archdeaconry of Derby has no fixed endowment, and the average annual income thereof, arising from fees, does not exceed the sum of fifty pounds; and the Venerable Walter Augustus Shirley is now archdeacon of the same archdeaconry, and was appointed such archdeacon after the passing of the said first recited Act :

“ We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Christopher Bishop of Bangor, and John Bishop of Lichfield, testified by their having respectively signed and sealed this scheme, that the said archdeaconries of Merioneth and Derby shall be severally and respectively endowed by augmenta-

tion, out of the common fund in the said first recited Act mentioned, in the manner hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, that there shall be paid by us, out of the said common fund, to the said Richard Newcome, Archdeacon of Merioneth, and Walter Augustus Shirley, Archdeacon of Derby, and their respective successors in the said archdeaconries, so long as they shall respectively hold the said archdeaconries, and shall duly reside in the dioceses in which the same are or shall respectively be situate,—but in the case of the archdeacon of Merioneth, not after the annexation of a canonry in the cathedral church of Bangor to his archdeaconry and the endowment of such canonry under the provisions of the said secondly recited Act,—the several annual sums following, that is to say, to the archdeacon of Merioneth, for the time being, the sum of one hundred and ninety pounds; and to the archdeacon of Derby, for the time being, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds, on the first day of January in every year; and every such whole yearly payment, to each of such archdeacons, shall be made only on production to us of a certificate, under the hand of the bishop, for the time being, of the diocese in which his archdeaconry is situate, that such archdeacon has duly resided during the preceeding year, and a proportionate part of the first of such yearly payments, calculated from the day on which any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be duly gazetted, shall be made on the first day of January next ensuing; and that whenever a vacancy in either of the said archdeaconries shall happen on any other day than the first day of January the then next yearly payment shall be duly apportioned and paid between and to the archdeacon making the vacancy or his representatives, and the archdeacon succeeding to such archdeaconry so becoming vacant.

“ And we further recommend and propose, with the consent of the said Richard Newcome, testified by his having also signed and sealed this scheme, that the said rectory of Llandudno, together with all rights, privileges, members, and appurtenances thereunto belonging (except any right of patronage), and also the before-mentioned piece or parcel of land in the city of Bangor, and all other lands, tithes, tenements, and hereditaments (if any) belonging to and forming part of the endowment of the said archdeaconry of Merioneth,

shall be disannexed therefrom, and shall become and be absolutely vested in us, for the purposes of the said recited Acts.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measure touching the matters herein contained, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas notice of the said scheme has been duly given to the said Archdeacon of Derby, and no objection has been made thereto.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the dioceses of Bangor and Lichfield respectively.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled “ An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;” duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fourteenth day of May one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words and figures following, that is to say :

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled “ An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, “ the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues,” have pre-

pared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for uniting the sinecure rectory of Sherborne Saint John, in the county of Southampton and in the diocese of Winchester, with the vicarage of Sherborne Saint John, in the same county and diocese.

“ Whereas by the said Act it is enacted, that, with respect to any benefice with cure of souls which is held, together with or in the patronage of the holder of any prebend or other sinecure preferment, belonging to any college in either of the universities or to any private patron, arrangements may be made, by the authority therein provided, and with the consents of the respective patrons, for permanently uniting such preferment with such benefice:

“ And whereas there is in the said county of Southampton and diocese of Winchester, a vicarage, being a benefice with cure of souls within the meaning of the said recited Act, called or known by the name of the vicarage of Sherborne Saint John, and there is also in the same county and diocese, an ecclesiastical rectory without cure of souls, being a sinecure preferment within the meaning of the same Act, called or known by the name of the rectory of Sherborne Saint John:

“ And whereas the said vicarage is now held by the Reverend John Harwood, Clerk, together with the said sinecure rectory; and William Lyde Wiggett Chute, of the Vine, in the parish of Sherborne Saint John, in the said county of Southampton, Esquire, Member of Parliament, is owner of the advowson, as well of such vicarage as of such sinecure rectory, but Robert Lawson, of Everley Lodge, in the parish of East Barnet, in the county of Hertford, Esquire, is entitled to the next presentation to the said vicarage and rectory, respectively :

“ And whereas application has been made to us, to make arrangements for the union of the said sinecure rectory with the said vicarage, and it appears to us to be expedient that such union should be forthwith effected, and that such other arrangements relating thereto should be made as are hereinafter mentioned:

“ Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the said William Lyde Wiggett Chute, and of the said Robert Lawson, in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this scheme, that the said rectory and vicarage of Sherborne St. John shall be forthwith permanently united and consolidated, and the same shall become and be one benefice with cure of souls, by the name of the rectory of Sherborne St. John; and that the said John Harwood shall thereupon become and be Rector of such rectory, and he and his successors, Rectors of the same rectory, shall be entitled to all the emoluments, both of the said sinecure rectory and of the said vicarage, and that the said rectory of Sherborne St. John shall, from and after such union as aforesaid, be in the patronage of the said William Lyde Wiggett Chute, his heirs and assigns.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us

from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the said rectory of Sherborne St. John, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Act, or any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Winchester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-first day of May one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words and figures following, that is to say :

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for making better provision for the spiritual duties of the parish of Maidstone, in the county of Kent and diocese of Canterbury.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, with an especial view to the better care of populous parishes, that arrangements may, from time to time, be made, by the authority therein provided, for improving the value or making a better provision for the spiritual duties of ill-endowed parishes or districts, by means of such alterations in the exercise of patronage as may be agreed upon by patrons, with the consent of the bishop; and it is by the same Act further enacted, that arrangements may be made, by the like authority, for the apportionment of the income of two benefices, belonging to the same patron, between the

incumbents or ministers of such benefices, or the churches or chapels connected therewith; provided, that no such arrangement shall be made, in any case, so as to prejudice the interests of any existing incumbent, nor without the consent of the bishop of the diocese :

"And whereas the perpetual curacy of Maidstone, in the said county of Kent and diocese of Canterbury, is a populous parish within the meaning of the said Act, and the patronage thereof is vested in the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being; and there is within, and connected with, such parish a certain church or chapel, called "The Holy Trinity, Maidstone," with a chapelry district duly assigned thereto, and the patronage of the said church or chapel is at present vested in the perpetual curate for the time being of Maidstone aforesaid, and the net average annual income of the minister of such last-mentioned church or chapel does not exceed the sum of three hundred and fifty pounds, and the population of the said district amounts to nine thousand three hundred at the least :

"And whereas the Archbishop of Canterbury, for the time being, is also patron of the rectory of Cliffe, at Hoo, in the same county, and is the deanery of Shoreham, the peculiar and immediate jurisdiction of the cathedral and metropolitan Church of Christ, Canterbury; and the net average annual income of the rector thereof exceeds one thousand two hundred and fifty pounds, and the population of the parish of Cliffe, at Hoo, is below nine hundred :

"And whereas it has been agreed by the Reverend William Vallance, the present incumbent of the said perpetual curacy of Maidstone, to transfer the patronage and right of nomination of the minister of the said church or chapel of the Holy Trinity, Maidstone, to the Archbishop of Canterbury, for the time being; with a view to the permanent augmentation of the income of the minister thereof, in manner hereinafter-mentioned; and application has been made to us, to make arrangements for such transfer, and for apportioning the incomes of the said rectory and of the said chapel, between the rector of the said rectory and the minister of such chapel, in manner following; and it appears to us to be expedient that such transfer and apportionment should be forthwith carried into effect :

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William Archbishop of Canterbury, and of the said Reverend William Vallance, in testimony whereof they have respectively hereunto set their hands and seals, that the patronage of and right of nomination of the minister to the said church or chapel of the Holy Trinity, Maidstone, shall forthwith be transferred to and absolutely vested in the said William Archbishop of Canterbury, and his successors Archbishops of Canterbury, for ever.

