PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words following, that is to say :

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes in the parish of Saint George, Birmingham, in the county of Warwick, and in the diocese of Worcester.

" Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or

chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district, out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the meantime, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council, that the minister of such district, when duly licenced according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereafter provided :

“ And whereas the said parish of Saint George, Birmingham, is of great extent, and contains a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of such parish hereinafter mentioned and described, such part not at present containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth :

“ Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Bishop of Worcester, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Saint George, Birmingham, described in the schedule hereunto annexed, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed,—shall be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be

named, “ The District of Saint Stephen, Birmingham.”

“ And we further recommend and propose, that, in order that the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted may be permanently endowed, according to the provisions of the said Act, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to such minister, when duly licenced according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licenced by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

“ And whereas it is by the said Act further enacted, that it shall be lawful, by the authority aforesaid, at any time to assign the right of

patronage of any such district or new parish as aforesaid, and the nomination of the minister or perpetual curate thereof respectively, either in perpetuity, or for one or more nomination or nominations, to any ecclesiastical corporation, aggregate or sole, or to either of the Universities of Oxford, Cambridge, or Durham, or to any college therein respectively, or to any person or persons, or the nominee or nominees of such person or persons or body respectively, upon condition of such corporation, university, college, person or persons contributing to the permanent endowment of such minister or perpetual curate, or towards providing a church or chapel for the use of the inhabitants of such district or new parish, in such proportion and in such manner as shall be approved by the like authority:

“ And whereas certain persons have caused to be erected, by the aid of certain sums of money contributed by them, a church or chapel within the said district, and have offered the same for approval by us, and for consecration, as the church or chapel of the said district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and we have satisfied ourselves that such church or chapel is fit to be so approved and consecrated :

“ And whereas certain of the principal contributors towards the said church or chapel have, by an instrument in writing under their hands, nominated to us the said Henry Bishop of Worcester, the Reverend John Garbett, Clerk, Rector of the said parish of Saint George, Birmingham, and John Aston, James Turner, and William Sharpe, all of Birmingham aforesaid, Esquires, as the patrons of the said district for the first turn :

“ We, therefore, further recommend and propose, that the right of patronage of the said district, and the nomination of the minister thereof, shall, for the first such nomination only, be assigned to and vested in the said Henry Bishop of Worcester, John Garbett, John Aston, James Turner, and William Sharpe.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the said parish, or to the said district or new parish, or either of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

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“ SCHEDULE.

“ The District of SAINT STEPHEN, BIRMINGHAM, being—

“ All that part of the parish of Saint George, Birmingham, in the county of Warwick, and in the diocese of Worcester, bounded by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the northern side of the Fazeley-canal where such canal crosses the boundary between the parish of Aston, in the said county and diocese, and the said parish of Saint George, Birmingham, and thence extending towards the west, along the same side of the said canal, as far as the centre of Barker-bridge, and thence towards the north west, along the middle of Loveday-street, as far as the middle of Summer-lane, and thence, northward, along the middle of such lane, as far as the middle of New John-street, and thence westward, along the middle of such last-mentioned street, as far as the middle of Eldon-street, and thence northward, along the middle of such last-mentioned street, as far as the middle of Bridge-street, and thence westward, along the middle of such last-mentioned street, as far as the middle of a certain unfinished street intended to be a continuation, northward, of Great Russell-street, and thence northward, along the middle of such unfinished street, as far as the boundary between the said parishes of Aston and Saint George, Birmingham, and thence extending towards the south east, along the said boundary as far as the most easterly point of the said parish of Saint George, Birmingham, and thence southward, along the said boundary line, as far as the point on the Fazeley-canal where the said imaginary line commenced.”

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbent and to the patrons of the church of the parish out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, and such incumbent and patrons have consented to the said scheme :

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law imme-

diately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Worcester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act for regulating the cathedral churches of Wales;" duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the eleventh day of June one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act for regulating the cathedral churches of Wales;" have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for providing a new temporary endowment for the archdeaconry of Merioneth, in the diocese of Bangor, and for augmenting the income of the archdeaconry of Derby, in the diocese of Lichfield.

