The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, bassed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with "certain modifications, the fourth report of the "Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and "Revenues;" duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the eighth day of July one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of " Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" have brepared, and now humbly lay before your Ma-

T the Court at Buckingham-Pulace, the jesty in Council, the following scheme, for making better provision for the cure of souls in the district parish of Croxdale, in the county and diocese of Durham.

> " Whereas, by virtue of the said recited Act, we are empowered, out of the lands, tithes, and hereditaments, thereby vested and to be vested in us, or by an actual conveyance thereof, if it shall be deemed more expedient to make additional provision for the cure of souls, in parishes in which such assistance is most required; provided always, that in making any such additional provision out of any tithes, or any lands, or other hereditaments, allotted or assigned in lieu of tithes so vested, or to be vested, in us, or out of the rents and profits thereof, due consideration shall be had of the wants and circumstances of the places in which such tithes arise, or have arisen:

> " And whereas, by virtue of the said recited Act, and for the purposes thereof, the tithes hereinafter more particularly set forth and described, or the rent charge payable in lieu thereof, under the Acts of Parliament for the commutation of tithes, have become and now are vested in or payable

"And whereas the township of Hett, lately in the parish of Merrington, in the county and diocese of Durham aforesaid, has been detached therefrom, and added to the adjoining chapelry of Croxdale, and therewith now forms a separate consolidated district parish, under the name of the Parish or Parochial Chapelry of Croxdale, having been so constituted by an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the tenth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-three:

" And whereas, after due consideration of the wants and circumstances of the parish aforesaid, we have deemed it expedient to make additional provision for the cure of souls therein, by conveying and assigning to the incumbent of the parish or parochial chapelry aforesaid the tithes or rent charge hereinafter described, and the Dean and Chapter of Durham have agreed, in pursuance of the powers possessed by them in that behalf, and (with our consent, as required by the said first recited Act) by a proper legal instrument already prepared, and intended to bear date the day on which any Order of your Majesty in Council for ratifying this scheme shall be gazetted, to grant the perpetual annual rent, hereinafter mentioned to be payable to them, out of such tithes or rent charge, to the incumbent of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Croxdale, out of the tithes of which, or rent charge in lieu thereof, such perpetual annual rents are now respectively payable:

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that all the tithes of corn and grain growing, renewing, and arising out of and from all the titheable lands and places within the said township of Hett, now vested in us, or the rent charge for which such tithes shall hereafter be duly commuted, subject to the deductions to be legally made thereout on account of rates, but including and together with the perpetual annual rent or sum of two pounds six shillings and eight pence now issuing and payable thereout to the said Dean and Chapter of Durham, and so as aforesaid intended to be granted by them, shall forthwith be transferred to, and absolutely vested in, the incumbent of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Croxdale, and his successors for ever.

"And whereas the provision hereby recommended to be made for the said parish or parochial

chapelry was proposed by the said Dean and Chapter, and agreed to by us previously to the date of the constituting thereof as aforesad; we, therefore, further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us to the incumbent thereof a sum of money, equal in amount to such portion of the rent charge aforesaid, as may have accrued to us after deducting all out-goings in respect thereof, from the day of the date of the said Order of your Majesty in Council to the day of the date of this scheme.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters herein contained, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Act."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Durham.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentlemen Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to regulate the issue of bank notes, and for giving to the Governor and Company of the Bank of England certain privileges for a limited period. An Act to exempt from the payment of property tax the dividends on certain annuities of three pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payable for the quarter of the year ending the tenth day of October one thousand eight hundred and forty-four.

An Act for the regulation of suits relating to meeting houses and other property held for religious purposes by persons dissenting from the United Church of England and Ireland.

An Act to amend the laws relating to the customs in the Isle of Man.

An Act to secure the terms on which grants are made by Her Majesty out of the parliamentary grant for the education of the poor; and to explain the Act of the fifth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, for the conveyance of sites for schools.