"And whereas an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the second and third years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make

“ better provision for the assignment of ecclesiastical districts to churches or chapels augmented by the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and for other purposes,” contains the following recital and enactments, that is to say:

“ And whereas it is expedient to make provision for the more permanent security of the endowments and emoluments which shall have been, or may hereafter be, provided for the use or benefit of any church or chapel, whether built, acquired, or appropriated, or to be built, acquired, or appropriated, under the authority of the said recited Acts, or any of them, or under any other authority, or for the use or benefit of the incumbent of any such church or chapel, or of the spiritual person serving the same, be it, therefore, enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne to accept, take, and hold any such endowments and emoluments upon the trusts, and for the intents and purposes for which the same shall have been, or may hereafter be, given or granted by the person or persons providing the same, in like manner as any such endowments or emoluments may now be taken or held by any private trustees or trustee, and it shall and may be lawful for any trustees or trustee of any such endowments or emoluments to assign and transfer the same to the said Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, to be held and applied by them upon the same trusts, and for the same intents and purposes, as the same, previously to such assignment and transfer, were held by such trustees or trustee; provided always, that no such gift, grant, assignment, or transfer shall be made to the said Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne until, by an instrument in writing under their common seal, they shall have signified their consent to accept the same :

“ And be it further enacted, that, in all cases in which such consent of the said Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne shall have been so given, the money provided for such endowments shall be paid to the Treasurer, for the time being, of the said Governors; and the receipt or receipts of such Treasurer shall be effectual discharges or an effectual discharge for so much money as in such receipts or receipt shall be expressed to the person or persons paying the same; and, after obtaining such receipts or receipt, the person or persons paying such money shall be absolutely discharged from all liability touching such money, and from all trusts relating thereto :”

“ And whereas the said church or chapel of the Holy Trinity, Maidstone, was built under the provisions of one or more of the Acts referred to in the said last-recited enactments :

“ And whereas the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne have, by an instrument in writing under their common seal, bearing date the sixteenth day of May instant, signified their consent to accept the annual sum hereinafter recommended

to be paid at the times and upon the trust mentioned :

“ We, therefore, further recommend and propose, that, from and immediately after the next avoidance of the said rectory of Cliffe at Hoo, there shall be paid by the rector of the said rectory, for the time being, out of the revenues of the said rectory, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of January and the first day of July in every year, to the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, by their Treasurer for the time being, but in trust for the incumbent or minister, for the time being, of the said church or chapel of the Holy Trinity, Maidstone, the clear annual sum of one hundred pounds; and the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of January or the first day of July next following the day of such avoidance; and if a vacancy in such church or chapel shall happen on any other day than the first day of January or the first day of July, the then next half-yearly payment shall, by the said Governors or their Treasurer, be apportioned between and paid to the incumbent or minister making such vacancy, or his personal representatives, and the incumbent or minister succeeding to such church or chapel; and the said annual sum of one hundred pounds, and each and every instalment thereof, is and are hereby charged upon the said revenues, and upon all the glebe lands, tithes, rent charges, dues, profits, and emoluments whatsoever, which of right do, shall, or may belong to the said rectory, or to the rector thereof for the time being, as such rector.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the said rectory, or to the said perpetual curacy, or to the said chapelry district, in conformity with the provisions of the said Act, or any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council, now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Canterbury. Westminster, July 4, 1844.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentlemen Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do*

desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for granting to Her Majesty, until the fifth day of July one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, certain duties on sugar imported into the United Kingdom, for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four.

An Act to repeal the duty of Excise on vinegar, and to make the duties and drawbacks now payable on flint glass the same as on bottle glass.

An Act for authorizing Her Majesty to carry into immediate execution, by Orders in Council, any treaties for the suppression of the slave trade.