"Whereas it was by the said first recited Act enacted, that any archdeaconry might, subject to the consent of the bishop, be endowed, amongst other modes, out of the common fund in the said Act mentioned, but not so as to raise the average annual income thereof to an amount exceeding two hundred pounds; provided, that no archdeacon should be entitled to hold any endowment or augmentation, or other emolument, as such archdeacon, under the provisions of the same Act, unless resident for the space of eight months in every year within the diocese in which his archdeaconry should be situate, or as to any archdeacon then existing within the diocese in which his archdeaconry was situate before the passing of the said Act; but subject to the same provisions as

to licences for non-residence which are enacted, with respect to incumbents of benefices, by the Act relating to residence and pluralities in the same Act mentioned; and that upon any endowment of an archdeaconry being made, under the provisions of the same Act, all lands, tithes, and other hereditaments (except any right of patronage), belonging to such archdeaconry at the time of such endowment, might, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, and of any archdeacon in possession at the time of the passing of the same Act, and by the authority therein provided, be vested in us, for the purposes of such Act:

"And whereas by the secondly recited Act, the provisions of the said first recited Act were extended and made applicable to the diocese and cathedral church of Bangor, and to the dignities, offices, canonries, and prebends of the same church, and to the respective holders thereof:

"And whereas the said archdeaconry of Merioneth is a dignity and office founded in the said cathedral church of Bangor, and is endowed by the annexation thereto of the appropriate rectory of Llandudno, in the county of Carnarvon, in the said diocese of Bangor, and of a piece or parcel of land, in the city of Bangor, containing, by estimation, one acre and a half, and the remaining emoluments of the archdeaconry do not exceed the average annual sum of ten pounds; and the Venerable Richard Newcome was, at the time of the passing of the said first recited Act, and still is, archdeacon of the said archdeaconry:

"And whereas the said archdeaconry of Derby has no fixed endowment, and the average annual income thereof, arising from fees, does not exceed the sum of fifty pounds; and the Venerable Walter Augustus Shirley is now archdeacon of the same archdeaconry, and was appointed such archdeacon after the passing of the said first recited Act:

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Christopher Bishop of Bangor, and John Bishop of Lichfield, testified by their having respectively signed and sealed this scheme, that the said archdeaconries of Merioneth and Derby shall be severally and respectively endowed by augmentation, out of the common fund in the said first recited Act mentioned, in the manner hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, that there shall be paid by us, out of the said common fund, to the said Richard Newcome, Archdeacon of Merioneth, and Walter Augustus Shirley, Archdeacon of Derby, and their respective successors in the said archdeaconries, so long as they shall respectively hold the said archdeaconries, and shall duly reside in the dioceses in which the same are or shall respectively be situate,—but in the case of the archdeacon of Merioneth, not after the annexation of a canonry in the cathedral church of Bangor to his archdeaconry and the endowment of such canonry under the provisions of the said secondly recited Act,—the several annual sums following, that is to say, to the archdeacon of Merioneth, for the time

being, the sum of one hundred and ninety pounds; and to the archdeacon of Derby, for the time being, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds, on the first day of January in every year; and every such whole yearly payment, to each of such archdeacons, shall be made only on production to us of a certificate, under the hand of the bishop, for the time being, of the diocese in which his archdeaconry is situate, that such archdeacon has duly resided during the preceeding year, and a proportionate part of the first of such yearly payments, calculated from the day on which any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be duly gazetted, shall be made on the first day of January next ensuing; and that whenever a vacancy in either of the said archdeaconries shall happen on any other day than the first day of January the then next yearly payment shall be duly apportioned and paid between and to the archdeacon making the vacancy or his representatives, and the archdeacon succeeding to such archdeaconry so becoming vacant.

“ And we further recommend and propose, with the consent of the said Richard Newcome, testified by his having also signed and sealed this scheme, that the said rectory of Llandudno, together with all rights, privileges, members, and appurtenances thereunto belonging (except any right of patronage), and also the before-mentioned piece or parcel of land in the city of Bangor, and all other lands, tithes, tenements, and hereditaments (if any) belonging to and forming part of the endowment of the said archdeaconry of Merioneth, shall be disannexed therefrom, and shall become and be absolutely vested in us, for the purposes of the said recited Acts.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measure touching the matters herein contained, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas notice of the said scheme has been duly given to the said Archdeacon of Derby, and no objection has been made thereto.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the dioceses of Bangor and Lichfield respectively.