An Act for facilitating the collection of county rates, and for relieving high constables from attendance at quarter sessions in certain cases, and from certain other duties.

An Act to suspend, until the thirty-first day of August one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, the making of lists and the ballots and enrolments for the militia of the United Kingdom.

An Act to continue, until the first day of October one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, and to the end of the then session of Parliament, the exemption of inhabitants of parishes, townships, and villages from liability to be rated as such, in respect of stock in trade or other property to the relief of the poor.

An Act to continue, until the first day of October one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, and to the end of the then session of Parliament, two Acts relating to the removal of poor persons born in Scotland and Ireland, and chargeable to parishes in England.

An Act to continue, until the first day of August one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, and to the end of the then session of Parliament, certain turnpike Acts.

An Act to facilitate the disjoining or dividing of extensive or populous parishes, and the erecting of new parishes, in that part of the United Kingdom called Scotland.

An Act to amend and continue, until the first day of September one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, and to the end of the then next session of Parliament, the law with respect to prisons and prison discipline in Scotland.

An Act to amend an Act of the last session, to consolidate and amend the laws for the regulation of charitable loan societies in Ireland.

An Act to continue, until the thirty-first day of July one thousand eight hundred and forty-five and to the end of the then session of Parliament, certain Acts for regulating turnpike roads in Ireland.

An Act to alter, explain, revive, and continue the powers and provisions of the Acts relating to the Edinburgh, Leith, and Newhaven Railway, and to make two branch railways therefrom.

An Act for making a railway from the Manchester and Leeds Railway to the towns of Ashton-under-Lyne and Stalybridge.

An Act to enable the Sheffield, Ashton-under-Lyne, and Manchester Railway Company to make a branch railway to Ashton-under-Lyne and Staly-bridge, and to alter and enlarge the powers of the said Company.

An Act to amend the Acts relating to the Taffvale Railway, to authorize the alteration of certain works thereby authorized, and the formation of additional works, and to enlarge the powers of the Company.

An Act for making a railway from Colchester to Ipswich.

An Act to amend the Acts relating to the London and South Western Railway, and to authorize an extension of the said railway and other works at or near the Nine Elms station.

An Act to extend the line of the Garnkirk and Glasgow Railway, to enable the Company to raise a further sum of money, and to alter and amend the Acts relating to the said railway.

An Act for making a railway from Mellorn, in the parish of Minster, to Black Rock, in the parish of Saint Michael, in Saint Minver Lowlands, in the county of Cornwalk

An Act for enabling the trustees of the Liverpool Docks to construct additional wet docks and other works, and to raise a further sum of money, and for amending and extending the Acts relating to the docks and harbour of Liverpool.

An Act for authorizing the Newport Dock Company to raise further monies, and to make sale of the docks and works, and for amending certain Acts relating to the said dock.

An Act for constructing tidal basins, a dock, and other works at Birkenhead, in the county of Chester, and for other purposes.

An Act for paving, lighting, draining, cleansing, and otherwise improving the town of Southampton, and for removing and preventing nuisances and annoyances therein.

An Act for enabling the mayor, aldermen, and burgesses of the city of Coventry to make certain improvements, to provide a residence for the judges during the assizes in the said city, and to establish a cemetery for the dead near the said city.

An Act for uniting the York Gas Light Company and the York Union Gas Light Company, and for more effectually lighting with the gas the city of York and the suburbs and vicinity thereof, in the county of York.

An Act for making a landing place at or near Hythe, in the parish of Fawley, and extra parochial places adjoining thereto, in the county of Southampton.

An Act for repairing, maintaining, and improving the road from Flint-lane to Holmfrith, and thence to the Huddersfield and Woodhead turnpike road, and for making and maintaining a new line of road from the said road, at a place called Bents, to or near Dunford-bridge, all in the west riding of the county of York.

An Act for more effectually repairing the road from Market Harborough, in the county of Leicester, to the city of Coventry.

