ER Majesty in Council was this day pleased to declare the Right Honourable William Lord Heytesbury, Lieutenant General and General Governor of that part of the United Kingdom called Ireland.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with "certain modifications, the fourth report of the "Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act "for regulating the cathedral churches of Wales;" duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in

Council a scheme, bearing date the eleventh day of June one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act" to earry into effect, with certain modifications, "the fourth report of the Commissioners of "Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act for regulating the "cathedral churches of Wales;" have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for providing a new temporary endowment for the archdeacoury of Merioneth, in the diocese of Bangor, and for augmenting the income of the archdeacoury of Derby, in the diocese of Lächfield.

"Whereas it was by the said first recited Act enacted, that any archdeaconry might, subject to the consent of the bishop, be endowed, amongst other modes, out of the common fund in the said Act mentioned, but not so as to raise the average annual income thereof to an amount exceeding two hundred pounds; provided, that no archdeacon should be entitled to hold any endowment or augmentation, or other emolument, as such archdeacon, under the provisions of the same Act, unless resident for the space of eight months in every year within the diocese in which his archdeaconry should be situate, or as to any arch-

deacon then existing within the diocese in which | say, to the archdeacon of Merioneth, for the time his archdeaconry was situate before the passing of the said Act; but subject to the same provisions as to licences for non-residence which are enacted, with respect to incumbents of benefices, by the Act relating to residence and pluralities in the same Act mentioned; and that upon any endowment of an archdeaconry being made, under the provisions of the same Act, all lands, tithes, and other hereditaments (except any right of patronage), belonging to such archdeaconry at the time of such endowment, might, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, and of any archdeacon in possession at the time of the passing of the same Act, and by the authority therein provided, be vested in us, for the purposes of such Act:

" And whereas by the secondly recited Act, the provisions of the said first recited Act were extended and made applicable to the diocese and cathedral church of Bangor, and to the dignities, offices, canonries, and prebends of the same church, and to the respective holders thereof:

"And whereas the said archdeaconry of Merioneth is a dignity and office founded in the said cathedral church of Bangor, and is endowed by the annexation thereto of the appropriate rectory of Llandudno, in the county of Carnarvon, In the said diocese of Bangor, and of a piece or parcel of land, in the city of Bangor, containing, by estimation, one acre and a half, and the remaining emoluments of the archdeaconry do not exceed the average annual sum of ten pounds; and the Venerable Richard Newcome was, at the time of the passing of the said first recited Act, and still is, archdeacon of the said archdeaconry:

" And whereas the said archdeaconry of Derby has no fixed endowment, and the average annual income thereof, arising from fees, does not exceed the sum of fifty pounds; and the Venerable Walter Augustus Shirley is now archdeacon of the same archdeaconry, and was appointed such archdeacon after the passing of the said first recited Act:

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Christopher Bishop of Bangor, and John Bishop of Lichfield, testified by their having respectively signed and sealed this scheme, that the said archdeaconries of Merioneth and Derby shall be severally and respectively endowed by augmentation, out of the common fund in the said first recited Act mentioned, in the manner hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, that there shall be paid by us, out of the said common fund, to the said Richard Newcome, Archdeacon of Merioneth, and Walter Augustus Shirley, Archdeacon of Derby, and their respective successors in the said archdeaconries, so long as they shall respectively hold the said archdeaconries, and shall duly reside in the dioceses in which the same are or shall respectively be situate,—but in the case of the archdeacon of Merioneth, not after the annexation of a canonry in the cathedral church of Bangor to his archdeaconry and the endowment of such canonry under the provisions of the said secondly recited Act,—the several annual sums following, that is to

being, the sum of one hundred and ninety pounds; and to the archdeacon of Derby, for the time being, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds, on the first day of January in every year; and every such whole yearly payment, to each of such archdeacons, shall be made only on production to us of a certificate, under the hand of the bishop, for the time being, of the diocese in which his archdeaconry is situate, that such archdeacon has duly resided during the preceeding year, and a proportionate part of the first of such yearly payments, calculated from the day on which any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be duly gazetted, shall be made on the first day of January next ensuing; and that whenever a vacancy in either of the said archdeaconries shall happen on any other day than the first day of January the then next yearly payment shall be duly apportioned and paid between and to the archdeacon making the vacancy or his representatives, and the archdeacon succeeding to such archdeaconry so becoming vacant.

" And we further recommend and propose, with the consent of the said Richard Newcome, testified by his having also signed and sealed this scheme, that the said rectory of Llandudno, together with all rights, privileges, members, and appurtenances thereunto belonging (except any right of patronage), and also the before-mentioned piece or parcel of land in the city of Bangor, and all other lands, tithes, tenements, and hereditaments (if any) belonging to and forming part of the endowment of the said archdeaconry of Merioneth, shall be disannexed therefrom, and shall become and be absolutely vested in us, for the purposes of the said recited Acts.

" And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measure touching the matters herein contained, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.'

And whereas notice of the said seheme has been duly given to the said Archdeacon of Derby, and no objection has been made thereto.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the dioceses of Bangor and Lichfield respectively.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with " certain modifications, the fourth report of the "Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled " An " Act to explain and amend two several Acts " relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England;" duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fourteenth day of May one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to carry into effect, with certain modi-" fications, the fourth report of the Commissioners " of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to explain and amend "two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England;" have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, respecting the mode of appointing honorary canons in certain cathedral churches, and the regulations to which

they shall be subject. Whereas it was by the first-recited Act enacted, that honorary canonries should be thereby founded in every cathedral church in England in which there were not already founded any nonresidentiary prebends, dignities, or offices; and that the holders of such canonries should be styled honorary canons, and should be entitled to stalls, and to take rank in the cathedral church next after the canons, and should be subject to such regulations respecting the mode of their appointment, and otherwise, as should be determined on by the authority thereinafter provided, with the consent of the chapters of the said cathedral churches respectively; and that the number of such honorary canonries thereby founded in each cathedral church should be twenty-four; and it should be lawful for the archbishops and bishops, respectively, if they should think fit, from time to time, to appoint spiritual persons to such honorary canonries; provided that not more than eight of such honorary canons should be appointed in any diocese within the year next after the passing of the said Act, nor more than two in any subsequent year, except in the case of the vacancy of any honorary canonry by death, resignation, or otherwise; and it was

T the Court at Buckingham-Palace, the provided, that no emolument whatever, nor any place in the chapter of any cathedral church, should be taken or held by any honorary canon in virtue of his appointment as such canon; and it was by the secondly-recited Act declared and enacted, that such honorary canonries were and should be founded forthwith in the cathedral churches of Canterbury, Bristol, Carlisle, Chester, Durham, Ely, Gloucester, Norwich, Oxford, Peterborough, Ripon, Rochester, Winchester, and Worcester; and that the provisions of the first herein-before recited Act should apply to the honorary canonries so founded:

" And whereas the chapters of the several cathedral churches hereinafter enumerated have respectively signified to us their consent to the following regulations, in accordance with the provisions of the said first-recited Act; we, therefore, humbly recommend and propose,

"1. That it shall be lawful for each of the Bishops of Carlisle, Chester, Durham, Ely, Gloucester and Bristol, Norwich, Peterborough, Ripon, Rochester, Winchester, and Worcester, for the time being, forthwith, by instrument under his hand and episcopal seal, to collate any spiritual person, not holding any canonry, honorary canonry, or prebend in any cathedral or collegiate church, to any honorary canonry founded by the said recited Acts, or either of them, in the cathedral churches of Carlisle, Chester, Durham, Ely, Gloucester, Bristol, Norwich, Peterborough, Ripon, Rochester, Winchester, and Worcester, respectively; provided that not more than two such honorary canons shall be appointed in any diocese before the eleventh day of August next, nor more than two in any future year, calculated from that day, except in the case of the vacancy of any such honorary canonry by death, resignation, or otherwise, and that the total number of such honorary canons in any such church shall never exceed twenty-four:

- "2. That every honorary canon when so collated shall be admitted into the cathedral with the same formalities, so far as may be found practicable, as have been heretofore by the practice of such church observed in the admission of a canon or prebendary thereof; and shall, in all processions of the dean and chapter from or to the cathedral church or elsewhere, walk in the order of his seniority determined by the date of his collation, the senior honorary canon taking rank next to the iunior canon:
- " 3. That no fee whatever shall be paid by any such honorary canon, except a fee of ten shillings to the bishop's secretary, upon his collation, and a like fee to the chapter clerk, upon his first admission to the cathedral:
- " 4. That every such honorary canon shall, when present in the cathedral church, wear the same habit as a canon; and that when neither the dean, sub-dean, nor any canon shall be present during the performance of divine service, the senior honorary canon who shall be present shall perform the same duty as would be performed by the canon in residence, if present:

"5. That in every eathedral church in which any plan for the preaching of the honorary canons therein shall be agreed upon by the dean and chapter, with the consent of their visitor; every honorary canon appointed in the same church shall conform to such plan; provided that he shall not be required so to preach more than once in any year."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the several dioceses of Carlisle, Chester, Durham, Ely, Gloucester and Bristol, Norwich, Peterborough, Ripon, Rochester, Winchester, and Worcester.