An Act to amend the laws now in force for preventing frauds and abuses in the marking of gold and silver wares in England.

An Act for abolishing the offences of forestalling, regrating, and engrossing, and for repealing certain statutes passed in restraint of trade.

An Act to extend an Act, of the ninth year of King George the Fourth, for the more effectual prevention of persons going armed by night for the destruction of game.

An Act to continue for five years an Act, of the second and third years of Her present Majesty, "for the better prevention and punishment of assaults in Ireland."

An Act to explain and amend an Act, of the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act for extending to Ireland the provisions not already in force there of an Act of the third and fourth years of the reign of the late King William the Fourth, intituled 'An Act for the limitation of actions and suits relating to real property, and for simplifying the remedies for trying the rights thereto,'" and to explain and amend the said Act.

An Act for making a railway from Leeds to Bradford, with a branch to the North Midland Railway.

An Act for making a railway from the Manchester and Bolton Railway, in the parish of Eccles, to the parish of Whalley, all in the county palatine of Lancaster, to be called the Manchester, Bury, and Rossendale Railway.

An Act for enabling the York and North Midland Railway Company to make a railway from York to Scarborough, with a branch to Pickering.

An Act to enable the Eastern Counties Railway Company to make a railway from the Northern and Eastern Railway, at Newport, by Cambridge, to Ely; and from thence, eastward, to Brandon, and westward to Peterborough.

An Act to make a branch railway from the London and South Western Railway to Salisbury.

An Act for making a railway from the town and port of Whitehaven to the town and port of Maryport, in the county of Cumberland.

An Act for making a railway from Chester to Holyhead.

An Act for making a railway from the city of Edinburgh to the town of Berwick-upon-Tweed, with a branch to the town of Haddington.

An Act to authorize an extension of the Edinburgh and Glasgow Railway, and to amend and enlarge the provisions of the Acts relating to such railway.

An Act for making a railway from the Shoreham branch of the London and Brighton Railway to Chichester.

An Act for making a railway from Exeter to Plymouth, to be called the South Devon Railway.

An Act to enable the South Eastern Railway Company to complete and maintain a branch railway and approach to the harbour of Folkestone, and to construct other works in connexion with the said harbour; and also to effect certain alterations and extensions of the works of the Maidstone branch of the said South Eastern Railway; and to amend the Acts relating to the said Company.

An Act for making a railway to connect the Edinburgh and Glasgow and Slamannan Railways.

An Act for making a junction railway from the Eastern Counties Railway, at Stratford, in the county of Essex, to the river Thames, with a branch railway therefrom; and for constructing a pier in the river Thames.

An Act to amend an Act for altering and amending several Acts for the improvement of the harbour of Swansea, in the county of Glamorgan.

An Act to amend the several Acts relating to the Preston and Wyre Railway, Harbour, and Dock Company.

An Act for better supplying with water the parishes of Saint Michael, the Holy Trinity, and Saint John the Baptist, in the city of Coventry, and county of Warwick.

An Act for uniting the Sheffield Gas Light Companies.

An Act for the warehousing of foreign goods for home consumption at the borough of Manchester, in the county of Lancaster.

An Act for the good government and police regulation of the borough of Manchester.

An Act to alter and amend an Act, of the fifty-third year of King George the Third, for the appointment of a stipendiary magistrate to act within the townships of Manchester and Salford.

An Act to enable the president, treasurers, deputy treasurers, benefactors, and subscribers of and to the Manchester Royal Infirmary Dispensary and Lunatic Hospital or Asylum to enlarge the said infirmary, and to purchase and hold land for the erection of a new lunatic hospital or asylum.

An Act for the improvement of the town of Manchester.

An Act for amending the provisions of an Act for forming a canal and other works within and near certain lands, called the West Croft, in the parish of Saint Mary, in the town and county of the town of Nottingham; and for making certain improvements within the said town.

MEMORANDUM.