HE following is a copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, assigning a chapelry district to Saint Paul's Church, at Forebridge, in the parish of Castle Church, in the county of Stafford, under the 16th section of the 59th Geo. 3, cap. 134:

At the Court at Buckingham-Palace, the 17th of April 1844, present, the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "that in every case in which the Commissioners appointed for carrying into execution the purposes of the said Act shall be of opinion that it will be expedient to divide any parish into two or more distinct and separate parishes, for all ecclesiastical purposes whatever, it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese in which such parish is locally situated, signified under his hand and seal, to apply to the patron or patrons of the church of such parish for his consent to make such division, and for such patron or patrons to signify his or their consent thereto under his hand and seal; and the said Commissioners shall, upon the consent of the said patron or patrons so signified, represent the whole matter to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which it is proposed, with such consent as aforesaid, to divide such parish, together with the relative and respective proportions of glebe land, tithes, moduses, or other endowments which will by such division arise and accrue, and remain and be, within each of such respective divisions, and also the relative proportions of the estimated amount of the value or produce of fees, oblations, offerings, or other ecclesiastical dues or profits which may arise and accrue within each of such respective divisions; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division; provided always, that no such division of any parish into distinct parishes shall completely take effect until after the death, resignation, or other avoidance of the existing incumbent of the parish to be divided;" and it is by the twenty-first section of the said Act further enacted, "that in any case in which the said Commissioners shall be of opinion that it is not expedient to divide any populous parish, or extra parochial place, into such complete, separate, and distinct parishes as aforesaid, but that it is expedient to divide the same into such ecclesiastical districts as they, with the consent of the bishop, signified under his hand and seal, may deem necessary for the purpose of affording accommodation for the attending divine service, according to the rites of the United Church of England and Ireland, to persons residing therein, in the churches and parochial chapels already built, or in additional churches or chapels to be built therein, and as may appear to such Commissioners to be convenient for the enabling the spiritual person or persons who may serve such churches or chapels to perform all ecclesiastical duties within the districts attached to such respective churches and chapels, and for the due ecclesiastical superintendence of such district, and the preservation and improvement of the religious and moral habits

of the persons residing therein, the said Commissioners shall represent such opinion to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which such districts are proposed to be described; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the

purpose of effecting such division:"

And whereas by an Act, passed in the fiftyninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, in the same manner and with the like consents as are required in case of division into ecclesiastical districts under the said recited Act, or this Act, to assign a particular district to any chapel of ease or parochial chapel already existing, or to any chapel built, or which may hereafter be built or acquired under the powers of the said Act, or this Act; and such district shall be under the immediate care of the curate appointed to serve such chapel, but subject, nevertheless, to the superintendence and controul of the incumbent of the parish church; and all such curates shall be nominated by the incumbent of the parish to the bishop for his licence, except where the right of nomination shall already be legally vested in any other person or persons, and in every such case by the person or persons possessing such right of nomination, subject to all the laws in force relating to stipendiary curates, except as to the assigning of salaries to such curates; provided always, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, to determine whether any and what part or proportion of the fees or dues for marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials shall be assigned to any such curate, and whether banns of marriage shall be published, and marriages or baptisms, churchings or burials, shall be solemnized or performed in any such chapel or not; and in any case in which marriages shall be allowed in any such chapel, the Commissioners shall cause the bounda. ries of the district assigned to such chapel to be enrolled in the High Court of Chancery, and in the office of the Registry of the diocese, any thing in the said recited Act to the contrary notwithstanding; and no such chapelry shall become a benefice by reason of any augmentation of the maintenance of the curate, by any grant or bounty under the provision of any Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, for augmenting small livings, any thing in such Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, to the contrary notwithstanding:"

And whereas by another Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and by another Act, made and passed in the first and second years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act to

amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled 'An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and also by another Act, made and passed in the second and third years of His said late Majesty, intituled "An Act to render more effectual an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled 'An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" further provisions are made for carrying such divisions into effect:
